Subject: A RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE IMPLEMENTATION OF INTERVENTIONS / PROGRAMS, PROJECTS, ACTIVITIES (PPAS) INDICATED IN THE CITY ACTION PLAN FOR THE YEAR 2024 TO 2026 FORMULATED BY THE CITY OF BACOOR – CITY ADVISORY COMMITTEE. (PCR 583-2024 dated 27 May 2024)

A key to promote shared ownership and encouragement to make a commitment towards ensuring that the program's goal is achieved through convergence and building partnership among various stakeholders such as the Local Government Unit (LGU), National Government Agencies, and Civil Society Organizations (CSO).

FINDINGS :

Developing a concrete plan within the City Action Plan to address identified gaps and uplift the well-being of Pantawid beneficiaries is crucial. This plan will cover complementation mechanisms from various participating partners and projects, aiming for inclusion in the City's Annual Investment Plan to secure funding for efficient implementation.

The City of Bacoor – City Advisory Committee formulated a City Action Plan during a workshop held on November 9-10, 2023, where outputs from department heads/representatives were collated during the Localized Kilos-Unlad Training. Subsequently, the City Action Plan was signed by the concerned departments as a commitment to enhance the well-being of 9,055 Pantawid beneficiaries, aiming for self-sufficiency.

RECOMMENDATIONS :

After a deliberate action of all the members of the Committee, and a thorough examination, the APPROVAL to pass a resolution adopting the implementation of interventions / programs, projects, activities (PPAS) indicated in the City Action Plan for the year 2024 – 2026 formulated by the City of Bacoor – City Advisory Committee, as recommended by Honorable Adrielito G. Gawaran, Chairman of Social Services Committee.

Subject: A RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE IMPLEMENTATION OF INTERVENTIONS / PROGRAMS, PROJECTS, ACTIVITIES (PPAS) INDICATED IN THE CITY ACTION PLAN FOR THE YEAR 2024 TO 2026 FORMULATED BY THE CITY OF BACOOR – CITY ADVISORY COMMITTEE. (PCR 583-2024 dated 27 May 2024)

During the 92nd Regular Session of the 5th Sangguniang Panlungsod of the city of Bacoor, dated May 27, 2024, Monday, the Presiding Officer, Honorable Rowena Bautista-Mendiola referred the subject matter to the Committee on Social Services.

The Committee on Social Services chaired by Honorable Councilor Adrielito Gawaran called for the committee meeting last June 03, 2024 (Monday) 1:00pm at the MSBR Conference Room, 4th Floor, Bacoor Legislative and Disaster Resilience Building, Bacoor Government Center. With the members, vice-chairman Honorable Councilor Simplicio Dominguez and member Honorable Councilor Michael Solis, followed by the resource guests Ms. Christy Lhean Castillejos and Ms. Jenny Rose Magno both from Department of Social Welfare and Development Office, Region IV-A and Attorney Salve Valenciano from City Legal Services Office.

Hon. Gawaran welcomed and introduced the members of the panel, he started by addressing the aforementioned topic. He reiterated that the City of Bacoor – City Advisory Committee had formulated a City Action Plan during a seminar-workshop held on November 9-10, 2023. Ms. Castillejos then discussed how the outputs from department heads and representatives were gathered during the Localized Kilos Unlad Training. This was followed by the signing of the City Action Plan by the relevant departments, demonstrating their commitment to improving the well-being of 9,055 Pantawid beneficiaries and helping them achieve self-sufficiency.

She also added, "Here in Bacoor City, we have the ongoing implementation of this program, but it is necessary to continue its administration." She explained that the Action Plan for 2024–2026 encompasses Economic Sufficiency, focusing on employable skills, employment, income and social security, and access to financial institutions. The plan also emphasizes Health, Housing, Education, Role Performance, and Family Awareness of relevant social issues, such as Children's Rights, Gender-Based Violence, and Disaster Risk Reduction and Management.





Formulating a concrete City Action Plan to address the identified gaps and help Pantawid beneficiaries uplift their well-being is vital. The City Action Plan will reflect the complementation mechanisms of existing interventions from various participating partners and projects, and will be developed for inclusion in the City's Annual Investment Plan for possible funding to ensure efficient implementation.

Finally, Atty. Salve Valenciano recalled that the action plan had been prepared several months ago and was approved and recognized by the entire committee. Honorable Simplicio Dominguez and Honorable Michael Solis also agreed to the devised action plan.

With that, the chairman of the committee, Hon. Adrielito G. Gawaran, declared the Approval of the suggested City Action Plan 2024-2026 in support of the Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino Program (4Ps).

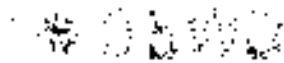
