

Subject: A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MAYOR, HON. STRIKE B. REVILLA TO SIGN THE MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT AMONG THE CITY GOVERNMENT OF BACOOR, THE DEPARTMENT OF TRADE AND INDUSTRY – CAVITE (DTI-CAVITE) AND CAVITE SMALL AND MEDIUM ENTERPRISE DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF REPUBLIC ACT 10644 KNOWN AS THE "GO NEGOSYO ACT" IN THE CITY OF BACOOR. (PCR No. 246-2023 dated March 13, 2023).

The 34th Regular Session of the 5th Sangguniang Panlungsod was presided over by Acting City Vice Mayor Hon. Catherine Sarino-Evaristo held on March 13, 2023 at the Sangguniang Panlungsod (SP) Session Hall, 6th Flr. City of Bacoor Legislative and Disaster Resilience Building, Bacoor Government Center.

FINDINGS:

The RA 10644 also known as the "Go Negosyo Act" which aims to facilitate business operations in the country, supports the development of career opportunities as well as the establishment of Negosyo Centers.

The Negosyo Centers aim to promote ease of doing business and establish accessible services for Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs). This also aims to provide a conducive environment for the success of MSMEs.

The Local Government Unit of Bacoor is in favor of the renewal of the Memorandum of Agreement between the City Government of Bacoor and the DTI Cavite regarding measures to offer technical assistance and services to MSMEs operating in the City.

RECOMMENDATION:

After imparting the reasons necessary in support to the implementation of the Republic Act 10644, An act Promoting Job Generation and Inclusive Growth through the Development of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises, otherwise known as the "Go Negosyo Act", the Committee recommends passing a resolution. MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

This Memorandum of Agreement entered into this ____ day of ____, ___by and among.

The DEPARTMENT OF TRADE AND INDUSTRY - CAVITE, hereinafter referred to as DTI-CAVITE with office address located at 2nd floor, Government Center Building, Capitol Compound, Brgy. Luciano, Trece Martires City, Cavite, herein represented by its Provincial Director; REVELYN A. CORTEZ

-and-

The CITY OF BACOOR LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNIT, a government institution/office duly organized and existing under Philippine laws, with principal office address located at Brgy. Bayanan, Bacoor City, Cavite represented herein by its City Mayor, STRIKE B. REVILLA; and hereinafter referred to as "LGU CITY OF BACOOR";

-and-

The CAVITE SMALL AND MEDIUM ENTERPRISE DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL, non-government institution duly organized and existing under the laws of the Republic of the Philippines with principal office at Capitol Compound, Brgy. Luciano, Trece Martires City, Cavite, represented herein by its Chairperson, TERESITA LEABRES, and hereinafter referred to as the "PROGRAM PARTNER";

WITNESSETH-That:

WHEREAS, the approval of Republic Act 10644 An Act Promoting Job Generation and Inclusive Growth through the Development of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises otherwise known as the "Go Negosyo Act" aims to foster national development, promote inclusive growth, reduce poverty by encouraging the establishment of micro, small and medium enterprises (MSMEs) that facilitate local job creation, production and trade, and bring government services closer to small businesses through the establishment of Negosyo Centers in all the provinces, cities, and municipalities in the country.

WHEREAS, with the "Go Negosyo Act", the Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) with the support of LGU's and other government agencies expects to further boost its assistance to micro, small and medium enterprises (MSMEs) to grow and flourish and intensify the promotion of entrepreneurship in the country.

WHEREAS, the "Go Negosyo Act" mandates the creation of Negosyo Centers which would be directly supervised by the DTI in every province, city and municipality nationwide. These centers would ease the process of starting up and registering small businesses.

WHEREAS, the Negosyo Centers would facilitate development programs as well as provide support for business conceptualizations, management, team building, marketing, human resources and many other aspects of maintaining businesses.

WHEREAS, the PROGRAM PARTNERS can be a source of competent technical expertise to accelerate the implementation of the program.

WHEREAS, the **PROGRAM PARTNERS** are willing to tie up with the Negosyo Center to provide technical and expert advice to the MSME's.

WHEREAS, the **PROGRAM PARTNERS** have the technical and professional expertise in the following areas:

- Business Registration;
- Business and Marketing Consultancy;
- Business Development Services; and
- 4. Business Information;

WHEREAS, the abovementioned services are also identified as MSME needs particularly categorized into:

- Business Advisory;
- Business Registration Assistance; and
- Business Information and Advocacy.

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the foregoing premises and of the mutual covenants herein below set forth, the PARTIES bind themselves and agree as follows:

- a. Prepare and approve a Manual of Operations which shall include, among others, the organizational/functional/ structure of the center, procedure for accessing the services of the Center, business plan, communications plan to promote the use of the facility, and reportorial procedures.
- Establish a databank which shall be a source of information necessary for market linkaging, facilitation, project monitoring, research and policy studies and information campaigns;
- Propose and organize calendar of events for the center;
- d. Provide, when necessary, additional technical support for capacitating the "PROJECT PARTNERS", including prospective partners, to sustainably manage and operate the Center in accordance with the objectives of the "Negosyo Center";
- Monitor and evaluate the operations of the center, particularly in terms of number of MSMEs assisted;

The LGU BACOOR CITY shall:

- Business Registration. Accept and facilitate application for business permits for new and renewal;
- 2. Staff Complement.
 - Assign and subsidize at least 1-2 staff(s) to locate in the Negosyo
 Center who will facilitate the delivery of the services and
 coordinate related activities with DTI;
 - b. Assist MSMEs, through its City Livelihood Development Office (CLDO), to access fiscal and non-fiscal incentives and provide business/trade facilitation;
- 3. Daily Operations.
 - Assist in the generation of business information and industry data relevant to the needs of MSMEs;
 - b. Provide DTI with report/feedback on each engagement to document impact and effectiveness of the services as well as identify areas for improvement in the provision of assistance;
 - Exercise utmost discretion and confidentiality in their business dealings with MSMEs;
- 4. Promotions. Promote the services of the center;

The CAVITE SMALL AND MEDIUM ENTERPRISE DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL shall:

 Advocacy. Recommend sound business-friendly policies to concerned government agency/ies;
