JOINT COMMITTEE REPORT

NO. PWH 010-S-2024

Subject: *AN ORDINANCE MANDATING CONTRACTORS TO SECURE SPECIAL PERMIT PRIOR TO PROJECT ENGAGEMENT IN THE CITY OF BACOOD. (PCO 2024-169 dated March 11, 2024).*

The joint committee hearing called to order on 18 of April, 2024 at 1:04 pm. It was presided over by Chairperson of Public Works and Highways, Hon. Levy M. Tela. By mandating that contractors obtain a valid permit before beginning any project, the aforementioned ordinance seeks to regulate and ensure that contractors operating within the jurisdiction of the City of Bacoor have the proper documentation and compliance with various city ordinances promoting public health, safety, and general welfare.

FINDINGS:

Section 47 of the Local Government Code grants the LGUs the authority to impose and collect such reasonable fees and charges on business and occupation and, except as reserved to the province in Section 139 of the same Code, on the practice of any profession or calling, commensurate with the cost of regulation, inspection, and licensing before any person may engage in such business or occupation, or practice such profession or calling;

National agencies and private utility service providers company frequently engage various contractors to undertake their respective project in various localities.

Many of these contractors do not maintain primary offices in the City of Bacoor and thus have not obtained a business permit from the City Government of Bacoor;

This ordinance aims to regulate and ensure that contractors operating within the jurisdiction of the City of Bacoor have the proper documentation and compliance with various city ordinances promoting public health, safety, and general welfare.



RECOMMENDATION:

In support to the City of Bacoor is committed to ensuring that contractors operating within the City Government have standards, secure and safe business practices in place and are adhering to varied regulations and safety standards required in its business operations. The committee respectfully recommends the **APPROVAL** of the proposed ordinance mentioned above.

Subject: *AN ORDINANCE MANDATING CONTRACTORS TO SECURE SPECIAL PERMIT PRIOR TO PROJECT ENGAGEMENT IN THE CITY OF BACOR. (PCO 2024-169 dated March 11, 2024).*

A joint committee hearing was conducted on 18 April, 2024, 1:04 P.M. at the Sangguniang Panlungsod Session Hall, 6th floor, Bacoor Legislative & Disaster Resilience Building, Bacoor Government Center, Bacoor Boulevard, Brgy Bayanan, City of Bacoor, Cavite, and was presided over by Committee on Public Works and Highways, Chairman, Hon. Levy M. Tela. Vice Chairman, Hon. Roberto Advincula, member Hon. Michael Solis. Committee on Rules and Privileges, Laws and Ordinances, Chairman, Hon. Reynaldo Palabrica, member Adrielito Gawaran. Also in attendance, Hon. Alde Pagulayan and Hon. Simplicio Dominguez. Atty. Salve Valenciano from the Office of City Legal Services, Eng. Arthur San Jose of Zoning and Land Development Department.

Hon. Tela, introduced the resource persons as well as the other guests.

Hon. Tela: "This ordinance regarding the special permit kasi karamihan dito sa City of Bacoor, kayo iyung proponent like Globe, Maynilad, Meralco, DPWH, contractor at subcontractor ninyo minsan talaga naman walang masasabing permit. Kaya meron kaming isang ordinance hindi dapat gumawa ng mga ganung bagay, nagkakaroon ng mga aksidente hindi malaman kung sino iyung sisihin in case of accident."

Hon. Gutierrez: "Mr. Chair, siguro dumeretso na tayo, so section 5 mandatory requirement for special permit for contractor (continue reading in section 5). Nandito naman ang mga requirement sa pagkuha ng permit".

Maynilad: "Dito sa not more than 3M, tapos ang fees niya ay 5,000 pesos, pwede sigurong magkaroon ng small bracket tayo like leak repairs. Kasi sa leak repair ay less than 5,000 lang. 3,000 lang po ang leak repairs. Baka may maliit lang na bracket, kasi iyung 5,000 mas malaki pa ang babayaran namin kesa sa bayad namin sa contractor".

Gawaran-BPLD: "Pwede naman nating I consider kasi naka base sila sa malalaki nilang project. Hindi naman naka consider iyung mga leaks na i-repair nila.



Hon. Palabrica: "Ang concern mo link repair, kontratista ka ng Maynilad or you are from Maynilad? You are from Maynilad, may kontratista kayo sa leak repair"? How much ang cost ng project pag ganun, leak repair"?

Maynilad: "3,000 pesos per 1 linear meter".

Hon. Palabrica: "Ah per linear meter, pero base on your experience and records, meron bang kontratista na 3,000 lang ang binayaran ninyo"?

Maynilad: "Yes, meron po, kasi po maliit lang naman ang leak at hindi naman namin pinapahukay ng mas mahaba kung hindi kinakailangan, halimbawa po one by one lang".

Hon. Palabrica: "Three thousand pesos lang, sisirain ninyo ang kalsada tapos three thousand pesos lang, I dis-agree my friend. Meron bang trabaho na three thousand pesos lang at this time. Residential yan at hindi sa highway". City road? Tapos three thousand pesos lang. I don't believe you sa three thousand pesos. Can you show us a document for three thousand pesos contract"?

Maynilad: "Sabihan ko po".

Hon. Palabrica: Mr. Chairman I required this Guy to produced or submit at least photocopy of a contract stating the amount of 3,000 pesos for this committee to believe his manifestation. But we will take note his concern that he is requesting to lessen the contractor special permit fee in Section 5 of this ordinance.

Hon. Tela: Noted! Please submit document to us for reference. What about Rep. of Globe Telecom, do you have suggestion regarding this matter?

Mr. Roque (Globe Telecom): "Tanong ko lang about restoration ng line namin, example natumba iyung poste. Kailangan ba naming humingi ng permit sa inyo para ma restore namin ang line"?

Hon. Palabrica: "Paalala ko lang sa inyo na dati may kaso ang globe na may aksidente sa road at may namatay. Hindi malaman kung sino ang hahabulin kasi bukod sa kotratista meron pang ibang kontratista ang involve. Please repeat your question".

Mr. Roque: "Halimbawa po may calamity na sumira sa poste, nabangga ng kotse ang isang base namin, kailangan pa ba naming kumuha ng permit"?

Hon. Palabrica: "Of course, kung may kontratista kayo, or by administration ninyo gagawin ang restoration? Who will perform the restoration, you are the Globe or your contractor"? (Mr. Roque replied, kadalasan Globe)Walang problema dun kasi ang pinag uusapan natin dito contractor special permit fee. Mga kontraktor na nag perform ng project dito with jurisdiction ng City of Bacoor". To clarify, this ordinance is covered only the all contractors.



Maynilad: "Iyung cover ba ng ordinance na ito is activities within public roads or public highways what if for example the activity inside the premises. Kasi di ba bago kami makapag build kailangan din naman naming ng building permit hindi na ba ito covered"?

Hon. Palabrica: "Regarding this matter we call the attention of BPLD".

OIC-BPLD Gawaran: "kung construction within the premises ng office, sa tingin ko mag apply din sila ng contractors' tax, kasama siya sa building permit at hindi siya contractor fees. Yung contractor naman magbabayad sila ng tax para dito".

Globe: "May clarification regarding po sa contractor namin, maintenance sa facilities namin within Bacoor, ang contract nila is price the whole Region IV, papaano kaya ma categorized iyung base sa total project cost niya"?

Hon. Palabrica: "Ma-compute natin ang project base on land area and base on installation".

Globe: "Hindi siya installation para siyang restoration. When fiber a cause dun lang sila mag maintain".

Hon. Palabrica: "Mag declare kayo kung magkano ang cover within jurisdiction ng Bacoor, you should declare the total cost of the project".

Maynilad: "Regarding po dun sa question kanina nung kasama ko, nabanggit po niya na job order cost namin yun, I mean meron kaming maintenance activity like leak repair iba't ibang lugar po yun, ibig sabihin po ba ng cost ng permit, one time permit ba yun sa maintenance contractor namin.

Hon. Palabrica: "Before I answer that question, may i-clarify lang ako. Yung contractor ba ninyo per case basis. Ibig sabihin per case basis at hindi siya maintenance contractor na kahit saan magkaroon leak dun siya. At whole year naka contract na yun sa isang kontratista. And we talking about one contractor and how much the is the contract fee of the particular contractor in your company, dun tayo mag base".

Maynilad: "Yes, ang ibig sabihin, contract cost ito or project cost na tinutukoy dito. Ibig sabihin iyung the whole year iyung contractor namin, kahit saan sa Bacoor at ang special fees niya is 5,000 lang po for the whole year. Kasi meron din kaming process dun sa aming maintenance na bawat Job Order namin na ini issue naming kumukuha kami ng Barangay permit at City permit parehas lang po ba ito sa special permit"?

Hon. Palabrica: "Sasagutin ng BPLD yan at the question is may binabayaran sila, halimbawa Barangay clearance at anu ano pang mga clearances na ini-issue ninyo or ng Engineering na binabayaran sa Treasury".



Mr. Gawaran: "Oo iba ito. Ibang fees ito sa mga contractors ninyo, once nan a engage kayo sa isang contractor may babayaran si contractor ninyo dito".

Hon. Palabrica: "Ang ini impose na fees iyung mga existing is being impose to the proponent project. Halimbawa Maynilad meron kayong re-piping project lahat ng fees regarding re-piping iyun yung babayaran ng Maynilad. So Maynilad will be responsible for payment for the particular project. Dito contractor po ninyo ito. It will base to the contract price.

Maynilad: "So ibig sabihin nga, kung contractor namin sila for the whole year at iyung cost ng contract namin, iyun lang ang babayaran nila".


Hon. Palabrica: "Pag sinabi ninyo contract, and stated in the contract like duration, example 6 months or 1 year". Tulad ng sinabi mo kanina na 1 year, we will base on 1 year contract. The ordinance will take effect upon the approval of Sangguniang Panlalawigan".

Hon. Tela: "Itong ordinance na ito ay para sa mga inyong contractor na walang business permit sa amin, sa kanila naming hinihingan ng special permit. Upang maiwasan ang tulad na nangyari na magturuan kung sino ang liable sa mga aksidenteng mangyayari. Iyung mga contractor ninyo na wala namang business permit sa amin. Exempted ang mga contractor na may business permit sa amin. Dun tayo nakatuon sa inyong mga contractor".

**AN ORDINANCE MANDATING CONTRACTORS TO SECURE
SPECIAL PERMIT PRIOR TO PROJECT ENGAGEMENT IN THE
CITY OF BACOR**

WHEREAS, Section 16 of R.A. No. 7160 provides that every local government unit shall exercise the powers expressly granted, those necessarily implied therefrom, as well as powers necessary, appropriate or incidental for its efficient and effective governance and those which are essential to the promotion of the general welfare, including the promotion of safety of its constituents and provision of adequate transportation facilities;

WHEREAS, Section 47 of the Local Government Code grants the LGUs the authority to impose and collect such reasonable fees and charges in business and occupation and, except as reserved to the province in Section 139 of the same Code, on the practice of any profession or calling commensurate with the cost of regulation, inspection, and licensing before any person may engage in such business or occupation or practice such profession or calling;

WHEREAS, national agencies and private utility service providers companies frequently engage various contractors to undertake their respective projects in various localities;

WHEREAS, many of these contractors do not maintain primary offices in the City of Bacoor and thus have not obtained a business permit from the City Government of Bacoor;

WHEREAS, the Department of Finance issued a Local Finance Circular No. 001-2022 providing for the guidelines on the imposition of local business tax, fees and charges to service contractors;

NOW, THEREFORE, upon motion of Honorable _____, duly seconded by _____ members of the Sangguniang Panlungsod, **BE IT ORDAINED** by the Sangguniang Panlungsod in _____ session duly assembled **THAT**:

Section 1. TITLE. This ordinance shall be known as the "Contractor's Special Permit Ordinance".

Section 2. PURPOSE. The purpose of this ordinance is to regulate and ensure the proper documentation and compliance of contractors operating within the jurisdiction of the City of Bacoor to various city ordinances promoting public health, safety, and general welfare by requiring them to obtain a valid business permit prior to engaging in any project. The City Government of Bacoor is committed to ensuring that contractors operating within the City of Bacoor have standards, secure and safe business practices in place and are adhering to the various regulations and safety standards required in its business operations.

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Section 3. SCOPE. This Ordinance shall apply to all contractors working on behalf of national agencies such as DPWH, MERALCO, MAYN LAD, PLDT, GLOBE, and other public utilities operating within the City of Bacoor.

Contractors who have a registered principal business address in the City of Bacoor are exempt from the coverage of this ordinance.

Section 4. DEFINITIONS. As used in this Ordinance, the following terms shall mean as follows:

1. **Administrative Office** refers to offices that house office departments such as, but not limited to, treasury, internal audit, administration, purchasing, and finance. It is neither a branch, sales, or project office and does not operate any aspect of its business or primary purposes, nor does it handle the invoices or records of sales to its customers, nor are there any transactions or sales made thereat.
2. **Branch or Sales Office** refers to a fixed place in a locality that conducts operations of the business as an extension of the principal office. A warehouse that accepts orders and/or issues sales invoices independently of a branch with a sales office shall be considered a sales office.
3. **Contractor** - Any individual, partnership, corporation, or entity engaged in construction, renovation, or any related projects. **Service Contractor** refers to persons, natural or juridical, not subject to professional tax under Section 139 of the LGC, whose activity consists essentially of all kinds of services for a fee, regardless of whether or not the performance of the service calls for the exercise or use of the physical or mental faculties of such contractor or his employees.

As used in this Article, the term contractor shall include general engineering, general building and specialty contractors as defined under applicable laws, filing, demolition and salvage works contractors, proprietors or operators of mine drilling apparatus, proprietors or operators of dockyards, persons engaged in the installation of water system and gas or electric light, heat or power, proprietors or operators of smelting plants, engraving, plating and plastic lamination establishments, proprietors or operators of establishments for repairing, repairing, upholstering, washing or greasing of vehicles, heavy equipment, vulcanizing, recapping and battery charging, proprietors or operators of furniture shops and establishments for planing or surfacing and recutting of lumber and sawmills, under contract to saw or cut logs belonging to others, proprietors or operators of dry-cleaning or dyeing establishment, steam laundries, and laundries using washing machines, proprietors or owners of shops for the repair of any kind of mechanical and electrical devices, instruments, apparatus, proprietors or operators of arrastre and sievedoring, warehousing, master plumbers, smiths, and house or sign painters.

4. **Fee** refers to a charge fixed by law or ordinance for the regulation or inspection of a business or activity.
5. **Principal Office** refers to the head or main office of the business appearing in the pertinent documents submitted to the Securities and Exchange

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Commission, the Department of Trade and Industry, or other appropriate agencies, as the case may be.

6. **Project Office** refers to an office used in administering the project of construction being undertaken in pursuit of the business, which may not be a fixed place but one that may be transferred from one project site to another.
7. **General Engineering Contractor** refers to a person whose principal contracting business is in connection with fixed works requiring specialized engineering knowledge and skill including the following divisions or subjects: irrigation, drainage, water power, water supply, flood control, inland waterways, harbors, docks, wharves, shipyards and ports, dams, hydro-electric projects, levees, river control and reclamation works, railroads, highways, street and roads, bridges, overpasses, underpasses and other similar works; pipelines and other system for the transmission of petroleum and other liquid or gaseous substances; land leveling and earth moving projects; excavating, grading, trenching, paving and surfacing works.
8. **General Building Contractor** refers to a person whose principal contracting business is in connection with any structure built, being built, or to be built for the support, shelter, and enclosure of persons, animals, chattels, or movable property of any kind, requiring in its construction the use of more than two unrelated building trades or crafts, to do or superintend the whole of any part thereof. Such structure includes sewers and sewerage disposal plants and system, parks, playgrounds, and other recreation works, refineries, chemical plants, and similar industrial plants requiring specialized engineering knowledge and skill, powerhouses, power plants, and other utility plants and installations, mines and metallurgical plants, cement and concrete works in connection with the above-mentioned fixed works.

A person who merely furnishes materials or supplies without fabricating them into or consuming them in the performance of the work of the general building contractor does not necessarily fall within this definition.
9. **Mayor's Permit and Business License** - A legal document issued by the (City/Municipality) authorizing a contractor to conduct business within its jurisdiction. Refers to a local license required for a business or company to operate in the City of Bacoor.
10. **Specialty contractor** - refers to a person whose operations pertain to the performance of construction work requiring special skills and training and whose principal contracting business involves the use of specialized building trades and crafts.
11. **Special Permit Fee** - refers to a charge imposed upon contractors for the issuance of a special permit. This permit authorizes a contractor to perform certain types of work within the jurisdiction of the City of Bacoor.

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Section 5. MANDATORY REQUIREMENT FOR SPECIAL PERMIT FOR CONTRACTORS AND SPECIAL PERMIT FEE. All contractors intending to undertake construction, renovation, or related projects within the City of Bacoor must obtain a valid Contractor's Special Permit from the Business Permit and Licensing Department before commencing any project work within the City of Bacoor.

Each permit issued by the City Mayor must show the name of the applicant, the nationality, address, nature of the organization, whether a sole proprietorship, corporation, or partnership, the location of the business, number of the permit, date of issue, and other information required by the City Mayor.

An applicant for a Contractor's Special Permit shall be required to pay the following fee:

Total Project Cost	Fees
Not more than P3,000,000.00	P 5,000.00
P3,000,001.00 - P15,000,000.00	P 27,500.00
P15,000,001.00 - P100,000,000.00	P 55,000.00
In excess of P100,000,000.00	P 100,000.00

For contractors registered in the City of Bacoor, the latest Mayor's Permit and Business License.

Section 6. ISSUANCE OF PERMIT. The Special Permits issued shall take effect on the date of issuance and shall expire on the date specified in the duration of the project. The issuance of the Special Permit shall not relieve the permit-holder from complying with the requirements of the other departments of the City Government pertaining to contracting business operations or activities prescribed under the Bacoor City Revenue Code.

Section 7. DOCUMENTARY REQUIREMENTS. The following are the documentary requirements for applying for a Mayor's Permit prior to engagement in its contracting business:

1. Proof of business registration, incorporation, or legal personality (e.g., DTI, SEC/Cooperative Development Authority (CDA) registration) including the basis for computing taxes, fees, and charges (e.g., business capitalization). For franchisees, a copy of the Franchise Agreement, Information on its principal business address/office shall be included.
2. If maintaining a warehouse or branch office in the City of Bacoor, a Contract of Lease and Lessor's Mayor's Permit and Business License (for those renting/leasing).
3. Certified true copy of a Contractor's license duly issued by the Philippine Contractors Accreditation Board (PCAB).
4. Name of the principal project proponent for which it is rendering contract services.
5. Name, duration, and location of its projects within the City of Bacoor.
6. List of ongoing and completed projects.
7. The total number of employees of the business and the number of employees residing in the City of Bacoor, if any. This shall include registered engineers and licensed architects, as the case may be.
8. Proof of payment of temporary business permit.

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9. Other supporting documents as may be required

Section 8. APPLICATION PROCESS

1. Applicant shall submit a duly accomplished Contractor's Special Permit unified application form along with the required supporting documents to the Business Permit and Licensing Department.
2. Pay the required fees for the Special Permit application.
3. The Business Permit and Licensing Department shall process the application within three (3) working days from the date of submission.
4. Upon approval, the contractor shall be issued a Contractor's Special Permit valid for a period of ninety (90) days or the period specified in the project duration as applied by the contractor, whichever is longer.

Section 9. EXTENSION OF PERMIT. Should the completion of the project not be met within the 90-day period or extended beyond the given project duration due to the contractor's fault, the contractor shall notify the BPLD of such fact and apply for a new temporary business permit.

Section 10. REVOCATION OF PERMIT. Upon proper and written notice, the City Mayor, through the BPLD, may revoke the permit and close the establishment for any of the following reasons:

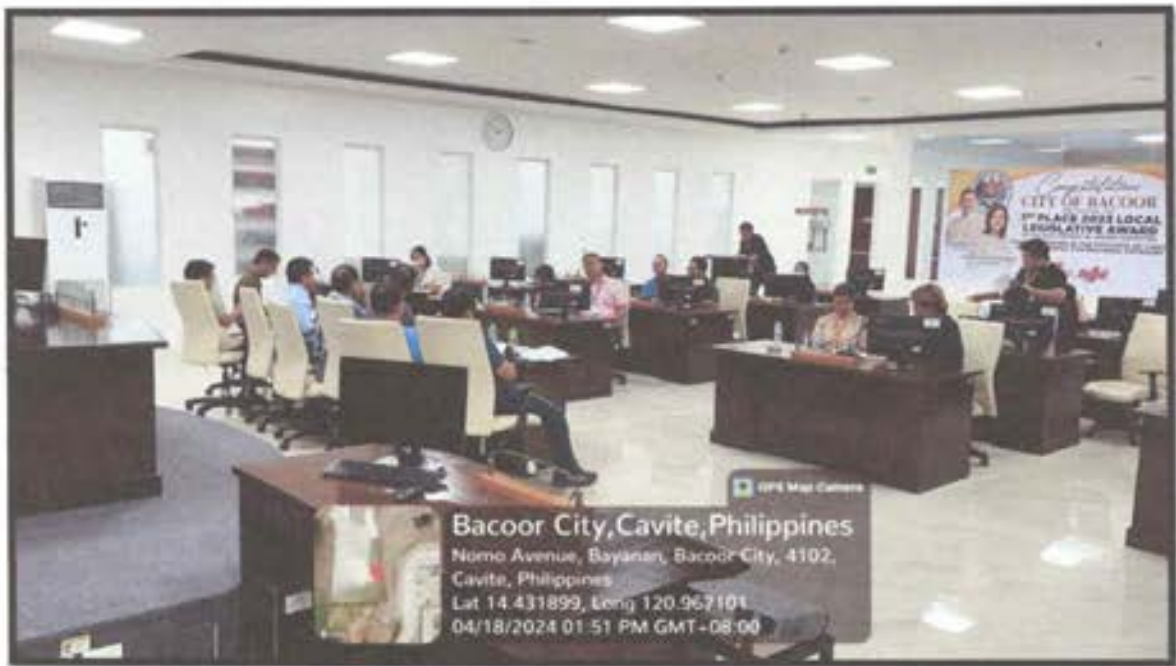
1. Violation of any condition set forth in the permit.
2. Abuse of privilege to do business or pursuit of activity to the injury of public morals, disruption of peace and order, and the endangerment of the health of the community.
3. Refusal to pay an indebtedness or liability to the City.
4. Deliberate submission of false or inaccurate documents, data, or information that led to the grant of the permit.
5. Performing activities in order to avoid compliance with this Ordinance, and
6. Other analogous acts.

Section 11. PENALTIES FOR NON-COMPLIANCE. Any contractor found operating without a valid temporary business permit before undertaking its contracted project shall be imposed a fine of P2,500.00 after inspection and issuance of a notice of violation.

Section 12. COMPLIANCE MONITORING. The City Business Permit and Licensing Department shall conduct regular inspections to ensure compliance with this ordinance. It shall coordinate with the City Engineering Office in monitoring the compliance of the service contractors prior to the actual commencement of their respective project work.

Section 13. EFFECTIVITY. This ordinance shall take effect immediately after its publication at least once in a newspaper of general circulation.
