Subject: REQUEST FOR AUTHORITY TO ENTER INTO AND SIGN THE MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT WITH LOCAL CLIMATE CHANGE ADAPTATION FOR DEVELOPMENT, INC. (LCCAD) AND UNIVERSITY OF THE PHILIPPINES (UP) (PCR No. 250-2023 dated March 13, 2023).

During the Regular Session of the 5th Sangguniang Panlungsod of the City of Bacoor, Cavite held last March 13, 2023 at 10:30 am. The Presiding Officer Acting Vice Mayor Catherine sarino-Evaristo reffered the subject matter to Hon. Levy M. Tela, Chairman on Environment and Natural Resources.

#### FINDINGS:

- The Local Government of Bacoor aspires to become a model city for climate and disaster resilience not only in CALABARZON, but the entire nation as well;



# MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

# KNOWN ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

This MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT is made and entered into by and between:

The CITY GOVERNMENT OF BACOOR, a local government unit with office address at Bacoor City Hail, Molino Boulevard, Bacoor City, Philippines, represented by its Mayor, STRIKE B. REVILLA, hereinafter referred to as "Bacoor City";

-and-

The LOCAL CLIMATE CHANGE ADAPTATION FOR DEVELOPMENT, INC (LCCAD), a non-stock-non-profit, non-governmental organization (NGO) and leading service provider to the volnerable local government units across the country as well as national and international agencies, with office address at 26th Floor, The Podium West, ADB Avenue, Mandaluyong City, Metro Manila, Philippines, represented by its Executive Director, MANUEL C. RANGASA, hereinafter referred to as "LCCAD".)

-and-

The UNIVERSITY OF THE PHILIPPINES, the national university created by virtue of Act No. 1870, as amended and strengthened by Republic Act 9500, through the UP Resilience Institute, represented herein by its Executive Director, ALFREDO MAHAR FRANCISCO A, LAGMAY hereinafter referred to as "UP".

### WITNESSETH THAT

WHEREAS, the Local Government of Bacoor envisions a City functioning as a "Premier Business Hub" complying with "global standards" and "driven by competitive and productive Bacooreños living in climate and disaster resilient communities;

WHEREAS, the Local Government of Baccoor aspires to become a model city for climate and disaster resilience not only in CALABARZON, but the entire nation as well;

WHEREAS, the LOCAL CLIMATE CHANGE ADAPTATION FOR DEVELOPMENT, INC. (LCCAD) is a recognized leading service provider of the Local Government

Academy of the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG), Office of the President - Climate Change Commission (CCC), Office of Civil Defense (OCD) Central Office, Department of Education (DepEd). Philippine Information Agency (PIA). UNESCO Regional Headquarters Bangkok, Thailand. United Nations, University of the Philippines and it's UP Resilience Institute and NOAH Center, League of Municipalities of the Philippines (LMP), House of Representatives, Senate of the Philippines, League of Cities of the Philippines (LCP), League of Provinces of the Philippines (LPP) and Philippine Councilors' League (PCL) for its capacity building program for local government units (LGUs) intended to promote the aims of decentralization and local autonomy, in general, and the facilitation and provision of the training program for LGUs to fulfill their mandate, per Section 14 of Republic Act No. 9729, known as the Climate Change Act of 2009 and the Republic Act No. 10121, known as the Philippine Disaster Reduction and Management Act of 2010. as the frontline agency in the formulation, planning and implementation of disaster risk reduction and climate change adaptation action plans, programs and budgets as a strategy in sustainable development and poverty reduction in their areas, in particular,

WHEREAS, LCCAD is a mobile training institution in the Philippines and Southeast Asia that provides theoretical moorings to LGUs for implementing their mandate through climate adaptive practices anchored on mainstreaming climate change adaptation and mitigation, disaster risk and vulnerability reduction into the Local Climate Change Action Plans (LCCAPs), as well as integration into already mandated local plans such as comprehensive Land Use Plan (CLUP), the Comprehensive Development Plan (CDP) and Contingency Plans, and other local planning processes mandated by law and established regulation;

WHEREAS, the Local Climate Change Action Plans (LCCAP), while informing local economic development planning for resilience, will also provide valuable inputs to provincial, regional and national plans, also serve to harmonize such priorities of vulnerable LGUs with those of the National Strategic Framework on Climate Change (NSFCC), the National Climate Action Plan (NCCAP), the National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Plan (NDRRMP), the SENDAL Framework for DRR 2030, Agenda 2030 for Sustainable Development Goals (SOGs) and the Paris Agreement;

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 11265, or the Energy Efficiency and Conservation Act of 2019, has identified the following goals under Section 2 (Declaration of Policy): 1. Institutionalize energy efficiency and conservation as a national way of life geared towards the efficient and judicious utilization of energy by formulating, developing, and implementing energy efficiency and conservation plans and programs to secure sufficiency and stability of energy supply in the country to cushion the impact of high prices of imported fuels to local markets and protect the environment in support of the economic and social development goals of the country; 2. Promote and encourage the development and utilization of efficient renewable energy

technologies and systems to ensure optimal use and sustainability of the country's energy resources; 3. Reinforce related laws and other statutory provisions for a comprehensive approach to energy efficiency, conservation, sufficiency, and sustainability in the country; and, 4. Ensure a market-driven approach to energy efficiency, conservation, sufficiency, and sustainability in the country;

**WHEREAS**, the Climate Change Act and the Paris Agreement and other related laws reinforce the above objectives within the context of implementing the NCCAP 8th strategic priority on sustainable energy and the 7th Sustainable Development Goal of affordable and clean energy.

NOW THEREFORE, the Parties hereby agree to undertake the following.

# 1,0 OBLIGATION OF PARTIES

- 1.1 The City of Bacoor shall undertake the following:
  - Provide guidelines, standards, safeguards, and recommendations for enhanced content and conduct of training;
  - Encourage LGUs to join the LCCAP/LECCP Formulation training program and capacity building for local adaptation and mitigation planning and implementation of climate change initiatives in vulnerable and marginalized communities;
  - Promote a policy for subsidized training of all vulnerable barangays;
  - Maintain a core monitoring and evaluation team for the LGU training-workshop and coaching programs;
  - Publish a monitoring and evaluation manual for sharing with LGU clientele;
  - Share knowledge products and technologies for CCAM/DRR/EEC management training and climate finance mobilization with LCCAD and its clients;
  - Engage other national government agencies and related entities in the conduct of CCAM/DRR/EEC management training and climate finance mobilization pursuant to its coordinating mandate; and,
  - Establish a training institution on climate-disaster risk reduction planning and management competencies and methodologies within an integrated conceptual framework for accelerated implementation of the Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction 2030, Sustainable Development Goals Agenda 2030 with the Climate Change Convention in the Asia-Pacific region.

# 1.2 The LCCAD shall undertake the following:

- As capacity development service provider for CCC, enhance the LCCAP/LECCP Formutation training-workshop process and its products on a continuing basis, and in accordance with CCC plans, programs, and recommendations:
- Facilitate and provide assistance to CCC for capacity building in local adaptation and mitigation planning, implementation of climate change initiatives in vulnerable and marginalized communities and areas;
- Provide assistance to CCC and related NGAs and entities in the conduct of sessions for familiarization, with the process of LCCAP/LECCP Formulation and integration into the Comprehensive Development, and the Comprehensive Land Use Planning processes;
- Provide inputs for the development of monitoring and evaluation guidelines, program and manual;
- Recommend appropriate climate and disaster database development and modelling technology to support the LCCAP/LECCP and CCC plans and programs;
- Share LCCAD training facilities, resources and knowledge products that may be requested by CCC, subject to availability and purpose;
- Promote CCC plans, programs, and activities for climate change adaptation and mitigation among LGU clients and development partners;
- Provide a listing of LGUs who completed the LCCAP training course during the previous year, with the status of LCCAP formulation; and,
- Assist CCC in the establishment of an institute for training in climate methodologies and the development of an integrated conceptual framework for accelerated implementation of the Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction 2030, Sustainable Development Goals Agenda 2030 with the Climate Change Convention in the Asia-Pacific region, including the establishment of regional knowledge and capacity building hubs in the Philippines.

## 2.0 TERMS OF COLLABORATION

2.1 The Parties intend to continue the collaboration envisaged in this MOA from the date of signing until March 8, 2028. Extension of the period is subject to mutual written agreement of the parties to be

- initiated at least thirty (30) days prior to the end of the initial term of this MOA:
- 2.2 Either Party may pre-terminate this agreement in writing with at least thirty (30) days' prior notice to the other Party;
- 2.3 The termination or non-extension of this MOA shall not affect the obligations to be undertaken by the Parties to any contractual obligation previously executed by the Parties or Party pursuant to this MOA; and,
- 2.4 Any amendment to this Agreement is subject to the mutual written agreement of the Parties.

## 3.0 FINANCIAL TERMS

This MOA does not obligate any of the Parties to make any financial commitment towards its implementation.

## 4.0 LEGAL PROVISION

All initiatives and actions that the Parties shall undertake pursuant to this MOA shall be subject to Philippine laws and regulations. This MOA shall take effect upon signing by the Parties.
