A committee hearing was convened on August 7, 2025, to address the letter from the Office of the Sangguniang Panlalawigan, dated May 19, 2025. The said letter referring to the City Ordinance No. 408-2024, AN Ordinance amending the City Ordinance No. 176-2021 by Banning the Use, Sale, Manufacture and Distribution of all types of Boga, Bamboo, Cannon, Polyvinyl Chloride (PVC) Cannons within the City of Bacoor and Providing Penalties for Violations Thereof.

FINDINGS:

Upon referring to the City Legal Services of the said letter from the Office of the Sangguniang Panlalawigan, Hon. Galvez requested for a draft City Ordinance of the said subject matter, which includes the amendments as recommended by the letter from Office of the Sangguniang Panlalawigan.

At the committee hearing, Atty. Valenciano, discussed the amendment recommended by the Office of the Sangguniang Panlalawigan, amendment is specifically to be made for the Section 6.4 of the City Ordinance No. 176-2021. The original version of the said section 6.4 is read as:





6.4 Community Service in Lieu of Imprisonment. - Due to the health risks posed by the COVID - 19 which aggravated when inmates are incarcerated in overcrowded detention centers, persons found convicted by a court of law for violating this Ordinance shall not be imprisoned but shall be required to render community service pursuant to the provisions of Republic Act No. 11362 (the "Community Service Act") and its implementing guidelines while the City of Bacoor is under quarantine or while its detention centers are overcrowded"

Now, as per the Office of the Sangguniang Panlalawigan recommendation, for an amendment for the said Section 6.4 should read as;

6.4 Community Service in Lieu of Imprisonment. - Person found guilty or convicted by the court of law for violating any of the provisions of this ordinance may be allowed to render community service pursuant to the provisions of Republic Act No. 11362 (the Community Service Act) and its Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR). When there exists a widespread public health concern where incarceration or imprisonment of the offender, or the further congestion of city jails, may compromise or place public health to great risks.

City Legal Services, with the recommendation from the Atty. Valenciano will do the draft City Ordinance with the amendments and shall forward the same for the approval.

RECOMMENDATION:

In view of the foregoing, the Committee respectfully recommends that the proposed ordinance mentioned above be **APPROVED**.








WHEREAS, on 6 September 2021, the 4th Sangguniang
Panlungsod approved City Ordinance No. 176-2021 (otherwise
known as the "Anti-Firecracker Ordinance of the City of
Bacoor") which banned the use, sale, manufacture, and
distribution of all types of firecrackers and fireworks within the
City of Bacoor subject to certain exceptions.

WHEREAS, on 24 October 2024, the Bacoor City Police
requested the Sangguniang Panlungsod through informal
channels to pass an ordinance banning the use of "boga" or
homemade cannons made of bamboo, polyvinyl chloride
(PVC), or other materials because of the inherent risks involved
during its use that may result in serious bodily injury or even
death.

WHEREAS, Section 16 of Republic Act No. 7160 (the
"Local Government Code of 1991" empowered local
governments such as the City of Bacoor to exercise the powers
expressly granted, those necessarily implied therefrom, as well
as powers necessary, appropriate, or incidental for its efficient
and effective governance, and those which are essential to
the promotion of the general welfare. Within their respective
territorial jurisdictions, local government units shall ensure and
support, among other things, the preservation and enrichment
of culture, promote health and safety, enhance the right of the
people to a balanced ecology, encourage and support the
development of appropriate and self-reliant scientific and
technological capabilities, improve public morals, enhance

economic prosperity and social justice, promote full employment among their residents, maintain peace and order, and preserve the comfort and convenience of their inhabitants.

WHEREAS, the Sanggunian deliberated on the request of the Bacoor City Police in consultation with the City Health Office and concluded that banning the use of all types of homemade cannons is in keeping with the mandate of the city government to promote the general welfare and maintain the health and safety of its constituents.

NOW, THEREFORE, upon motion of Councilor Alejandro F. Gutierrez unanimously approved by all the councilors present, **BE IT ORDAINED AS IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED** by the 5th Sangguniang Panlungsod in regular online session assembled that:

Section 1. Title.—This Ordinance shall also be known as the "**Revised Anti-Firecracker Ordinance of the City of Bacoor**".

Section 2. Amendment of Section 2 of City Ordinance No. 176-2021. Section 2 of City Ordinance No. 176-2021 shall be amended and shall read as follows:

"Section 2. Prohibition on the Use, Sale, Manufacture, Possession and Distribution of All Types of Firecrackers, Boga, Bamboo Cannons, PVC Cannons, and Other Types of Explosive Devices. — The City of Bacoor hereby prohibits the use, sale, manufacture, storage and distribution of all types of firecrackers, boga, bamboo cannons, polyvinyl chloride cannons, and other types of explosive devices that produces a booming sound and has the potential to cause bodily harm or death within its territorial jurisdiction."

Section 3. Amendment of Section 3 (**Definition of Terms/Rule of Construction**) of City Ordinance No. 176-2021. Section 3 of City Ordinance No. 176-2021 shall be amended and shall read as follows:

"Section 3. Definition of Terms/Rule of Construction - The following terms, as used in this ordinance, shall mean:

a) Firecrackers- are explosive pyrotechnic devices primarily designed to produce a large amount of noise, colorful displays, or cracking sounds such as rebentador, plapla, bawang, watusi, fountain, sinturon ni hudas, ahas, whistle bomb, milenyo, goodbye world, and trumpilyo;

b) Fireworks are a class of explosive pyrotechnic devices used for aesthetic, cultural, and religious purposes;

(c) Distribution is the circulation, supply, or dispersal of any type of firecracker regardless of whether it was done for profit;

(d) Manufacture is the making, production, or fabrication of any type of firecracker regardless of the point of sale or distribution of the same;

(e) Sale is the trading, dealing, or vending of any type of firecracker within the City of Bacoor regardless of quantity;

(f) Use refers to utilization of any type of firecracker regardless of whether or not the said product actually exploded while being used or turned out to be defective;

(g) Storage is the possession and/or safekeeping of firecrackers in any quantity; and

(h) Boga pertains to any device made from either bamboo, polyvinyl chloride (PVC), steel or other materials that produces a booming sound with the capability of causing bodily harm or even death while in use.

Section 4. Amendment of Section 3 (**Regulated Fireworks Display**) of City Ordinance No. 176-2021. The following provisions of Section 3 on Regulated Fireworks Display of the City Ordinance No. 176-2021 are hereby re-numbered and shall henceforth read as follows:

" **Section 4. Regulated Fireworks Display.** - Fireworks displays during the celebration of special public occasions such as fiestas, Chinese New Year, Christmas, and New Year's Eve shall be allowed provided that such celebrations shall only be performed by the city government at a venue chosen by it. The organizing committees of town fiestas or religious celebrations may also hold fireworks displays provided that they would first obtain a Mayor's Permit at least seven (7) days prior to the date of the said celebration. Public safety shall be the paramount concern in the holding of such fireworks displays. Only juridical entities duly licensed by the national government or by one of its agencies may take charge of such fireworks displays. Firework displays during the celebration of

weddings, birthdays, graduations, or any similar personal milestones or achievements shall not be allowed."

Section 5. Re-numbering of Section 4 of City Ordinance No. 176-2021. Section 4 of the City Ordinance No. 176-2021 is hereby amended and re-numbered as Section 5 and shall henceforth read as follows:

"Section 5. Public Information Campaign. The City Information and Community Relations Department (CICRD) shall launch an intensive public information campaign regarding the implementation of this Ordinance".

Section 6. Re-numbering of Section 5, Subsections 5.1 to 5.4 of City Ordinance No. 176-2021. Section 5, Subsections 5.1 to 5.4 of the City Ordinance No. 176-2021 are hereby re-numbered as Section 6, Subsections 6.1 to 6.4 and shall henceforth read as follows:

"Section 6. Penalties. – The following penalties shall be imposed against any person who violates this Ordinance:

6.1. **For using and/or possessing firecrackers:** Fine of Php3,000.00 and the immediate destruction of the firecrackers in the possession of the offender at the time of his arrest. The destruction of the said firecrackers shall be done by immersing the said firecrackers in water. **Provided:** that none of the firecrackers found in the possession of the offender shall be confiscated or stored because of serious safety risks. **Provided further:** that the said firecrackers shall be weighed and photographed for evidentiary purposes before they are destroyed.

If the offender is a minor, the parents or guardians of the said offender shall be held liable to pay the said fine and shall be held liable for violating the pertinent provisions of Republic Act No. 7610 (also known as the "Child Abuse Act").

In case a minor residing within the City of Bacoor is injured or dies for using a firecracker within city limits, the parents or guardians of the said offender shall be held liable to pay the said fine and shall be held liable for violating the pertinent provisions of Republic Act No. 7610 (also known as the "Child Abuse Act").

6.2. **For selling and distributing firecrackers:** Fine of Php5,000.00 and immediate destruction of the firecrackers

in the possession of the offender at the time of his arrest. The destruction of the said firecrackers shall be done by immersing the said firecrackers in water. **Provided:** that none of the firecrackers found in the possession of the offender shall be confiscated or stored because of serious safety risks. **Provided further:** that the said firecrackers shall be weighed and photographed for evidentiary purposes before they are destroyed.

In addition, the owners of industrial, institutional, commercial, or agricultural establishments that violate this Ordinance shall be penalized by requiring them to pay a fine of Php5,000.00 and the business permit of the said establishment shall be cancelled.

If the offender is a minor, the parents or guardians of the said offender shall be held liable to pay the said fine and shall be held liable for violating the pertinent provisions of Republic Act No. 7610 (also known as the "Child Abuse Act").

In case minors are found to be working at the said establishments at the time that enforcers entered it while implementing this Ordinance, the owners of the said establishments as well as the parents of the said minors shall be held accountable for violation of the pertinent provisions of RA 7610 and of this Ordinance.

If the violation is committed by a business establishment owned or operated by a corporation or partnership, the President, General Manager, or any other person, acting in behalf of either the President or General Manager shall be held liable. If the violation is committed by a business establishment owned or operated by a sole proprietorship, the owner or the person acting in his behalf shall be held responsible for the said offense.

6.3. **For manufacturing firecrackers:** Fine of Php5,000.00 and immediate destruction of the firecrackers found in the premises of the plant or factory at the time of apprehension. The destruction of the said firecrackers shall be done by immersing the said firecrackers in water, **Provided:** that none of the firecrackers found in the possession of the offender shall be confiscated or stored because of serious safety risks. **Provided further:** that the said firecrackers shall be weighed and photographed for evidentiary purposes before they are destroyed.

In addition, the owners of industrial, institutional, commercial, or agricultural establishments that violate this Ordinance shall be penalized by requiring them to pay a fine

of Php5,000.00 and the business permit of the said establishment shall be cancelled.

In case minors are found to be working at the said establishments at the time that enforcers entered it while implementing this Ordinance, the owners of the said establishments as well as the parents of the said minors shall be held accountable for violation of the pertinent provisions of RA 7610 and of this Ordinance.

If the violation is committed by a business establishment owned or operated by a corporation or partnership, the President, General Manager, or any other person, acting in behalf of either the President or General Manager shall be held liable. If the violation is committed by a business establishment owned or operated by a sole proprietorship, the owner or the person acting in his behalf shall be held responsible for the said offense.

Section 14 Separability Clause. — If, for any reason or reasons, any part of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be held unconstitutional or invalid, other parts hereof which are not affected thereby shall continue to be in full force and effect.

Section 15. Repealing Clause. — All Ordinances, resolutions, Circulars, Memorandums or Rules and regulations inconsistent with the provision of this Ordinance are hereby repealed and modified accordingly.

Section 16. Implementing Rules. — The City Mayor is hereby empowered to direct the formulation of the implementing rules and guidelines of this Ordinance. Provided: that the said rules and guidelines should not be contrary to the provisions hereof.

Section 17. Mandatory Review. — The Sangguniang Panlungsod shall review this Ordinance and its implementing rules once every two (2) years following its date of effectivity.

Section 18. Effectivity Clause. - This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its publication at least once in a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Bacoor and after a copy hereof has been submitted to the University of the Philippines- Office of the National Administrative Register (U.P - ONAR).

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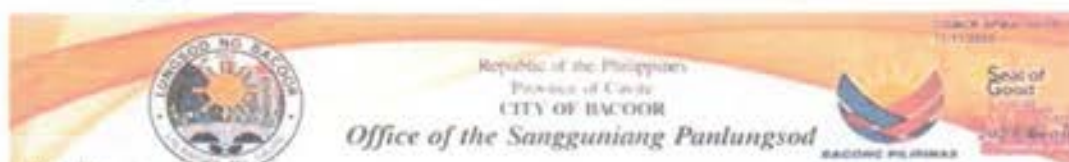

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CITY ORDINANCE NO. 176-2021 BY BANNING THE USE, SALE, MANUFACTURE, AND DISTRIBUTION OF ALL TYPES OF BOGA, BAMBOO CANNONS, OR POLYVINYL CHLORIDE (PVC) CANNONS WITHIN THE CITY OF BACOOR AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS HEREOF.

WHEREAS, on 6 September 2021, the 4th Sangguniang Panlungsod approved City Ordinance No. 176-2021 (otherwise known as the "Anti-Firecracker Ordinance of the City of Bacoor") which banned the use, sale, manufacture, and distribution of all types of firecrackers and fireworks within the City of Bacoor subject to certain exceptions;

WHEREAS, on 24 October 2024, the Bacoor City Police requested the Sangguniang Panlungsod through informal channels to pass an ordinance banning the use of "boga" or homemade cannons made of bamboo, polyvinyl chloride (PVC), or other materials because of the inherent risks involved during its use that may result in serious bodily injury or even death;

WHEREAS, Section 16 of Republic Act No. 7160 (the "Local Government Code of 1991") empowered local governments such as the City of Bacoor to exercise the powers expressly granted, those necessarily implied therefrom, as well as powers necessary, appropriate, or incidental for its efficient and effective governance, and those which are essential to the promotion of the general welfare. Within their respective territorial jurisdictions, local government units shall ensure and support, among other things, the preservation and enrichment of culture, promote health and safety, enhance the right of the people to a balanced ecology, encourage and support the development of appropriate and self-reliant scientific and technological capabilities, improve public morals, enhance

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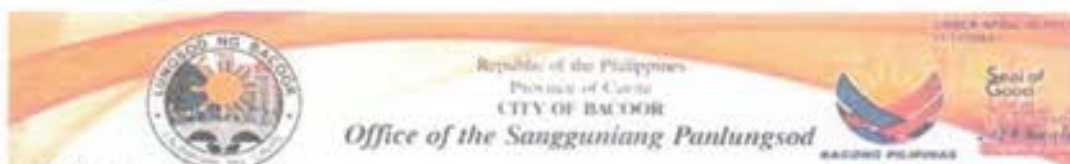

Prohibition on the Use, Sale, Manufacture, Possession and Distribution of All Types of Firecrackers, Boga, Bamboo Cannons, PVC Cannons, and Other Types of Explosive Devices. — The City of Bacoor hereby prohibits the use, sale, manufacture, storage and distribution of all types of firecrackers, boga, bamboo cannons, polyvinyl chloride cannons, and other types of explosive devices that produces a booming sound and has the potential to cause bodily harm or death within its territorial jurisdiction."

Section 3. Amendment of Section 3 (Definition of Terms/Rule of Construction) of City Ordinance No. 176-2021. Section 3 of City Ordinance No. 176-2021 shall be amended and shall read as follows:

"Section 3. Definition of Terms/Rule of Construction - the following terms, as used in this ordinance, shall mean:

a) **Firecrackers**- are explosive pyrotechnic devices primarily designed to produce a large amount of noise, colorful displays, or cracking sounds such as rebentador, pipila, bawang, watul, fountain, sinturon ni huday, ahas, whistle bomb, milenyo, goodbye world, and trumpilya;

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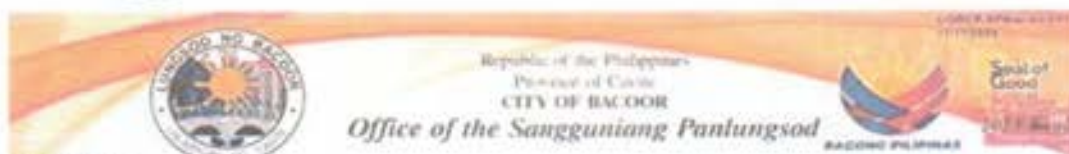

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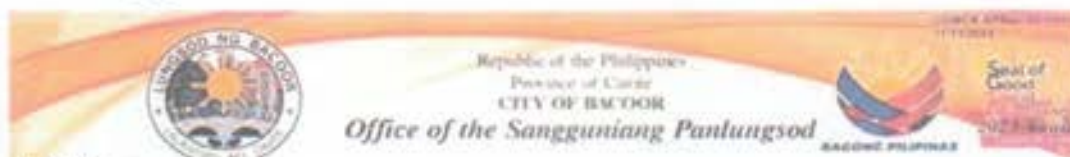

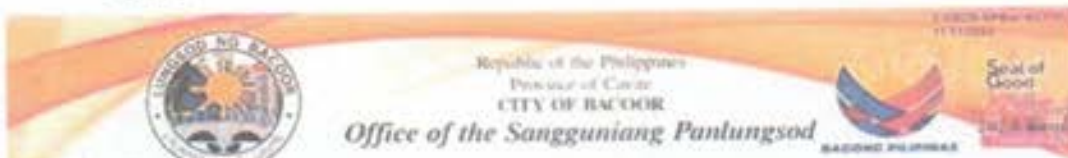

Section 12. Effectivity Clause. — This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its posting in at least three (3) conspicuous places within the City of Bacoor.

Section 12. Public Information Campaign. — The City Information and Community Relations Department (CICRD) shall launch an intensive public information campaign regarding the implementation of this Ordinance.

Section 13. Penalties. — The same applicable penalties indicated in Sections 6 and 7 of City Ordinance No. 176-2021 shall be imposed against any person who shall be convicted of using, possession, manufacturing, selling, or distributing bags, or other similar devices covered by this Ordinance.

Section 14 Separability Clause. — If, for any reason or reasons, any part of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be held unconstitutional or invalid, other parts hereof which are not affected thereby shall continue to be in full force and effect.

Section 15. Repealing Clause. — All Ordinances, resolutions, Circulars, Memorandums or Rules and regulations inconsistent with the provision of this Ordinance are hereby repealed and modified accordingly.

Section 16. Implementing Rules. — The City Mayor is hereby empowered to direct the formulation of the implementing rules and guidelines of this Ordinance. Provided that the said rules and guidelines should not be contrary to the provisions hereof.

Section 17. Mandatory Review. — The Sangguniang Panlungsod shall review this Ordinance and its implementing rules once every two (2) years following its date of effectivity.

Section 18. Effectivity Clause. — This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its publication at least once in a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Bacoor and after a copy hereof has been submitted to the University of the Philippines Office of the National Administrative Register (U.P.-ONAR).
