#### CITY ORDINANCE NO. 242-2022, SERIES OF 2022


Under Section 2.2 of Ordinance No. 242-2022, Series of 2022, the Corporate Social Responsibility is defined as any activity conducted within the City of Bacoor by any business establishment, professional or institution that aims to improve society, the environment, the lives of the poor, the sick, the victims of injustice or the underprivileged.

#### INTEGRATION OF PUBLIC POLICIES ON CORPORATE SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY:

"The Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) involves the alignment of government regulations, incentives, and initiatives with the objectives of encouraging businesses to operate in a socially responsible and sustainable manner. This integration is essential for creating conducive environment where businesses are motivated to voluntarily contribute to societal and environmental well-being while also achieving their economic goals."

The following are some of the key aspects of integrating public policies on CSR:

- Government legislation and regulation that require businesses to adhere to certain CSR standards or disclose their CSR activities. These regulations may pertain to environmental practices, labor rights, ethical sourcing, or community engagement. Companies failing to comply may face legal consequences or reputational damage
- Government can provide tax incentives to businesses that engage in CSR activities which include investments in renewable energy, sustainable practices, or contributions to charitable organizations. Tax incentives encourage businesses to allocate resources to CSR initiative



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#### PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE CITY ORDINANCE:

Section 2. Definition of Terms. XXX

- 2.1. Business Establishment any natural or juridical person not engaged in the practice of profession that is duly registered as a business with the Business Permits and Licensing Department (BPLD) x x x
- 2.2. Corporate Social Responsibility or Citizen's Social Responsibility (CSR) Activities
   x x x that aims to to improve society, the environment, the lives of the poor, the sick, the victims of injustice, or the underprivileged, provided, however, the proposed CSR activities should first be coordinated with the Office of the Social Welfare and Development (CSWD) or the BPLD.

CSR activities do not include donations, whether they are in cash or kind.

Section 3. Grant of Incentives. All business establishment, professionals, and institutions that will conduct CSR activities in the City of Bacoor shall be in coordination with the CSWD or the BPLD prior to the holding of such activities shall be entitled to the following incentives:

Section 4. Conditions for the Grant of Incentives - x x x

- The proposed CSR activity was duly coordinated with the CSWD or the BPLD before said activity/activities was/were conducted;
- If employs Senior Citizens, Persons with Disability (PWD), and former Persons Deprived of Liberty (PLs);
- 4.5. It applied for the grant of incentive in the manner to be provided in the implementing rules and regulations of this Ordinance.
- Section 6. Implementing Rules and Regulations. The BPLD, LEDIPO, PESO, CSWD, CTO, the Office City Legal Services and other concerned city department and units under the supervision of the City Administrator, shall draft the implementing rules and regulations of this Ordinance and shall submit it to the City Mayor within thirty (30) days from its effectivity.



Rogelio Nolasco: "Magandang Hapon po sa ating lahat, a committee hearing regarding "PCO-2024-166 - FROM THE OFFICE OF THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR: AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CITY ORDINANCE 242-2022 SERIES OF 2022, OR THE "CORPORATE SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY INCENTIVE ORDINANCE OF BACOOR", is call to order. Bago ang lahat, we acknowledge the presence of City Councilor Reynaldo Fabian, City Councilor Levy Tela, City Councilor Reynaldo Palabrica, City Councilor Alde Pagulayan, at sa ating resource persons pwede pong magpakilala kayo at kung anong department?"

Hon. Rogelio M. Nolasco: "Thank you po, nabigyan naman po kayo ng copy nitong ordinasa na ating subject matter? "Pursuant to a meeting with the Department and Unit heads concerned, it was agreed that there is a need to amend the city Government's CSR Ordinance to address some gaps in its implementation. The common issues that were raised and addressed are as

follows: a) donations are not considered CSR activities. B) projects that are considered as CSR activities should be those proposed by the CSWD and the BPLD." So, actually nabasa nyo na rin po yung City Ordinance 242-2022 na sponsored po ni Konsehal Reynaldo Fabian? Doon po tayo sa proposed amendments doon po sa section 2 Definition of Terms."

Hon. Reynaldo Palabrica: "Mr. Chair, pwede po magtanong na tayo ng daretso sa ating dalawang resource persons? Ang issues lang naman dito ay dalawa lang naman. Ang tanong ko po ay sa BPLD ano ano po bang company ang tumatanggap ng CSR or Corporate Social Responsibility?"

Mr. Hernan Alhambra: "Noong tinanong ko po ang Head naming si Mr. Christian Gawaran, sa ngayon po wala pang masyadong nag co-conduct ng mga ganyang activities."

Hon. Reynaldo Palabrica: "Pero dati? Kasi dati nagpunta ako sa Zapote 5 mayroong Mercury Drug na may medically mission for their Corporate Social Responsibility pero matagal na iyon, kaya gusto kong malaman kung ano ang mga Business Establishment kung meron dito sa City of Bacoor who were conducting CSR."

Mr. Herman Alhambra: "So far, wala pa po akong alam pero aalamin ko po at gagawa po ako ng listing en then i sa submit ko po sa Sanggunian."

Hon. Reynaldo Palabrica: "Mr. Chairman kaya ko naitanong ko iyon kasi ang isa sa amendment na nkalagay dito ay for all corporate social activities should be coordinated or collaborated with the Office of the CSWD and the BPLD. And also, parang inilagay dito sa amendment na to be determined by the CSWD and BPLD kaya gusto kong malaman kung sino sino at saka siguro kailangan ding malaman naman natin kasi walang public awareness na mayroong nag co-conduct ng ganoon kasi nga wala sigurong coordination and the very reason why the proposed amendment is to coordinate with CSWD and BPLD. Mr. Chair follow up question ko lang po sa CSWD naman, may mga Company ba or Corporation na nag co-conduct ng CSR?"

Ms. Gina Pornelos: "Yes po your honor, presently meron po tayo sa TaskUs na partner natin na nag co-conduct outreach program doon sa ating temporary shelter po."

Hon. Reynaldo Palabrica: "Continuous yun?"

Ms. Gina Pornelos: "Yes po. Continuous yun."

Hon. Reynaldo Palabrica: "Pero part of their CSR? Kasi nagbabawas sila ng tax eh."

Ms Gina Pornelos: "Call center siya doon sa bandang Molino 4 po. And yung kamakailan po nag coordinate sa atin yung sa PEA Tollway Corporation bali ang target naman po ay may approve amount sila na PHP 140,000.00 pesos na ibibigay para doon sa mga fisherman doon sa Sinbanali po."

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Hon. Reynaldo Palabrica: "Ah ang MBP kay Manny Pangilinan yan."

Ms. Gina Pornelos: "Yung kay Atty. Naman po, they are preparing for MOA signing and their target is for next month naman po."

Hon. Reynaldo Palabrica: "Pero ang nag dedetermine ng activity nila? Ano ang particular activity na ginawa nila?

Ms. Gina Pornelos: "Yung sa PEA Tollway po nagbibigay po ng parang bangka na fiber glass at yung sa TaskUs yung sa CSR sa shelter po sa mga bata nag papa activity po sila sa mga bata gaya po ng TV nag dodonate po sila sa amin at nag papa games po sila doon na talagang nakakatulong po sa development ng mga bata may mga interaction po sila doon."

Hon. Reynaldo Palabrica: "Pero nang nag conduct ang 2 particular na Corporations na iyon ang nag determine ng activities nila? kinoordinate lang sa atin? hindi tayo ang nag determine?"

Ms. Gina Pornelos: "Nagkaroon lang po ng pag uusap parang plano na inalam nila kung ano yung particular na kailangan, specially doon sa mga Kabataan natin sa shelter umupo po talaga with us dito sa CSWD."

Hon. Reynaldo Palabrica: "That is perfectly objective for this amendment, meron dyang magpapa CSR tapos hindi naman beneficial parang one side lang for the purpose na may ma proof lang for the City Government na mayroon silang CSR activities hindi naman siya beneficial na supposedly para sa beneficiaries, parang may mali nga? Yun lang po Mr. Chair."

Hon. Alde Pagulayan: "Doon sa CSWD, kasi di ba sabi nga ni Konsi Rey at Konsi Bok lahat ng CSR activities should pass to the CSWD will the department encourage the specific type of menu na ito yung mga activies na, halimbawa may mga locators tayo we have 4000 business here. Can you imagine na yung 4000 businesses ay mag CSR sabay sabay so, napaka laking ganansya sa City now, may ganon ba? Na may specific corporations na pwede nyong tapunan halimbawa corporation A or corporation B na the process that they can come up with the project or did you recommend something?

Ms. Faith Fejutagare: "Sa ngayon po wala pa pong pumapasok sa amin, ang naka usap pa lang po namin ay yung TaskUs at PEA Tollway tulad ng sinabi po ni Mam Gina na mayroon pong pag uusap, in regards po doon sa pag uusap yun po ay inaayos para hindi mo ma double yung program ana ibibigay doon sa mga tao.

Hon. Alde Pagulayan: "Tama ba na yung CSR itself as a concept ay gamit na gamit iyan sa panahon ng brigada eskwela. Halimbawa meron tayong tinatawag which is under sa CSWD na out of school program kayo di ba?"

Ms. Gina Porelos: "Wala po."

Hon. Reynaldo Palabrica: "Meron tayong tinatawag na Child Development for Day Care Center."

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Hon. Alde Pagulayan: "Kasi nakausap ko si Mam Lilian before na there was an initiative to reach out to the different corporation using the CSR doctrine to reach out para mag assist para sa adapt a school program. So, wala pa pala yun?"

Ms. Gina Pornelos: "Tatanong po namin."

Hon. Alde Pagulayan: "What I mean is, it can be maximize towards that particular agenda."

Ms. Gina Pornelos: "Yes po."

Hon. Alde Pagulayan: "Mr. Chair, yun lang po ang manifestation ko."

Hon. Rogelio M. Nolasco: "Thank you Konsi."

**Hon. Reynaldo Fabian:** "Tanong ko lang sa CSWD kung pwede naming malaman kung sino talaga ang mga qualified para alam namin kung sino talaga yung nag po provide ng CSR sa CSWD."

Ms. Gina Pornelos: "Noted po."

Hon. Alde Pagulayan: "Mr. Chair, In regards doon sa manifestation ni Konsi Fabian. According to Corporate Social Responsibility may law kasi governing the use of CSR sa bansa any entity or business entity can engage in CSR. C) Free use of selected advertising spaces owned by the city government for not more than ten (10) calendar days. D) 10% discount in their Mayor's permit and Sanitation Permit fee for the year following the conduct of the CSR activity/ies. E) Use an express lane at business One-Stop-shop facility at the Bacoor city Hall for their transactions with the city government; and f) assistance to be provided by the LEIPO in the processing of their applications of various permits to be issued by the city government. WHEREAS, studies conducted abroad show that giving incentives and due recognition to private businesses engaged in meaningful CSR activities produce better results than making the holding of such activities mandatory.

WHEREAS, Municipal Ordinance No. 4 was passed by the defunct Sangguniang Bayan of Bacoor, Cavite on February 6, 2012 and it mandated corporations, partnerships, and businesses operating within the City to conduct CSR activities without providing any term of incentive or recognition to said private entities in exchange for the community.

WHEREAS, very few companies have been compelled to comply with Municipal Ordinance No. 4 which means that a new strategy must be employed by the City Government in order to enhance its partnership with the private sector.

NOW THEREFORE, upon motion of Hon. Hon. Reynaldo M. Fabian. BE IT ORDAINED by the 5th Sanggunlang Panlungsod of the City of Bacoor. Cavite THAT:

Section 1. Application. This Ordinance shall apply to all business establishments, professionals, and institutions (such as schools and hospitals) doing business, working, or operating within the City of Bacoor, Cavite.

Section 2. Definition of Terms. The following terms as used in this Ordinance are defined as:

- 2.1. Business Establishments any natural or juridical person not engaged in the practice of profession that is duly registered as a business with the Business Permits and Licensing Office (BPLO) of the City of Baccor and is engaged in the trade or delivery of goods and services to any member of the public.
- 2.2. Corporate Social Responsibility or Citizen's Social Responsibility (CSR) Activities any activity conducted within the City of Bacoor by any business establishment, professional, or institution that aims to improve society, the environment, the lives of the poor, the sick, the victims of injustice, or the underprivileged.
- Institutions any school, hospital, or charitable organization operating within the City of Baccor, Cavite.

2.4. Professionals — any resident of the City of Bacoor duly registered with the Professional Regulation Commission (PRC) or the Supreme Court of the Philippines as a professional who are practicing their profession within the City.

establishments, professionals, and institutions that will conduct CSR activities in the City of Baccor in coordination with the Local Economic and Investments Promotion Office (LEIPO) or any other department under the Office of the City Mayor prior to the holding of such activities shall be entitled to the following incentives:

- a. Free advertising of their products or services to all free cable television channels airing in the City of Baccor for a period of thirty (30) calendar days.
- Public recognition of the business establishments, professionals, and institutions that will conduct CSR activities in all social media accounts owned by the city government.
- c. Free use of selected advertising spaces owned by the city government for not more than ten (10) calendar days.
- d. 10% discount in their Mayor's Permit and Sanitation Permit fee for the year following the conduct of the CSR activity/ies.
- Use of an express lane at Business One-Stop Shop facility at the Bacoor City Hail for their transactions with the city government; and
- Assistance to be provided by the LEIPO in the processing of their applications of various permits to be issued by the city government.

Section 4. Conditions for the Grant of Incentives. The incentives mentioned above shall only be granted if the business establishment, professional, or institution applying for the same complies with the following conditions:

- 4.1. It has no unpaid taxes or other accountabilities to the city government:
- 4.2. It is consistently complying with all city ordinances and has not filed suit against the city government or is not the subject of a legal action filed against It by the city government:

4.3. It coordinated with the LEIPO or with any department/unit under the Mayor's Office or with the Office of the Vice Mayor before the CSR activity/ies was/were held: and

4.4. The business establishment, institution, or professional applied for the grant of the said incentive in the manner to be provided in the implementing rules and regulations of this Ordinance.

Section 5.4 Penalty. Any city government employee that refuses without justifiable cause to grant the incentives mentioned above to qualified business establishments, professionals, or institutions shall be deemed to have violated this Ordinance and shall be required — upon conviction by a court of competent jurisdiction — to pay a fine of P5.000.00.

Section 6. Implementing Rules and Regulations. The BPLO, LEIPO, and the City Legal Services Office shall work together under the supervision of the City Administrator and submit to the City Mayor the proposed implementing rules and regulations of this Ordinance not later than thirty (30) working days after the date of effectivity hereof.

Section 7. Separability Clause. It for any reason, any provision of this Ordinance is declared void by a Court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall not affect or impair the remaining portions, provisions, sections, or parts thereof which shall remain or continue to be in full force and effect.

Section 8. Repealing Clause. Municipal Ordinance No. 4-5-2012 is hereby repealed. All other ordinances, rules and regulations or parts thereof which are in conflict or inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby considered repealed, amended or modified, accordingly.

Section 9. Date of Effectivity. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately after its publication at least once in a newspaper of general circulation in the Province of Cavite.
