Subject: AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING THE INSTALLATION OF A RETARDING IMPOUNDING BASIN FOR EVERY LAND DEVELOPMENT PROJECT IN THE CITY OF BACOOR, PROVINCE OF CAVITE. (PCO 2024-201 dated 13 August 2024)

This report hereby resolves requiring the installation of a retarding impounding basin for every land project in the City of Bacoor dated 27 August 2024. The aforementioned proposed ordinance was referred to the committee by the Sangguniang Panlungsod Presiding Officer, Hon. Rowena Bautista-Mendiola, during the 103rd regular session held on 13 August 2024.

The Committee on Housing, Land Utilization, and Urban Development, under the esteemed chairmanship of the Hon. Alde Joselito F, Pagulayan, reports the following:

Article II. Section 16 of the 1987 Constitution mandates the State to protect and advance the right of the people to a balanced and healthful ecology, aligned with the natural environment.

Section 3(i) of Republic Act No. 7160 (Local Government Code of 1991) empowers local government units (LGUs) to implement environmental protection measures in collaboration with the national government.

The City of Bacoor frequently faces flooding, a problem worsened by infrastructure limitations and the presence of illegal structures blocking waterways. In response to these challenges, the city acknowledges its responsibility to protect and revive ecosystems through measures such as controlling water pollution, mitigating flooding, and promoting sustainable development.

To address these issues, the city proposes the installing retarding or impounding basins in flood-prone areas as a flood mitigation strategy. These basins temporarily store rainwater runoff, helping to reduce the impact of urban flooding.

FINDINGS:

A public hearing was held on 22 August 2024, where the committee discussed the ordinance requiring the inclusion of retarding and impounding basins in new development projects. During the hearing:

- Chairperson Hon, Alde Joselito F. Pagulayan cited a 2011 Municipal Ordinance (AN ORDINANCE MANDATING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A WATER IMPOUNDING SYSTEM IN ALL LAND DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS IN BACOOR, CAVITE). (A copy of the attachment is hereto for reference.)
- Developers admitted they were unaware of the 2011 ordinance, leading to noncompliance.
- It was proposed that Drainage Impact Studies (DIS) be required for future projects. ensuring solutions are tailored to each area's geographic characteristics.
- Improved coordination between developers and the city was emphasized to ensure compliance with drainage standards.

RECOMMENDATION:

After thorough deliberation, the committees recommend the APPROVAL of the proposed ordinance, subject to the following amendments: a) the deletion of the phrase "including but is not limited to" in Section 4 of the draft ordinance, and b) the correction of clerical errors in the draft legislation. (A copy of the attachment is hereto for reference.)

The hearing was called to order by Hon. Alde Joselito F. Pagulayan, Chairperson of the Committee on Housing and Land Utilization. The Chairperson proceeded by

presenting the agenda and requesting the attendees to introduce themselves, including the members of the respective committees and resource persons.

The principal matter discussed was PCO 2024-201, an ordinance mandating the installation of a retarding impounding basin for every development project within the City of Bacoor, Cavite.

The Chairperson revisited the provisions of the 2011 Municipal Ordinance (AN ORDINANCE MANDATING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A WATER IMPOUNDING SYSTEM IN ALL LAND DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS IN BACOOR, CAVITE) sponsored by Hon. Edwin G. Gawaran. He emphasized the critical role of these systems in mitigating flooding risks, which are prevalent in Bacoor. The purpose of the retarding basins is to manage surface water runoff effectively by retaining rainwater within the development site, thereby preventing excessive water flow to adjacent areas.

He specifically cited instances where developments such as Soluna Subdivision and Vista Verde were identified as contributing to increased flood risks in nearby areas, particularly in Barangay Mambog. This observation was corroborated by Engr. Jutba.


A representative from Soluna Subdivision admitted non-compliance with the 2011 ordinance, acknowledging that no retarding basin or water impounding facility was installed in their development. The developers attributed this non-compliance to a lack of awareness of the ordinance and its Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR), as implemented by the city government.

The Chairperson also stressed that developers with projects initiated after 2011 were particularly reminded of their obligations under the ordinance, Representatives from Vista Verde and Soluna Subdivisions addressed their non-compliance and outlined the steps they intended to take to rectify the situation.

Several speakers raised concerns about the aggravating impact of flooding not only from local rainfall but also from water inflows from nearby towns. The necessity of retarding basins was further emphasized as a critical measure to delay and control water flow downstream.

A proposal for requiring a Drainage Impact Study (DIS) for all future development projects was introduced to ensure comprehensive flood risk assessments before construction begins.

Engineers and resource persons stressed that cooperation between developers and the city government is essential to ensuring compliance with existing drainage standards. Proper coordination would prevent piecemeal solutions that may not address the city's overall flood risks.

Concerns were also raised regarding the proper dissemination of the ordinance's IRR, which could have contributed to misunderstandings about compliance requirements.

The council and the engineers discussed the absence of a "one-size-fits-all" solution for flood mitigation, recognizing the need for tailored water retention systems based on the geographic characteristics of each development site. Projects in areas near lowlands or bodies of water would naturally require more robust systems.

Hon. Gawaran emphasized that the design parameters for drainage systems must evolve in response to extreme weather events, such as Typhoon Ondoy, necessitating enhanced and more comprehensive flood control measures.

There was unanimous support for amending the existing ordinance or introducing new legislation to establish clear and detailed guidelines for the construction of retarding and impounding basins in future developments.

Additionally, the council urged the creation of a standard formula or framework for developers to follow when designing drainage systems, while ensuring that such standards remain adaptable depending on the type and location of the development.

The council underscored the importance of honest reporting from developers regarding their compliance with the ordinance, reminding them of their responsibility to rectify any deficiencies to prevent future flooding issues.

The necessity of a drainage master plan was emphasized, one that would encompass all subdivisions and ensure rationalized and interconnected drainage solutions across different developments. The role of government in overseeing and maintaining natural drainage systems, such as National Irrigation Administration (NIA) canals and rivers, was likewise highlighted.

The public hearing underscored the urgency of strict enforcement of the 2011 Ordinance on Water Impounding Systems, alongside the need for better coordination between developers and the government, Immediate steps were called for to address current non-compliance and to update future regulations to ensure all developments contribute to comprehensive flood control efforts.

CITY ORDINANCE NO. _____-2024 SERIES OF 2024

AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING THE INSTALLATION OF A RETARDING OR IMPOUNDING BASIN FOR EVERY LAND DEVELOPMENT PROJECT IN THE CITY OF BACOOR, PROVINCE OF CAVITE

WHEREAS, the State shall protect and advance the right of the people to a balanced and healthful ecology in accord with the rhythm and harmony of nature;

WHEREAS, the Local Government Unit shall share with the national government the responsibility for the management and maintenance of ecological balance within their territorial jurisdiction, subject to the provisions of Republic Act (RA) No. 7160, otherwise known as the "Local Government Code of 1991", and other national policies;

WHEREAS, the broad scale of environment and enhancement of ecology has become an important challenge to the national and local government, hence, the necessity for the enactment and implementation of environmental protection and management law;

WHEREAS, widespread flooding constantly occurs in the City of Bacoor due to infrastructure facilities that cannot accommodate water brought about by heavy rainfalls and illegal obstructions and structures on water canals, rivers, and other waterways;

WHEREAS, it is the obligation of the city to promote, preserve, protect, and revive the ecosystem through the prevention, control, and abatement of water pollution, particularly mitigating flooding problems across its jurisdiction and the possible spread of hazardous diseases in the environment hand-in-hand with the sustained development of the city;

WHEREAS, the construction of a retarding or impounding basins in low-lying and flood-prone areas of the City of Baccor is an attainable solution to mitigate, if not totally rectify, urban flooding;

WHEREAS, the retarding or impounding basin would temporarily store rainwater run-off and contain flooding in periods of heavy rain;

WHEREAS, this system of collecting rainwater has been proven to be an effective flood mitigation structure in the Philippines and in other countries and is presently protecting built-in areas from flooding;

WHEREAS, the City Government of Bacoor has the power to pass an ordinance to formulate policies and adopt measures to protect the environment and impose the necessary penalties for acts that would endanger the environment;

WHEREAS, the City Government of Bacoor, through the leadership of the City Mayor - Hon. Strike B. Revilla, envisions a flood-free community, which is vital to boost

the city's economy while at the same time protecting its constituents from possible flood hazards and spread of related diseases;

NOW THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Sangguniang Panlungsod of the City of Baccor, Cavite, that:

Section 1. SHORT TITLE. - This Ordinance shall be known as the "Retarding Basin Ordinance of the City of Bacoor 2024."

Section 2. DECLARATION OF POLICY. – It is the declared policy of the State to protect lives and property in the event of floods. Pursuant thereto, the State shall take the necessary measures to capture rainwater to control flooding and to provide a safe and adequate supply of clean and unpolluted water for local purposes and sanitation.

Section 3. DEFINITION OF TERMS. - For purposes of this Ordinance, the following shall be defined as follows:

- Retarding or Impounding Basin a type of reservoir that is used to collect and store stormwater or floodwater temporarily. Its primary purpose is to control the flow rate of water runoff to prevent flooding and erosion downstream by releasing it slowly at a rate that the watercourses can accommodate.
- Drywell or Percolation Chamber an underground structure that allows water to disperse into the ground, typically for the purpose of stormwater management, which is designed to handle excess water by directing it away from built-up areas and allowing it to percolate through the soil, which helps to recharge groundwater and reduce surface runoff.
- Storm Drain System also known as a storm sewer or drainage system, is a
 network of structures designed to excess rain and ground water from paved
 streets, parking lots, sidewalks, and roofs. It typically includes components like
 gutters, street inlets, pipes, and outfalls that channel the water away from urban
 areas to prevent flooding, and the water is usually discharged into natural
 bodies of water like rivers, lakes, or the ocean.
- 4. Drainage Channel a path or conduit designed to transport water from one area to another, which can be natural, like a stream or river, or artificial, such as a ditch or canal. They are often constructed to direct stormwater runoff away from streets and properties to prevent flooding and water damage. It can be open-air channels or enclosed pipes and is essential to urban stormwater management systems.
- Natural Wash also known as a dry creek, is a dry riverbed or channel that temporarily fills and flows after rain; it is typically found in arid or semi-arid regions and can be characterized by steep sides and a flat bottom. They are often dry most of the year but can become rapidly flowing streams during rainstorms.
- Soil Erosion a specific type of erosion that involves the removal of the top layer of the soil, also known as the topsoil, from the land. This can happen through various processes such as rainfall, surface runoff, wind, and other human activities like farming and construction.

 Return Period – refers to the average length of the time in years for a rainrelated natural disaster of a given magnitude to be equaled or exceeded by the length of time a rainwater-related disaster may probably recur.

Section 4. RETARDING OR IMPOUNDING BASIN REQUIREMENT. - It is hereby prescribed that all land development projects in the City of Bacoor shall incorporate in their design a retarding or impounding basin and facility for storage for flood mitigation and supply of clean water.

For purposes of this Ordinance, the term "land development projects" includes, but is not limited to, new subdivisions, condominium communities, malls, government institutions or facilities, central business districts, and information technology parks.

Section 5. DESIGN REQUIREMENT. – The retarding or impounding basin must be designed to cope with a pre-determined flood and rain return period and must have a storage capacity prescribed by the City Government of Bacoor. The design of the retarding or impounding basin shall include the following:

- 1. Size, shape, and physical characteristic of available space;
- Construction plans with specified type of material, including lining and coating requirements;
- Detailed drawing as to how the installation will drain into an outfall structure such as a drywall or percolation chamber, storm drain system, drainage channel, or natural wash; and
- Other requirements as may be stated in the Implementing Rules and Regulations and/or further issuances.

Section 6. ISSUANCE OF PERMITS. – The City Government of Baccor, through its Zoning and Land Development Department, Office of the City Building Official and other related offices, shall not issue a building permit and the corresponding ancillary or related permits pursuant to Presidential Decree (PD) No. 1096 or the "National Building Code of the Philippines" pertaining to all land development projects that do not incorporate retarding or impounding basin in compliance with this Ordinance.

Section 7. PROHIBITIONS. - The following are prohibited acts:

- Approval of the design without incorporating the retarding or impounding basin;
- Non-construction of the required retarding or impounding basin that is actually incorporated in the design of the building;
- Issuance of a building permit and/or occupancy permit for the construction without the incorporation of a retarding or impounding basin; or
- Other analogous circumstances as may be further defined or explained in the Implementing Rules and Regulations.

Section 8. PENALTIES. - Upon conviction by a first-level court in the City of Bacoor, Province of Cavite, the following penalties shall be imposed against any person, whether natural or juridical, who shall violate this Ordinance:

First Offense

Payment of a fine amounting to Two Thousand Pesos

(PHP 2.000.00):

Second Offense

Payment of a fine amounting to Three Thousand

Pesos (PHP 3,000.00);

Third Offense

Payment of a fine of Five Thousand Pesos (PHP 5,000.00) or imprisonment for a period or more than three (3) months but not exceeding six (6) months, or both such fine and imprisonment at the discretion of

the court.

SECTION 9. IMPLEMENTING RULES AND REGULATIONS. — The Zoning and Land Development Department, in coordination with the Office of the Building Official, the City Engineering Office, and the Office of the City Legal Service, shall formulate the Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) necessary to implement the provisions of this Ordinance within ninety (90) days upon the final consideration and approval of this Ordinance by the Sangguniang Panlungsod of the City of Baccor.

SECTION 10. DATE OF EFFECTIVITY. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately after it has been published once in a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Baccor, Cavite.

SECTION 11. AUTOMATIC REVIEW. The Sanggunlang Panlungsod shall automatically review this Ordinance once every three (3) years after its approval or whenever the need for such review arises.

SECTION 12. REPEALING CLAUSE. All local ordinances, executive orders, resolutions, memoranda, regulations, or part thereof in conflict or inconsistent with any provisions of this Ordinance shall be considered hereby revoked and/or modified accordingly.

SECTION 13. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. If, for any reason, any provision of this Ordinance is deemed not valid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall not affect or impair the remaining portions, provisions, sections, or parts thereof, which shall remain in full force and effect.

Municipal Ordinance No. 04 Series of 2011

AN ORDINANCE MANDATING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A WATER IMPOUNDING SYSTEM IN ALL LAND DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS IN BACOOR, CAVITE.

Sponsored by Hon. Edwin G. Gawaran

WHEREAS, the municipality of Bacoor, Cavite is fast becoming a "bedroom community" due to the preponderance of residential subdivisions within its territorial boundaries.

WHEREAS, though the construction of the said residential subdivisions paved the way to the development of the municipality as best exemplified by the migration of thousands of new residents to Bacoor from outlying localities, the said development projects also adversely affected the ecology of Bacoor and its immediate environs.

WHEREAS, in the past, the various rice fields and other agricultural areas within the municipality acted as watersheds that absorbed excess rain water during the monsoon season. With the concreting of hundreds of hectares of formerly agricultural lands, however, excess rain water coming from various residential areas are now flushed directly to the various bodies of water of Bacoor.

'WHEREAS, Section 16 of R.A. 7160 (the "Local Government Code of 1991") gave local government units the power to pass ordinances which are essential to the promotion of the general welfare.

WHEREAS, Section 447, par. (2) (x) of the Local Government Code of 1991 empowers the Sangguniang Bayan to process and approve subdivision plans for residential, commercial, or industrial purposes and other developmental purposes and collect processing tees and other changes.

NOW, THEREFORE, upon motion of Hon. Edwin G. Gawaran, BE IT ORDAINED AS IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED by the Sangguniang Bayan in regular session assembled that:

Province of Cavite MUNICIPALITY OF BACOOR Office of the Sangguniang Bayan

Sec. 1. This Ordinance shall also be known as the "Water Impounding System Ordinance of Bacoor".

Sec. 2 This Ordinance shall cover all houses, buildings, commercial and educational establishments, and other future land development projects to be constructed and/or operated within Bacoor, Cavite

Sec. 3. All owners, builders, or developers of any house, building, commercial and educational establishment, or other future land development projects regardless of size or nature to be constructed or operated within Bacoor, Cavite are hereby mandated to establish a water impounding system within their respective project/s the design of which shall be subject to the approval of the Municipal Mayor.

Sec. 4. The above-mentioned water impounding system shall be included in the design of any house, building, commercial and educational establishment, or land development project covered by this Ordinance and shall be submitted to the Sangguniang Bayan prior to the approval of developer's application for a development permit. Provided: That the final design/s of the said water impounding system shall be determined by the Office of the Municipal Mayor and shall be provided under the implementing rules and guidelines of this Ordinance. Provided further. That a representative of the various land development companies affected by this Ordinance shall be consulted in the drafting of the said implementing rules and guidelines.

Sec. 5. The failure of the developer/s covered by this Ordinance to include the said water impounding system in the design of its development project shall result in the disapproval of its application for development permit. The failure of a developer covered by this Ordinance to actually construct the said water impounding system within one (1) year after the approval of its development permit shall result in the revocation of its development permit and all other permits issued by the local government of Bacoor, Cavite in favor of the said developer or development project.



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








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
