Subject: (PCO 2025-020) AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING ALL HOUSEHOLD, RESTAURANT, CANTEENS AND OTHER FOOD ESTABLISHMENTS FROM DUMPING USED COOKING OIL AND GREASE TRAP WASTE DOWN DRAINAGE PIPES, REGULATING THE DISPOSAL, SALE, AND PROCESSING OF USED COOKING OIL AND/OR GREASE TRAP WASTE, MANDATING THEIR COLLECTION BY ACCREDITED COLLECTING ENTITIES TO PREVENT FLOODING AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS HEREOF. (Date referred July 7, 2025)

The Committee held a committee meeting on 11 July 2025 at the MSBR Conference Room 4th Floor Bacoor Legislative & Disaster Resilience Building, Bacoor Government Center, Bacoor City, Cavite. Two public hearings were held on 16 July 2025 and 30 July 2025, respectively, at the Session Hall of the Sangguniang Panlungsod on the 6th Floor of the Bacoor Legislative & Disaster Resilience Building, Bacoor Government Center, Bacoor Boulevard. Brgy Bayanan, City of Bacoor, Cavite. The said public hearings were attended by various stakeholders.

Invitations to the said stakeholders were sent via email and notices on the schedule of the said public hearings were published on the Facebook page and website of the Sangguniang Panlungsod. The said Notice of Hearing was also published on the July 13-30, 2025 issue of the Souther Sparkle News and were posted at the following places: the Zapote Public Market, the Bacoor Government Center, and the Padre Mariano Gomez Plaza near the Hall of Justice starting on 14 July 2025.

Copies of the proposed ordinance was sent to the said stakeholders via email before the 16 July 2025 hearing. Beginning on 14 July 2025, a PDF copy of the proposed ordinance was also posted on the official website of the Sangguniang Panlungsod (www.bacoorcitysp.com) and a link was provided to facilitate access to, and downloading for free of, the proposed legislation.

The said hearings were presided over by the Chairperson of the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources, Hon. Levy M. Tela. The minutes, attendance sheets, and photos, during the said hearings were attached hereto and shall be made integral parts of this report.











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FINDINGS:

The proposed ordinance seeks to ban the indiscriminate disposal of used cooking oil and grease trap waste into the drainage systems by households, restaurants, canteens, and other food establishments situated in the City of Bacoor which has been identified as a major contributor to clogged sewer lines which result in environmental degradation and give rise to various sanitation issues. The ordinance aims to encourage the public to participate in the proper collection, treatment, processing, and disposal of used cooking oil so that it can be converted to biodiesel and minimize its environmental impact.

After listening to the various suggestions aired during the said public hearings, the Committee believes that some of its provisions should be amended. The provisions of the proposed ordinance that the Committee proposes to be amended are as follows:

- 4.7. Used cooking oil or grease waste is deemed "improperly processed" if it is converted to a different chemical substance, or is made to appear to have undergone process, considered harmful to the environment by the CESD or to human health by the Office of the City Health Services (OCHS).
- 4.10. Used cooking oil or grease trap waste is deemed "improperly collected" if it is collected by a corporation, partnership, or <u>natural</u> person not duly accredited by the City Government to buy or collect used cooking oil or grease trap waste in exchange for a fee or any other consideration.

4.12. "Unbranded cooking oil" are cooking oil that was repacked and placed in bottles











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or other containers originally intended as receptacles for other products. A cooking oil is considered unbranded when the seller of the said product is unable to produce a valid proof of purchase such as a sales invoice where the brand name of the oil being sold is clearly indicated as well as the place where the branded cooking oil was purchased and the date when the said purchase was made.

Section Implementing Departments. The City Environment Services Department (CESD) shall implement this Ordinance and its IRR. The CESD, shall submit monthly written reports to the City Mayor and to the Sangguniang Panlungsod containing data on the amount of used cooking oil waste and grease trap collected per month, the number of households or food establishments that comply with this Ordinance, and the number of **HOAs** and barangays that have assisted said department implementing this legislation.

Section Implementing Departments. The City Environment Services Department (CESD). the Business Permits and Licensing Department (BPLD) and the Office of City Health Services (OCHS) shall implement this Ordinance and its IRR. The CESD, BPLD and the OCHS shall submit monthly written reports to the City Mayor and to the Sangguniana Panlungsod containing on the data amount of used cooking oil grease trap collected per month, number of households or food establishments that comply with this Ordinance, and the number of HOAs and barangays that have assisted said department the implementing this legislation.

8.1. The head of any household that unjustifiably fails to turn over the used cooking oil his/her household consumed to the CESD or to Section 8. Penalties

The manager or owner of any food establishment that unjustifiably fails to give the used cooking oil and/or grease trap waste that the said establishment used/produced to the duly accredited private collection entities on the assigned collection day thereof, or who improperly disposed, sold, or processed used cooking oil or grease trap waste shall pay a fine of P5,000.00 for each violation of this provision as determined by the CESD. The failure of the said manager or owner to comply with this provision for two or more occasions within a thirtyday period shall result in the suspension of the business permit of the said establishment and in its closure by the BPLD for ten (10) successive days.

8.6. The owner or manager of any business establishment which shall include but shall not be limited to sari-sari stores and

The failure of the said manager or owner to comply with this provision for two or more occasions within a thirtyday period shall result in the suspension of the business permit of the establishment and in its closure by the BPLD for ten (10) successive days or until the said food establishment has complied with this Ordinance.

assigned collection day thereof shall pay a fine of P5,000,00 for each violation of this provision as determined by the CESD. Provided however that the said person is allowed to pour the used cooking oil generated by his/her household anytime at specially designed receptacles approved by the Government situated residential subdivision clubhouses or at barangay halls.

8.2. The manager or owner of any food establishment that unjustifiably fails to give the used cooking oil and/or grease trap waste that the said establishment used/produced to the duly accredited private collection entities assigned collection day thereof in the manner provided in the IRR of this ordinance, or who improperly disposed, sold, or processed used cooking oil or grease trap waste shall pay a fine of P5,000.00 for each violation of this provision as determined by the CESD. The failure of the said manager or owner to comply with this provision for two or more occasions within a thirty-day period shall result in suspension of the business permit of the said establishment and in its closure by the BPLD for ten (10) successive days or until the said establishment food has complied with this Ordinance.

8.6. The owner or manager of any business establishment which shall include but shall not be limited to sari-sari stores and











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markets stalls who sell improperly processed used cooking oil or grease trap waste shall pay a fine of P5,000.00 and his/her business establishment shall be closed by the Business Permit and Licensing Department for not more than ten (10) calendar days. The said penalty shall be imposed against the said business establishment against its owner/manager each time a violation of this provision is committed.

markets stalls who sell improperly processed used cooking oil or grease trap waste or unbranded cooking oil shall pay a fine of P5,000.00 and his/her business establishment shall be closed by the Business Permit and Licensina Department for not more than ten (10) calendar days. The said penalty shall be imposed against the said business establishment and against its owner/manager each time a violation of this provision is committed. Provided that: a seller of cooking oil is allowed to dispense his/her/its product by requiring the consumer/buyer to bring a recycled container where the cooking oil to be purchased shall be placed. Provided lastly: no used cooking oil shall be sold anywhere in the City of Bacoor regardless if the same is branded and regardless of the container that was used to sell it.

Section 10. Accreditation of Private Collection Entity. The City Mayor shall, pursuant to the IRR of this Ordinance, accredit private corporations who shall be authorized to collect used cooking oil or grease trap waste within the city. For purposes of this Section, the City Mayor shall only accredit private corporations duly existing and operating under Philippine laws, with prior experience in the conversion of used cooking oil and grease trap waste to biodiesel in the Philippines, and who are willing to develop at own expense smartphone app that will enable the City Government to accurately monitor the amount

Accreditation of Section 10. Private Collection Entity. The City Mayor shall, pursuant to the IRR of this Ordinance, accredit private corporations who shall be authorized to collect used cooking oil or grease trap waste within the city. For purposes of this Section, the City Mayor shall accredit private corporations duly existing and operating under Philippine laws, with prior experience in the conversion of used cooking oil and grease trap waste to biodiesel in the Philippines, and who are willing to develop at their own expense a smartphone app that will enable the City Government to accurately monitor the amount of used cooking oil and grease trap











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

Introduction:

Hon. Levy Tela explained that every day, thousands of liters of used cooking oil and grease trap waste are disposed of by households and food establishments, down sinks, drains, and waterways. This not only causes blockages in our drainage systems, which lead to severe flooding, but also harms our environment and can pose a threat to the health of our communities.

This ordinance is not meant to intimidate or punish, but rather to invite collective action. We aim to achieve a clean environment, safe communities, and responsible waste management especially for things we often think of as simple waste, like used cooking oil.

Through our cooperation from ordinary households to large restaurants and businesses we can achieve this goal. May our minds remain open to the purpose of this ordinance, let us engage in meaningful dialogue, and above all, support this advocacy for the benefit of all.











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CESD: On behalf of the City Environment and Sanitation Department (CESD), we express our full support for the approval of this ordinance. This measure will help strengthen the implementation of our existing ordinances and policies, particularly those aligned with national laws such as Republic Act No. 6969, also known as the Toxic Substances and Hazardous and Nuclear Waste Control Act of 1990. That would be all. Thank you very much. This ordinance will serve as a baseline for our ongoing initiatives, especially under the Save Manila Bay Task Force, in our efforts to prevent further flooding and environmental degradation. It will also reinforce the implementation of the Liquid Waste Management Cluster in our city.

OCHS: In behalf of Doctora Ivy, we would like to share that we have already discussed the topics mentioned here earlier with the engineer from CENRO. With that, we have nothing

further to add. Thank you.

Brgy. Molino 3: This draft ordinance is commendable, and we hope it will be pursued and finalized. Thank you very much, and good afternoon.

Brgy QRC: For me, I agree that we should continue with this program, because that has been a recurring problem in our area. It's not just an issue affecting the drainage system, if possible, we should also address the use of disposable gas canisters, which are often used by vendors. These canisters are frequently what I find when we clean or dig out the drainage.

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

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

Introduction:

Mr. Ric Pastrano, a chemist, clarified that the white foam often seen in rivers, especially near dams, isn't actually soap. He explained that its methane gas produced by cyanobacteria, which thrive on food scraps mixed with used cooking oil. He warned that this foam can be hazardous, if it comes into contact with something like a lit cigarette in a confined area such as a culvert or pipe, it could lead to an explosion. He cited a past incident at an Ayala Mall, where methane buildup in a septic tank caused a blast.

Mr. Pastrano also discussed the health risks associated with cooking practices. When cooking oil is overheated until it smokes, it releases a substance called acrolein. Breathing in acrolein has been linked to breast cancer in women. This is believed to be one reason why the Philippines has the highest rate of breast cancer among women in Southeast Asia. In other countries, people tend not to reuse cooking oil, but in the Philippines, reusing oil multiple times is common. Moreover, modern kitchens are often enclosed without proper ventilation, unlike traditional open-air kitchens. As a result, many people, especially those living in condos or apartments end up inhaling harmful cooking fumes.

He also noted that used cooking oil is often collected from restaurants, a fact confirmed during a council meeting with some restaurant owners. However, the problem is that many of these oil collectors simply filter the oil, repackage it, and sell it in local markets. According to regulations by the Environmental Management Bureau (EMB), used cooking oil is classified as toxic and unfit for human consumption, as it poses risks for cancer and heart disease.

Another concern he raised is that cooking oil solidifies when temperatures drop to 21°C or lower, especially during the rainy season. Once it hardens in cold pipes, it doesn't melt easily and behaves like a solid block. This contributes to clogged drainage systems, worsening urban flooding.
