Subject: ***AN ORDINANCE MANDATING THE SEGREGATION AT SOURCE OF ALL HOUSEHOLD, INSTITUTIONAL, AGRICULTURAL AND COMMERCIAL WASTE INTO WET BIODEGRADABLE AND DRY OR NON-BIODEGRADABLE WASTE, REQUIRING THE PROPER DISPOSAL OF SOLID WASTES, AND PROVIDING PENALTIES HEREOF. (PNOA 319-2024, PNOA 334-2024, PNOA 350-2024, PNOA 379-2024, dated March 12, 2024; PNOA 385-2024 dated March 18, 2024 and PNOA 406-2024 dated March 25, 2024).***

Members of the Sangguniang Panglungsod met in order to call the 84th Regular Session, at 10:00 AM, on 25 March, 2024. Presiding Officer Vice Mayor Hon. Rowena Bautista-Mendiola, referred the subject matter to Chairperson of Environment and Natural Resources, Hon. Levy M. Tela.

FINDINGS:

Under of R.A. Act No. 9003, (also known as Ecological Solid Waste Management Act of 2000) Section 10 Role of LGUs in Solid Waste Management that "Pursuant to the relevant provisions of R.A. No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code, the LGUs shall be primarily responsible for the implementation and enforcement of the provisions of this Act within their respective jurisdictions. Pursuant to the relevant provisions of R.A. No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code, the LGUs shall be primarily responsible for the implementation and enforcement of the provisions of this Act within their respective jurisdictions. Segregation and collection of solid waste shall be conducted at the barangay level specifically for biodegradable, compostable and reusable wastes: Provided, That the collection of non-recyclable materials and special wastes shall be the responsibility of the municipality or city".

The Local Government Units (LGUs) are responsible for assessing the various roles that the public and private sectors can play in providing collection services. They must also determine the type of collection system, or combination of systems, that best suits their needs. The sources of waste, which include household, institutional, commercial, and agricultural sources, must be the primary focus of waste segregation.

Subject: ***AN ORDINANCE MANDATING THE SEGREGATION AT SOURCE OF ALL HOUSEHOLD, INSTITUTIONAL, AGRICULTURAL AND COMMERCIAL WASTE INTO WET BIODEGRADABLE AND DRY OR NON-BIODEGRADABLE WASTE, REQUIRING THE PROPER DISPOSAL OF SOLID WASTES, AND PROVIDING PENALTIES HEREOF. (PNOA 319-2024, PNOA 334-2024, PNOA 350-2024, PNOA 379-2024, dated March 12, 2024; PNOA 385-2024 dated March 18, 2024 and PNOA 406-2024 dated March 25, 2024).***

The 84th Regular Session started at 10:00 A.M. on 25 March, 2024. The presiding officer Vice Mayor Hon. Rowena Bautista- Mendiola referred the above subject matter to Chairperson of Environment and Natural Resources, Hon. Levy M. Tela.

According to Hon. Tela the growing population of the barangay now producing more solid waste than ever before necessitating the immediate and mandatory segregation of waste from its source so as to promote public health and the general welfare. Hon. Tela informed the body that Sec. 21 of R.A. 9003 provides that "The LGUs shall evaluate alternative roles for the public and private sectors in providing collection services, type of collection system, or combination of systems, that best meet their needs: Provided, that segregation of wastes shall primarily be conducted at the source, to include household, institutional, industrial, commercial and agricultural sources.

Hon. Tela noticed and must be carried out that the aforementioned subject matter needs to be implemented for cleanliness and awareness of the barangays.

Whereas, Section 10 of Republic Act No. 9003 (Also known as the Ecological Solid Waste Management Act of 2000) provides that "The LGUs shall be primarily responsible for the implementation and enforcement of the provisions of this Act within their respective jurisdictions. Segregation and collection of solid wastes shall be conducted at the barangay level specifically for biodegradable, compostable and reusable wastes, provided that the collection of non-recyclable materials and special wastes shall be responsibility of the city"

Whereas, Section 21 of R.A. 9003 further provides that "LGUs shall evaluate alternative rules for the public and private sectors in providing collection services, type of collection system, or combination of systems, that best meet their needs; Provided that the segregation of wastes shall be primarily conducted at source, to include household, institutional, agricultural and commercial sources;

Now Therefore, upon motion of Kagawad Judielyn C. Carabin, unanimously approved by all the Sangguniang Barangay members present, **BE IT ORDAINED AS IT HEREBY ORDAINED** by the Sangguniang Barangay in regular session assembled that:

Section 1. **Title.** This ordinance shall also be known as "Garbage segregation ordinance of Kaingin Digmaan"

Section 2. **Mandatory Segregation of solid wastes and proper disposal and collection of garbage.** This barangay hereby requires the mandatory segregation at the source of all household, institutional, agricultural and commercial wastes into wet and biodegradable garbage and dry or non biodegradable garbage as well as the proper disposal and collection of the same.

Section 3. **Definition of Terms.** The following terms as used in this ordinance shall mean:

- a.) **Agricultural wastes** – shall refer to waste generated from planting or harvesting of crops, trimming of plants and waste of run-off materials from fields;
- b.) **Biodegradable waste or wet wastes** – shall refer to post consumer that would undergo decomposition and/or can be transformed into some other form of raw material with beneficial use such as soil fertilizer;
- c.) **Non-biodegradable or dry wastes** – shall refer to post consumer materials that do not decompose or those that do not transform into some form of raw material with beneficial to the environment.
- d.) **Commercial wastes** – shall refer to solid waste, whether wet or dry, generated by commercial establishments such as restaurants, stores, shops, market, etc.
- e.) **Institutional wastes** – shall refer to solid waste, whether wet or dry emanating from educational, medical, or religious institution;
- f.) **Household wastes** – shall refer to solid waste, whether wet or dry, emanating from private residences;
- g.) **Solid wastes** – shall refer to all discarded household, agricultural, institutional and commercial waste, street sweepings, construction debris and other non-toxic/non hazardous waste.
- h.) **Collection** – shall refer to the act of removing solid waste from the source or from a communal storage point;
- i.) **Segregation** – shall refer to a solid waste management practice of separating different materials found in solid waste in order to promote recycling and re-use of resources and to reduce the volume of waste for collection and disposal.
- j.) **Segregation at source** – shall refer to a solid waste management practice of separating solid waste at the origin.

Section 4. **Segregation at source** – All household, Agricultural, Institutional and Commercial waste shall be put in separate receptacles or containers properly marked as either wet or biodegradable and dry or non biodegradable waste. Such receptacles or containers shall be sealed and protected from insects.

Section 5. **Garbage Collection and Disposal** – Garbage intended for collection and disposal by the barangay eco workers shall follow the following conditions.

- a. There shall be scheduled collection of trash and no person shall bring such trash outside his/her establishment or residence on the day designated for the collections.
- b. Wastes must be separated into biodegradable and non biodegradable.
- c. Trees, shrubs and grass cuttings should not be mixed with other kind of wastes and must be placed inside a separate container and should follow the proper disposal process.



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- d. All collectors and other personnel directly dealing with collection of solid waste shall be equipped with personal protective equipment to protect them from the hazards of handling solid waste.
- e. Training shall be given to the collectors and personnel to ensure that the solid waste are handled properly in accordance with guidelines of R.A. 9003.
- f. Collection of solid waste shall be done in a manner that prevents damage to the containers and spillage or scattering of solid waste within the collection vicinity.

Section 6. Power of Garbage Collectors, Sanitary Inspectors and Eco-Workers to Inspect Waste, to Refuse Collection and to Issue Violation Ticket – Garbage collectors, sanitary inspectors, and eco-workers who have undergone training with environmental policing shall be empowered to inspect all waste containers to determine if its content is properly segregated, to refuse to collect unsegregated waste and to issue violation tickets to any person or establishment who violated this ordinance.

Section 7. Administrative Liability – Garbage collectors, sanitary inspectors, eco-workers and other employees of this barangay who allows the collection or disposal of unsegregated garbage, or who coerces a garbage collector, sanitary inspector or eco-worker to collect or dispose unsegregated garbage shall be held administratively.

Section 8. Penalty for Non-Segregation of Solid Wastes – Unsegregated solid wastes generated by households, agricultural, institutional and commercial sources shall not be collected. For failing to cause the segregation of their solid wastes the head of the family of every household and the unsegregated solid wastes shall also be personally fined Three Hundred Pesos (PHP 300.00) for each instance that they or their establishment violated this ordinance.

In addition, the owners of agricultural, institutional, commercial establishments that violate this ordinance shall be penalized as follows:

First Offense	Three Hundred Pesos	(PHP 300.00)
Second Offense	Five Hundred Pesos	(PHP 500.00)
Third Offense	One Thousand Pesos	(PHP 1000.00)

Section 9. Dumping and Throwing of Wastes; Penalty – Dumping or throwing or placing of waste in areas not designated by the Barangay Ecological and Solid Waste Committee for such purpose is strictly prohibited. Persons who shall violate this provision shall be fined Five Hundred Pesos (PHP 500.00)

Section 10. Establishment of Material Recovery Facility – There shall be a Material Recovery Facility for final sorting, segregation, composting and recycling of materials from solid wastes collected. The residual wastes shall be collected by the City Government for final disposal.

Section 11. Composting – Composting of agricultural wastes and other compostable materials including but not limited to garden wastes, shall be encouraged.

Section 12. Separability Clause – If, for any reason or reasons, any part of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be held unconstitutional or invalid, other parts thereof which are not affected thereby shall continue to be in full force and effect.

Section 13. Repealing Clause – All ordinances, resolutions, Circulars, Memorandums or Rules and regulations inconsistent with the provision of this Code are hereby repealed and modified accordingly.
