Subject: FROM BARANGAY TALABA 3; BARANGAY TAX ORDINANCE NO. 18-002: AN ORDINANCE ENACTING THE BARANGAY REVENUE CODE OF BARANGAY TALABA 3 - PNOA-282-2024 dated February 19, 2024

Referred to the Joint Committee is the above-subject matter for appropriate action and recommendation.

Republic Act No. 7160 otherwise known as the "Local Government Code of 1991" empowered the Barangays to enact Ordinances pertaining to its revenue code.

In order that the fairness and equitableness of the fees and charges provided under the Barangay Revenue Code, the appropriate Committee of the Sangguniang Panlungsod conducts the necessary hearings to ensure that the requirements under law are properly complied with.

During the Joint Committee hearing, the Chairman of the Committee on Barangays Affairs, and as President of the Liga ng mga Barangay, proposed to formulate a uniform Barangay Revenue Code to be implemented by the forty-seven (47) Barangays in the City.

FINDINGS:

The Honorable Members of the Joint Committee finds the proposal of the Chairman on Barangay Affairs as appropriate and reasonable.

RECOMMENDATION:

In view of the foregoing, the Honorable Members of the Joint Committee hereby recommend *TO TEMPORARY ARCHIVE* the proposed Barangay Ordinance No. 18-002, Series of 2024 entitled "AN ORDINANCE ENACTING THE BARANGAY REVENUE CODE OF BARANGAY TALABA 3", as enacted.

Barangay Tax Ordinance No. 18-002

AN ORDINANCE ENACTING THE BARANGAY REVENUE CODE OF BARANGAY TALABA 3

Chapter 1
GENERAL PROVISIONS

ARTICLE A. TITTLE AND SCOPE

Section 1A. 01. Title. This ordinance shall be known as the "Revenue Code of Barangay Talaba 3, City of Bacoor, Caville."

Section 1A. 02. Scope. This Code shall govern the levy, assessment and collection of taxes, fees, charges and other imposition within the jurisdiction of this barangay.









ARTICLE B. DEFINITION AND RULES OF CONSTRUCTION

Section 18.01. Definitions. When used in this Code, the term:

Amusement- is pleasurable diversion and entertainment. It is synonymous to relaxation, avocation, pastime or fun.

Amusement Place - include theaters, cinemas, concert halls, circuses and other places of amusement where one seeks admission to entertain oneself by seeing or viewing the show or performance.

Business - means trade or commercial activity regularly engaged in as means of livelihood or with a view to profit.

Capital - signifies the actual state, whether in money or property owned by an individual or corporations, would be liable to its creditor, and which in case of insolvency passes on to the receiver.

Capital Investment - is the capital which a person employs in any undertaking, or which he contributes to the capital of partnership, corporation, or any juridical entity or association in a particular taxing jurisdiction.

Charges - refers to pecuniary liability, as rents or fees against persons or property.

Cockfighting - shall embrace and mean the commonly known game or term "cockfighting, derby, pintakasi, or tupada", or its equivalent terms in different Philippine localities.

Cockpits - include any place, compound, building or portion thereof, where cockfighting is being held whether or not money bets are held on the result of such cockfights.

Commercial Breeding of Fighting Cocks - for purpose of imposing barangay fees and charges, commercial breeding of fighting cocks shall mean an annual sale of more than five (5) fighting cocks of duty registered breeder.

Commercial and Barangay Business Enterprise - refers to any business entity, associations or cooperative registered under the provisions of the Republic Act Numbered Six Thousand Eight Hundred Ten (R. A. 6810), otherwise known as Magna Carta for Countryside and Barangay Business Enterprises (Kalakalan 20).

Fee - means a charge fixed by a law or ordinance for the regulation or inspection of a business or activity. It shall also include charges fixed by law or agency for the services of a public officer in the discharge of his official duties.

Gross Sales or Receipts - include the total amount of money or its equivalent representing the contract price, compensation or service fee, including the amount of charged or materials supplied with the services and deposits or advance payments actually or constructively received during the taxable quarter for the services performed or to be performed for another person including discount if determinable at the time of the sales, sale return, excise tas and value added tax [VAT].









Levy - means impositions or collection of assessment, tax, tribute, or fine.

Motor Vehicle - means any vehicles propelled by any power other than muscular power using the public road, but including road rollers, trolley cars, street-sweepers, sprinklers, lawn mowers, bulldozers, graders, forklift6s, amphibian truck and cranes it not used on public roads, vehicles which run on rails or track and tractors, truckers and tractor engines of all kinds used exclusively for agricultural purposes.

Operators - includes the owner, manager, administrator, or any other persons who operates or is responsible for the operation of a business establishment or undertaking.

Person - means every natural juridical being susceptible of rights and obligations or of the being subject of legal relations.

Places of Recreation - includes of amusement where one seeks admissions to entertain himself by seeing or viewing the show of performance or these where one amuses himself by direct participation.

Residents - refers to the natural person who have their habitual residence in this place where they exercise their civil rights legal residence and fulfill their civil obligations and to judicial persons for which the law or any other provision creating or recognizing them fixes their residence in a particular province, city or municipality where they have their legal residence or principal of business or where they conduct their principal business or occupation.

Retail - means a sale where the purchase buys the commodity for his own consumption, irrespective of the quantity of the commodity sold.

Retail Stores - are business establishment with fixed business address in the barangay where goods are kept for sale to purchasers for personal consumption.

Revenue - includes taxes, fees and charges that a State or its political subdivision collects and receives into the treasury for public purposes.

Services - means that duties, work, or functions performed or discharged by the government officer, or by any private person contracted by the government, as the case maybe

Tax - enforced constitution usually monitory in form, levied by the law-making body on person and property subject to its jurisdiction for the precise purpose of supporting governmental needs

Section 1B. 02. Words and Phrases Not Herein Expressly Defined. Words and phrases embodied in this Code not herein especially defined shall have the same definitions as forced in R.A.7160 and its implementing Rule and Regulations as well as in other applicable laws.









Section 1B. 03. Rules of Construction. In constructing in the provisions of this code the following rules of construction shall be observed unless inconsistent with the manifest intent of the provisions or when applied they would lead to absurd or highly improbable results.

- a. General Rule. All words and phrases shall be construed and understood according to the common approved usage of the language, but technical words and phrases and such other words in this Code which may have acquired a particular or appropriate meaning.
- b. Gender and Number. Every word in this Code importing the masculine gender shall extend to both male and female. Every word importing the singular number shall apply to several persons or things and every word importing the plural number shall extend to one person or thing.
- c. Computation of Time. The time within an act in to to be done as provided in this Code or any rule or regulation issued pursuant to the provision when expressed in this shall be completed by excluding the first day in which case, the same shall be excluded from the computation and the next business day shall be considered the last day.
- d. References. All references to Chapters, Articles, Section are to Chapters. Articles, Section in this Code unless otherwise specified.
- e. Conflicting Provision of Section. If the provisions of different chapters conflict with such other, the provision of each chapter shall prevail us to all specific and questions involved therein.
- f. Conflicting Provision of Sections. If the provisions of different sections in the same chapter conflict with each other, the provision of the section which is last in point of acquence shall prevail

Chapter II

BUSINESS TAX

ARTICLE A. TAX ON RETAIL STORES OR RETAILERS

Section 2A. 01. Imposition of Tax. There is hereby levied an annual tax on

"Stores or retailers with fixed business establishments" the following:









(a) For Barangay in a Municipality

On Stores or Retailers with Gross sales or receipt for the Preceding calendar year of Amount Tax Per Annum

P 50,000 or less One Percent (1%) of Such gross sales or receipts

Section 2A. 02. Time of Payment and Accrual of Tax. The tax imposed herein shall accrue on the first day o January of each year as regards subjects then liable therefore However, tax due may be paid on semestral and /or quarterly basis without the imposition of corresponding surcharge or interest on the unpaid amount.

Section 2A. 03. Collection of Taxes. The tax must be paid to and collected by, the Barangay Treasurer or his duly authorized representative before any business or trade activity herein specified can be lawfully begun or pursued and the tax shall be reckoned from the beginning of the calendar year. When the business is abandoned, the tax shall not be exacted for period longer than the current quarter and the business, or trade activity, abandoned, not refund of the corresponding to the unexpired quarter shall be made.

Section 2A. 04. Surcharge for Late Payment and Interest on Unpaid Taxes. Failure to pay the tax prescribed in this Article within the time required shall subject the taxpayer to a surcharge of twenty-five percent (25%) of the original amount of tax due.

Such surcharge shall be paid at the time and in the same manner as the original tax due.

In addition to the surcharge impose herein, there shall be imposed an interest of Two Percent (2%) per month from the date it is due until it is fully paid, provided, that in no case shall the total interest on the unpaid amount or a portion thereof exceed thirty-six (36) months.

The Sangguniang Barangay, however, through a resolution, may extend the time of payment of such tax without penalty or surcharge for justifiable reason or cause, provided that extensions shall not exceed six (6) months.

Where an extension of time for the payment of tax has been granted and the amount is not paid in full prior to the expiration of the extension, the interest aforementioned shall be collected on the unpaid amount from the date it become originally due until paid.









Section 2A. 05. Administrative Provisions: Rules and Regulation.

- a.) Requirement. Any person who shall establish, or operate any retail store in this Barangay shall first obtain a Mayor's Permit and pay the fee prescribed therefore and the business tax imposed under this Article.
- b.) Issuance and Posting of Official Receipt. The Barangay Treasurer shall issue an official receipt upon payment of the business tax imposed herein, Issuance of imposed in this barangay under existing municipal ordinances, rules and regulations.

Every person issues an official receipt for the conduct of a business or undertaking shall keep the same conspicuously posted in plain view at the place for the business proffice he shall keep the official in his person. The receipt shall be produced upon demand by the Punong Barangay: Barangay Treasurer or their duly authorized representative.

In acknowledge barangay taxes, fees and charge, it shall be the duty of the Baragay Treasurer or his deputy to indicate on the official receipt issued for the purpose, the number of the corresponding tax ordinance.

c.) Invoice or Receipt. All person subject to the taxes on business, shall for each sale or transfer of merchandise or goods, or for service rendered, valued at Five Pesos (P5.00) or more at any one time, prefer an issues sales or commercial invoices and receipt serially numbered in duplicate, showing among others their names of style if any, and business address. The original copy of its sales invoice or receipt shall be issued to the purchaser or costumer and the duplicate to be kept and preserved by the person subject to the said tax, in his place of business for a period of five years.

The receipt or invoice issued pursuant to the requirements of the Bureau of Internal Revenue for the determination of Internal Revenue Taxes shall be sufficient for the purpose of this Code.

d.) Sworn Statement of Gross Receipts or Sales. Operators of business subject to the taxes imposed therein shall submit a sworn statement of their gross sales or receipts as per-requisite for the Issuance of Mayor's Permit.

The Barangay Treasurer may examine the books, accounts and other pertinent records of any person subject to tax in order to verify the correctness the sworn statement of sales or receipts of concerned tax payer.

- e.) Issuance of Certification. The Barangay Treasurer may, upon presentation of Satisfactory proof that the original official receipt has been lost, stolen or destroyed issue a certification to the effect that the tax has been paid, indicating therein, the number of the official receipt issued, as provided for under Section 4A. 01 (6) Article A, Chapter IV of this Code.
- f.) Transfer of Business to Other Location. Any business for which the barangay tax has been paid by the person conducting it may be transferred and continued in any other place with the territorial limit of this barangay without paying any additional tax during the period for which the payment of the tax was made.









- g.) Death of License. When any individual paying a business tax dues, and the business in continued by a person interested in his estate, no additional payment shall be required for the residue of the term for which the tax was paid
- h.) Retirement of Business. Any person subject to the tax on business imposed herein shall, upon termination of the business, submit a sworn statement of the gross sales or receipts for the calendar year.

For purposes hereof, termination shall mean at the business operation are stepped completely. Any change in ownership, management and or name of the business shall not constitute termination its contemplated in this Article Unless stated otherwise, assumption of the same business under a new name in the barangay will notify the municipal insurer for record purposes in course of the renewal of the permit of to operate the business.

The Barangay Treasurer shall see to it that the payment of taxes of a business is not avoided by the termination or the retirement thereof for those purpose, procedural guidelines shall icily he observed.

1. The Barangay Treasurer shall verify every application for termination of business and inspect the address of the business on record to verify if it is really no longer operating if he finds that the business is simply placed under a new name, manager and of new owner, the Barangay Treasurer shall recommend to the Punong Barangay the issuance of the notice for the termination or retirement of said business. Thereafter the Punong Barangay shall submit a written report on this matter to the Mayor for the latter's information and appropriate actives.

Accordingly, the business continues to become liable for the payment of all taxes, fees and charges imposed thereon under existing tax ordinance barangay and:

2. In the case of the new owner to whom the business was transferred by sale or other form of conveyance said new owner shall be liable to pay the tax or free for the transfer of the business to him, as provided for under Section 14 01. Article A Chapter II of this Code.


If it is found out that the retirement or termination of the business legitimate, and the tax due therefrom he less than than the tax due for the current year has on the gross sales or receipts the difference in the amount of the tax he paid before the business is considered officially retired or terminated.

Provided that the Mayor's Permit served to a business of terminating its operation shall surrendered to the municipal treasurer who shall be forthwith cancel the same and record such cancellation in his books.

Section 24. 06. Newly-Started Business. In the case of newly-tarted business subject to this Article: the tax shall be fixed by the quarter. The usual tax for the quarter in which the business starts to operate stall he one fourth of one tenth of the one person 14 of 1/10 of 1 one-tenth of the capital investment or One Hundred Pesos (P100.00), whichever is higher.









In the succeeding quarter of quarters, in case where the business opens before the last quarter of the year, the tax shall be based on the gross sales of receipts for the preceding quartets at a rate of One Percent (1%) of such gross sales or receipts.

In the succeeding calendar year, regardless of when the bus tams, the tax shall be based on the gross sales and/or receipts for the preceding calendar year or any fraction thereof, a rate of One Percent (%) of such gross sales or receipts.

CHAPTER III

REGULATORY FEES

ARTICLE A. FEE ON THE TRANSFER OF RETAIL STORE BUSINESS

Section 3A. 1. Imposition of Fee. There is hereby levied a fee on the transfer of retail store subject to the preceding Article through sale, donation, hatter, or any other form or mode of conveyance at the rate of One Percent (%) of the total consideration or, in the absence of specific consideration the gross sales or recipes of the proceeding calendar year on file at the Barangay Treasurer's records, or the fixed amount of Two Hundred Fifty (P250.00) Pesos, whichever is lower

Section 3A. 02 Mules and Regulation

- The new owner to whom the business was transferred shall be able to pay the unpaid taxes, fees or charges due to the former owner, if there is any
- 2. The permit issued to the former owner shall be surrendered to the Municipal Treasurer, through the Office of the Mayor, who shall cancel the same in his records

Any person who has granted a permit to operate or conduct a retail store in this barangay who transferred his business to another shall inform in writing the Barangay Treasurer or the Punong Barangay, within ten (10) days of such transfer and submit a sworn statement of the gross sales or receipts of his business for the current year.
- The Punong Barangay shall issue other necessary rules and regulations for the
 effective implementation of this Article

Section 3A.03. Time of Payment. The fee imposed in this Article shall be paid to the Barangay Treasurer by the buyer, once, or her before the business or trade undertaking is operated, conducted or pursued.

Section 3A.04. Surcharges for Late Payment. Failure to pay the fee imposed in this Article on time shall subject the taxpayer to a surcharge of Twenty-Five Percent (25% of the original amount of fee due and such surcharge shall be paid at the time and in the same manner as

the fee due

Section 3A. 05. Penalty. Any violation of the provisions of this Article shall be punished by a fine of not less than Two Hundred Pesos (P200.00) but not exceeding One Thousand Pesos (P1,000.00), at the discretion of the court.









ARTICLE B. REGULATORY FEE ON COMMERCIAL BREEDING OF FIGHTING COCKS

Section 3B. 01. Imposition of Fee. There is hereby imposed an annual fee on the commercial breeding of fighting cocks of a duly licensed or registered breeder within thus barangay, as follow

Section 3B. 04. Penalty. Any violation of the provisions of this Article shall be punished by a fine of not less than Two Hundred Pesos (P200.00) but not exceeding One Thousand Pesos (P),000.00) at the discretion of the Court.

Section 3C. 05. Penalty. Any violation of the provision of this Article shall be punished by a fine of not less than Two Hundred Pesos (P200.00) but not exciding One Thousand Pesos (P1,000.00), at the discretion of the Court





Section 6C. 04. Penalty. Violation of the provisions of this Article shall be punished by a fine of not less than Two Hundred Pesos (P200 4th but not more than One Thousand Pesos (P1,000,001, at the discretion of the Court.

CHAPTER VII

GENERAL ADMINISTRATIVE AND PENAL PROVISIONS ARTICLE A. COLLECTION AND ACCOUNTING OF BARANGAY REVENUES

Section 7A. 01. Collection. The collection of Barangay taxes, fees, charges, surcharges, interest and penalties accruing to this barangay shall be the responsibility of the Barangay Treasurer or his deputies and in no case shall be delegated to any person

Unless otherwise specially provided in this Code, or under existing laws or decrees, the Barangay Treasurer is authorized, subject to the approval of the Punong Barangay, to promulgate rules and regulations for the proper and efficient administration and collection of taxes, fees and charges herein imposed

Section 7A. 02. Issuance of Receipts. It shall be the duty of the Barangay Treasurer or his authorized representative to issue the necessary receipt to the person paying the tax, fee or charge, indicating therein the date, amount, name of the person paying and the account for which it is paid.

In acknowledging payment of local taxes, fees and charges, it shall be the duty of the Barangay Treasurer or is deputies to indicate on the official receipt issued for the purpose, the number of the corresponding local tax ordinance.

ARTICLE B. GENERAL PENAL PROVISIONS

Section 7B. 01. Penalty. Any violation of the provisions of the Code not herein otherwise covered by specific penalty, or of the rules and regulations promulgated under a authority of this Code, shall be punished by a fine of not less than Two Hundred Pesos (P200,00) but not more than One Thousand Pesos (P1,000 00), at the discretion of the Court

Payment of a fine as herein provided shall not relieve the offender from the payment of the delinquent tax, fee or charge imposed under this Code

If the violation is committed by a juridical entity, the President, general manager or any person entrusted with the administration thereof at the time of the commission of the violation shall be held responsible or liable thereof









Section 7B. 02. Compromise Settlement Fee. The Punong Barangay is hereby authorized to enter into an "extra juridical" or out-of-court settlement of any offense involving violations of any provisions of this Code subject, however, to the following conditions, viz [Reference Handbook on Barangay Government Finance, LGA, DILG, 1997]

- 1. That the offense does not involve fraud,
- 2. That the offender shall pay a "compromise settlement fee" of not less than Two Hundred Pesos (P200.00) but not more than One Thousand Pesos (P1.000.00) as may agreed upon by both parties.
- That the payment of the "compromise settlement fee" above mentioned shall not relieve the offender from the payment of the corresponding tax, fee or charge due from him as provided under this Code, if he is liable therefore.

Chapter VIII FINAL PROVISIONS

ARTICLE A. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

Section 8A. 01. Separability Clause. If any reason, any provision, section or part of this Code is declared not valid by a Court of competent jurisdiction of suspended or revoked by Sangguniang Pambayan, such judgment shall not affect or impair the remaining provisions, sections, or parts thereof which shall remain or continue to be in full force and effect

Section 8A. 02. Applicability Clause. All other matters relating to the impositions in this Code shall be governed by pertinent provision of existing laws and other ordinances

Section 8A. 03. Repealing Clause. All barangay ordinances, rules and regulations, or parts thereof, in conflict with, or inconsistent with any provisions of this Code, are hereby repealed, amended or modified accordingly

Section 8A. 04. Effectivity. This Ordinance shall take effect in accordance with the provisions of Republic Act 10361 and its Implementing Rules and Regulations and DILG Memorandum Circular No. 2013-61.

This Ordinance shall take effect only when the Barangay Secretary has caused the posting of this Ordinance in the Bulletin Board at the entrance of the Barangay Hall, in at least two (2) conspicuous places in the area concerned, not later than five (5) days after approval thereof.
