Subject: AN ORDINANCE MANDATING THE SEGREGATION AT SOURCE OF ALL HOUSEHOLD, INSTITUTIONAL, AGRICULTURAL AND COMMERCIAL WASTE INTO WET BIODEGRADABLE AND DRY OR NON-BIODEGRADABLE WASTE, REQUIRING THE PROPER DISPOSAL OF SOLID WASTES, AND PROVIDING PENALTIES HEREOF. (PNOA 319-2024, PNOA 334-2024, PNOA 350-2024, PNOA 379-2024, dated March 12, 2024; PNOA 385-2024 dated March 18, 2024 and PNOA 406-2024 dated March 25, 2024).

Members of the Sangguniang Panglunsod met in order to call the 84th Regular Session, at 10:00 AM, on 25 March, 2024. Presiding Officer Vice Mayor Hon. Rowena Bautista-Mendiola, referred the subject matter to Chairperson of Environment and Natural Resources, Hon. Levy M. Tela.

FINDINGS:

Under of R.A. Act No. 9003, (also known as Ecological Solid Waste Management Act of 2000) Section 10 Role of LGUs in Solid Waste Management that "Pursuant to the relevant provisions of R.A. No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code, the LGUs shall be primarily responsible for the implementation and enforcement of the provisions of this Act within their respective jurisdictions. Pursuant to the relevant provisions of R.A. No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code, the LGUs shall be primarily responsible for the implementation and enforcement of the provisions of this Act within their respective jurisdictions. Segregation and collection of solid waste shall be conducted at the barangay level specifically for biodegradable, compostable and reusable wastes: Provided, That the collection of non-recyclable materials and special wastes shall be the responsibility of the municipality or city".

The Local Government Units (LGUs) are responsible for assessing the various roles that the public and private sectors can play in providing collection services. They must also determine the type of collection system, or combination of systems, that best suits their needs. The sources of waste, which include household, institutional, commercial, and agricultural sources, must be the primary focus of waste segregation.

Subject: AN ORDINANCE MANDATING THE SEGREGATION AT SOURCE OF ALL HOUSEHOLD, INSTITUTIONAL, AGRICULTURAL AND COMMERCIAL WASTE INTO WET BIODEGRADABLE AND DRY OR NON-BIODEGRADABLE WASTE, REQUIRING THE PROPER DISPOSAL OF SOLID WASTES, AND PROVIDING PENALTIES HEREOF. (PNOA 319-2024, PNOA 334-2024, PNOA 350-2024, PNOA 379-2024, dated March 12, 2024; PNOA 385-2024 dated March 18, 2024 and PNOA 406-2024 dated March 25, 2024).

The 84th Regular Session started at 10:00 A.M. on 25 March, 2024. The presiding officer Vice Mayor Hon. Rowena Bautista- Mendiola referred the above subject matter to Chairperson of Environment and Natural Resources, Hon. Levy M. Tela.

According to Hon. Tela the growing papulation of the barangay now producing more solid waste than ever before necessitating the immediate and mandatory segregation of waste from its source so as to promote public health and the general welfare. Hon. Telas informed the body that Sec. 21 of R.A. 9003 provides that "The LGUs shall evaluate alternative roles for the public and private sectors in providing collection services, type of collection system, or combination of systems, that best meet their needs: Provided, that segregation of wastes shall primarily be conducted at the source, to include household, institutional, industrial, commercial and agricultural sources.

Hon. Tela noticed and must be carried out that the aforementioned subject matter needs to be implemented for cleanliness and awareness of the barangays.

Section 10 of Republic Activo, 9003(Also known as the Ecological Solid Waste Management Activol 2000) provides that "the LGU's shall be primarily responsible for the implementation and enforcement of the provisions of this Activithin their respective jurisdictions. Segregation and collection of solid wastes shall be conducted in the barangay level specifically for biodegradable, compostable and revisible wastes, provided that the collection of non-recyclable materials and special wastes shall be the responsibility of the only".

Section 3 Title: - This ordinance shall also be known as "Garbage segregation ordinance of Barangay Simunah".

Section 2 Mandatory Segregation of solid wastes and proper disposal and collection of garbage.

This borongay hereby requires the mandatory segregation at the source of all household, institutional, agricultural and commercial wastes into wet or biodegradable garbage and dry or non-biodegradable garbage as well as the proper disposal and collection of the same.

Section 3. Definition of Terms. - The following terms as used in this ordinance shall mean.

- a.) Agricultural wastes shall refer to waste generated from planting or barvesting of crops, trumming
 of plants and waste of run off materials from fields,
- b.) Biodegradable waste or wet wastes—shall refer to post consumer that would unitergo decomposition and/or can be transformed into some other form of row material with beneficial use south as soil fertilizer.
- C.) Non-biodegradable or dry wastes—shall refer to post consumer materials that do not decompose or those that do not transforminto some form of raw materials that is beneficial to the environment.
- d.) Commercial wastes—shall refer to solid waste, whether wet or dry, generated by commercial establishments such as restaurants, stores, shops, market, etc.
- e.) Institutional wastes—shall refer to solid waste. Whether wet or dry emanating from educational, medical, or religious institution;
- Household wastes shall refer to solid waste, whether wet or dry, emanating from private residences,
- g.) Solid waste—shall refer to all discarded household, agricultural, institutional and commercial waste, street sweepings, construction debris and other non-textion hazardous waste.
- b.) Collection—shall refer to the act of removing solid waste from the source or from a communal storage point,
- i.) Segregation shall refer to a solid waste management practice of separating different materials found in solid waste in order to promote recycling and recuse of resources and to reduce the volume of waste for collection and disposal;
- j.) Segregation at source shall refer to a solid waste management practice of separating volid waste at the origin.

Section 4.) Segregation at source - All Household, Agricultural, Institutional and Commercial woste shall be put in separate receptacles or containers properly marked as either wet or biodegradable and dry or non-biodegradable waste. Such receptacles or containers shall be scaled and protected from interest.

Section 5.) — **Garbage Collection and Disposal** — Garbage intended for collection and disposal by the barangay eco-workers shall follow the following conditions

a.) There shall be scheduled collection of trash and no person shall bring such trash outside his/her establishment or residence on the day designated for the collections.

- b.) Wastes must be separated into biodegradable and non-biodegradable.
- Trees, shrubs and grass cuttings should not be mixed with other kind of wastes and must be placed inside a separate container and should follow the proper disposal process.
- it) All collectors and other personnel directly dealing with collection of solid waste shall be equipped with personal protective equipment to protect them from the hazards of bandling solid waste.
- e.) Training shall be given to the collectors and personnel to ensure that the solid wastes are
- f.) handled properly in accordance with gordelines of 8.A. 9003.
- g.) Collection of solid waste shall be done in a manner that prevents damage to the container and spillage or scattering of solid waste within the collection vicinity.

Section 6.] Power of Gorbage Collectors, Sanitary Inspectors and Eco-Workers to Inspect Waste, to Refuse Collection and to Issue Violation Ticket — Garbage collectors, sanitary inspectors, and eco-workers who have undergone training with environmental policing shall be empowered to inspect all waste containers to determine if its content is properly segregated, to refuse to collect unsegregated waste and to issue violation tickets to any person or establishment who violates this ordinance.

Section 7.) Administrative Liability. Garbage collectors, sanitary inspectors, eco-workers and other employees of this barangay who allows the collection or disposal of unsegregated garbage, or who coerces a garbage collector, sanitary inspector or eco-worker to collect or dispose unsegregated garbage shall be held administratively.

Section 8.) Penalty for Non-Segregation of Solid Wastes - Unsegregated solid wastes generated by household, agricultural, institutional and commercial sources shall not be collected. For failing to rause the segregation of their solid wastes the head of the family of every household and the managers or supervisors of agricultural, institutional and commercial establishments with unsegregated solid wastes shall also be personally fined One Hundred Pesos (PhP 100.00) for each instance that they or their establishment violated this ordinance.

in addition, the owners of agricultural, institutional, commercial establishments that violate this ordinance shall be penalized as follows:

First offense Second offense

Three Hundred Pesos Five Hundred Pesos (PhP 300.00) (PhP 500.00)

Third offense

One Thousand Pesos

{PhP 1000 00}

Section 9.) Dumping and Throwing of Wastes; Penalty - Dumping or throwing or placing of waste in areas not designated by the Barangay Ecological and Solid Waste Committee for such purpose is strictly prohibited. Persons who shall violate this provision shall be fined One Phousand Pesos (PhP1000.00).

Section 10.) Establishment of Material Recovery Facility— There shall be a Material Recovery Facility for final sorting, segregation, composting and recycling of materials from solid wastes collected. The residual wastes shall be collected by the City Government for final disposal.

Section 11.) COMPOSTING — Composting of agricultural wastes and other compostable materials including but not limited to garden wastes, shall be encouraged.

Section 12.] Separability Clause - It, for any reason or reasons, any part of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be held unconstitutional or invalid, other parts hereof which are not affected thereby shall continue to be in full force and effect.

Section 13.) Repealing Clouse - All ordinances, resolutions, Circulars, Memorandoms or Roles and regulations inconsistent with the provision of this Code are hereby repealed and modified accordingly.
