An ordinance amending various provisions of the Bacoor Children's Code was referred to the committee during the 7th regular session on August 18, 2025 by Hon. Rowena Bautista-Mendiola.

- The Joint Committee hearing was called to order by Hon. Catherine Sarino-Evaristo at exactly 4:05 p.m. on October 23, 2025 at the SP Session Hall Bacoor Legislative and Disaster Resilience Building Bacoor Boulevard, Barangay Bayanan, City of Bacoor, Cavite.
- Hon. Catherine Sarino-Evaristo immediately asks the resource person from the Office of the City Social Welfare and Development representative Ms. Gina Pornelos about their opinions, suggestions and comments regarding the said subject matter and presented the following recommendation for amendment, as follows:

Section 16. Responsibilities of the Child. Every child, regardless of the circumstances of birth, sex, religion, social status, political antecedents and other factors shall: Section 16. Responsibilities of the Child. Every child, regardless of the circumstances of birth, gender, religion, social status, political antecedents and other factors shall:

ARTICLE IV

ROLES AND FUNCTIONS OF VARIOUS SECTORS

Section 17. The Family. - The family is the central unit responsible for the primary socialization of children that is important in the prevention of children's rights violation. The City Government shall fund and implement such projects, plans, and programs that will preserve the integrity of the family, including the extended family. Such projects, plans, and programs shall be included in the city government's annual and supplemental budgets.

A. Primary Rights of Parents. - The family has the primary responsibility of nurturing and protecting children from infancy to adolescence. Introduction of children to the culture, values and norms of their society shall begin in the family. The parents shall have the right to the company of their children and, in relation to all other persons or institutions dealing with children's development, the primary right and obligation to provide for their upbringing.

Parents have the right to discipline their children as may be necessary for the formation of their good character, provided it does not fall under the prohibited acts mentioned in this Code. Parents may require from their children obedience to just and reasonable rules, suggestions and admonitions.

A.1. General duties of Parents. - Parents shall have the following general duties toward their children:

 To give them affection, companionship, and understanding;

- To extend to them the benefits of moral guidance, self-discipline, and religious instruction;
- To supervise their activities, including their recreation;
- To inculcate in them the value of industry, thrift and self-reliance;
- To stimulate their interest in civic affairs, teach them the duties of citizenship, and develop their commitment to their country;
- To advise them properly on any matter affecting their development and well-being;
- 7. To always set a good example:
- To provide them with adequate support, as defined in Article 194 of the Family Code;
- To administer their property, if any, according to their best interest, subject to the provisions of Article 225 to 227 of the Family Code; and
- 10. Such other duties that would redound to the strengthening of the family and the physical, emotional, mental, and moral well-being of the child.

A.2 Separation of Children from their Families. -

Every effort shall be made to prevent the separation of children from their families. Whenever children are separated from their families owing to force majeure or in their own best interest, the City Social Welfare and Development Office and the other departments and units of the city government shall make the necessary arrangements for appropriate alternative family care or institutional placement, due regard being paid to the desirability of continuity in children upbringing in their own cultural milieu. Extended families, relatives and community institutions shall be

given support to help meet the special needs of orphaned, displaced, and abandoned children. Efforts must be made to ensure that no child is treated as an

outcast of society.

A.3. Role of Women, - Women play a critical role in the well-being of children. Efforts for the enhancement of women's status and their roles in development must begin with girl children. The enhancement of the status of women and their equal access to education, training, credit, reproductive health, and other extension services constitute a valuable contribution to a nation's social and economic development. To achieve that and to prepare women in their various roles, equal opportunity shall be provided for the children of female gender, for them to benefit from the health, nutrition, education and other basic services for their full growth.

A.4.Role of Fathers. - Fathers play a vital role in their children's lives. Policies and legislations shall be enacted and programs shall be designed for the inclusion of their critical role. Fathers shall be equally responsible in the rearing and nurturing of the children in the home and be their role model. Equal opportunity shall be provided to the children of male gender for them to benefit from the health, nutrition, and other basic services for their full growth.

Section 27. Roles and functions of the City Council for the Protection of Children CCCPC) and the Barangay Council for the Protection of Children CBCPC). The City Council for the Protection of Children shall have the following duties and functions:

- Formulate plans, programs and policies for children that are gender-fair, culturally relevant and responsive to the needs of diverse groups of children up to eighteen (18) years old;
- a. Formulate plans, programs and policies for children that are gender-fair, culturally relevant and responsive to the needs of diverse groups of children.

- e. Provide technical assistance and recommend financial support to Barangay Councils for the protection of children;
- f. Promote the education of every child within the City;
- g. Advocate for the establishment and maintenance of playgrounds, day care centers and other facilities necessary for child and youth developments within the City;

h. Advocate and recommend local legislation promoting child survival, protection, participation and development especially on the quality of television and media print and coverage, which are detrimental to children:

- i. Conduct capability-building programs to enhance knowledge and skills in handling concerns relating to children;
- j. Document barangay best practices relating to children and juvenile intervention and prevention;
- k. Protect and assist children in need of special protection and manage cases filed against child abuser, in coordination with the proper agencies/institutions;
- Monitor situation reports on children and prepare quarterly updates, including the implementation of various children development programs, and recommend to the Sangguniang Panlungsod for consideration and application; and
- m. Perform such other functions as may be authorized by other related laws or ordinances, especially on matters of child and parent education, health and entertainment. The Barangay Council for the Protection of Children shall have the following duties and functions:

- k. Protect and assist children in need of special protection and manage cases filed against alleged perpetrator, in coordination with the proper agencies/institutions;
- I. Monitor related reports on children and prepare quarterly updates, including the implementation of various children development programs, and recommend to the Sangguniang Panlungsod for consideration and application;
- m. Establish and maintain an updated and disaggregated database on children;
- n. Prepare an Annual Work and Financial Plan (AWFP) consistent with its functions as provided herein and in the Barangay EO creating it;
- o. Make recommendations to the barangay on policies and PPAs relative to the promotion of the rights and welfare or children for inclusion in the comprehensive and annual development plan of the Barangay;

- a. Implement the various policy directives set forth by the CCPC, the City Mayor, or by the Sangguniang Panlungsod;
- b. Provide effective and sufficient provisions on the basic social needs of children and of the youth residing within the barangay which shall include projects and programs for children and youth welfare; and
- c. Implement the various applicable provisions of this Code, other ordinances, and national laws pertaining to child development and protection within the territorial jurisdiction of the barangay.

- p. Perform functions related to its mandate as provided by national laws and policies such as, but not limited to, children in conflict with the law, children at risk and children in need of special protection;
- q. Document the barangay's PPAs and accomplishment on children Coordinate its efforts with the concerned barangay officials as well as the higher level LGU exercising jurisdiction over it; and
- r. Conduct of advocacy activities on the promotion and protection of rights and welfare of children including the development of information, education and advocacy materials.

By the age of Five (5), a child's brain has already grown to 90 percent of its adult weight and much of the way he/she envisions and interacts with the world has been shaped. Thus, the child's formative years and the care that he/she gets during this period would significantly affect his/her learning capacity, personal and social interaction well into adulthood.

While parents have the primary responsibility to provide for their children's physical, emotional, psychological, mental and social needs, day care services aims to supplemental the inability of some parents to provide their children with the proper care and home environment.

Section 40. Importance of Child Development Service. - Child Development service addresses the needs in the crucial stages of a child's growth. Thus, the child's formative years and the care that he/she gets during this period would significantly affect his/her learning capacity, personal and social interaction.

While parents have the primary responsibility to provide for their children's physical, emotional, psychological, mental and social needs, child development services aim to supplement the inability of some parents to provide their children with the proper care and home environment.

The CSWDO, in coordination with the DepEd and other stakeholders, shall prepare programs in celebration of National Children's Month and shall conduct child-focused activities for the month promoting the right and responsibilities of Filipino children as well as the obligations of the people and institutions responsible in ensuring the well-being of Filipino children.

Section 45. Mandatory Celebration of November as National Children's Month. - The month of November of every year is hereby mandated to be observed and celebrated as National Children's Month pursuant to Republic Act No. 10661 which was signed into law on 25 May 2015. The CSWDO, in coordination with the CCPC and other stakeholders, shall prepare programs in celebration of National Children's Month and shall conduct child-focused activities for the month promoting the right and responsibilities of Filipino children as well as the obligations of the people and institutions responsible in ensuring the well-being of Filipino children.

Section 50. Prohibited Acts

a. Illegal Recruitment - Any person who recruits other persons for work shall be required to register with and secure a permit from the Office of the Barangay Captain. a. System of Diversion - a system of diversion is hereby established wherein children in conflict with the law shall as much possible be referred to alternative measures without undergoing court proceedings. Diversion shall apply to a child or youth as defined in the implementing rules and regulations of RA 9344 as amended and subject to the conditions hereinafter provided. The CSWDO is hereby empowered to hold and spearhead such programs designed to teach public officials, educators, police and barangay officials, and other stakeholders on the various systems of diversion.

Section 55. System of Diversion. - a system of diversion is hereby established wherein a child in conflict with the law shall as much possible be referred to alternative measures without undergoing court proceedings. Diversion shall apply to a child as defined in the implementing rules and regulations of RA 9344 as amended and subject to the conditions hereinafter provided. The CSWDO is hereby empowered to hold and spearhead such programs designed to teach public officials, educators, police and barangay officials, and other stakeholders on the various systems of diversion. Provided that: a child in conflict with the law is above 15 years old and assessed by the LSWDO to have acted with discernment at the offense was committed and has committed an offense with a penalty of six years and below. Provided further that: if the offense committed by the child is victimless, the case shall be referred to the LSWDO for diversion. Provided lastly that: if the offense committed by the child has a penalty above six years: refer the case to the Women and Children Protection Desk (WCPD) for diversion.

Section 60. Termination of the Case - If the competent authorities determine that the child did not commit the offense charged, the case shall be terminated and a decision to that effect shall be written and explained to both parties

Section 60. Termination of Case Under Diversion Program - The Punong Barangay, with the assistance of the BCPC, will supervise and monitor the CICL's compliance with and progress under the diversion program and will determine if the diversion program was successfully implemented. A determination that the CICL failed to comply with the terms and conditions of the diversion contract will be certified by the LSWDO.

Section 65. Diversion Programs, When Proper. - Where the parties and/or the competent authorities decide that the child must undergo a diversion program, such a continuing program of the rehabilitation and reintegration of the complainant and the child.

Section 66. Factors in Determining Diversion Programs. - In determining whether diversion is appropriate and desirable, the following factors shall be taken into consideration:

- 1. The nature and circumstances of the offense charged
- 2. The frequency and the severity of its occurrence
- 3. The character and reputation of the child
- 4. The circumstances of the accused child
- 5. The influence of the family and environment on the growth of the child
- 6. The emotional relief of the victim
- 7. The weight of the evidence against the child.

Section 66. Factors in Determining Diversion Programs. - In determining whether diversion is appropriate and desirable, the following factors shall be taken into consideration:

- A contract of diversion may be entered into only when the CICL voluntarily admits the commission of the offense.
- b. The Punong Barangay will explain that the voluntary admission of the CICL during the diversion proceedings is only deemed a consent to undergo the Diversion Program and not to be considered an admission of guilt and may not be used against the CICL in any way such as in any future judicial, guasijudicial or administrative proceedings.

Section 67. Criteria for Formulating Diversion Programs. - In formulating a diversion program, the individual characteristics and the peculiar circumstances of the child shall be used to formulate an individualized treatment. The following factors shall be considered in formulating a diversion program for the child:

- The child's feelings of remorse for the offense he or she committed;

Section 69. Designation of Officer or Unit to Handle Cases involving Children in Conflict with the Law - The Philippine National Police shall designate a Child and Youth Relations Office or Unit (CYRO or CRYU) to handle cases involving children in conflict with the law. This may be integrated with the present Women and Children's Desk or may be a separate unit, depending on the conditions of the area.



Such projects, plans, and programs shall be included in the city government's annual and supplemental budgets.

Introduction of children to the culture, values and norms of their society shall begin in the family. The parents shall have the right to the company of their children and, in relation to all other persons or institutions dealing with children's development, the primary right and obligation to provide for their upbringing.

Parents have the right to discipline their children as may be necessary for the formation of their good character, provided it does not fall under the prohibited acts mentioned in this Code. Parents may require from their children obedience to just and reasonable rules, suggestions and admonitions.



- 6. To advise them properly on any matter affecting their development and well-being;
- 7. To always set a good example;
- 8. To provide them with adequate support, as defined in Article 194 of the Family Code;
- 9. To administer their property, if any, according to their best interest, subject to the provisions of Article 225 to 227 of the Family Code; and
- 10. Such other duties that would redound to the strengthening of the family and the physical, emotional, mental, and moral well-being of the child.
- A.2 Separation of Children from their Families. -Every effort shall be made to prevent the separation of children from their families. Whenever children are separated from their families owing to force majeure or in their own best interest, the City Social Welfare and Development Office and the other departments and units of the city government shall make the necessary arrangements for appropriate alternative family care or institutional placement, due regard being paid to the desirability of continuity in children upbringing in their own cultural milieu. Extended families, relatives and community institutions shall be given support to help meet the special needs of orphaned, displaced, and abandoned children. Efforts must be made to ensure that no child is treated as an outcast of

The enhancement of the status of women and their equal access to education, training, credit, reproductive health, and other extension services constitute a valuable contribution to a nation's social and economic development. To achieve that and to prepare women in their various roles, equal opportunity shall be provided for the children of female gender, for them to benefit from the health, nutrition, education and other basic services for their full growth.

A.4.Role of Fathers. - Fathers play a vital role in their children's lives. Policies and legislations shall be enacted and programs shall be designed for the inclusion of their critical role. Fathers shall be equally responsible in the rearing and nurturing of the children in the home and be their role model. Equal opportunity shall be provided to the children of male gender for them to benefit from the health, nutrition, and other basic services for their full growth.

WHEREAS, on 1 February 2016, the Sangguniang Panlungsod enacted City Ordinance No. 6-2016 (also known as the "Child Development and Protection Code of the City of Bacoor").

WHEREAS, on ___ August 2025, the Bacoar City Council for the Protection of Children formally requested the Sangguniang Panlungsod to amend several provisions of City Ordinance No. 6-2016 in view of laws related to children's rights and protection issues that have been approved by Congress recently that has an impact on the said local legislation.

NOW THEREFORE, upon motion of Honorable Catherine Sarino-Evaristo, be it ORDAINED by the 6th Sangguniang Panlungsod of the City of Bacoor, Cavite

Section 1. Amendments of Various Provisions of City Ordinance No. 6-2016. The following provisions of City Ordinance No. 6-2016 are hereby amended:

Introduction of children to the culture, values and norms of their society shall begin in the family. The parents shall have the right to the company of their children and, in relation to all other persons or institutions dealing with children's development, the primary right and obligation to provide for their upbringing.

Parents have the right to discipline their children as may be necessary for the formation of their good character, provided it does not fall under the prohibited acts mentioned in this Code. Parents may require from their children obedience to just and reasonable rules, suggestions and admonitions.

- A.1. General duties of Parents. Parents shall have the following general duties toward their children:
- To give them affection, companionship, and understanding;
- To extend to them the benefits of moral guidance, self-discipline, and religious instruction;
- To supervise their activities, including their recreation;
- To inculcate in them the value of industry, thrift and self-reliance;
- To stimulate their interest in civic affairs, teach them the duties of citizenship, and develop their commitment to their country;
- To advise them properly on any matter affecting their development and well-being;
- 7. To always set a good example;
- To provide them with adequate support, as defined in Article 194 of the Family Code;
- To administer their property, if any, according to their best interest, subject to the provisions of Article 225 to 227 of the Family Code; and
- 10. Such other duties that would redound to the strengthening of the family and the physical, emotional, mental, and moral well-being of the child.

A.2 Separation of Children from their Families. -Every effort shall be made to prevent the separation of children from their families. Whenever children are separated from their families owing to force majeure or in their own best interest, the City Social Welfare and Development Office and the other departments and units of the city government shall make the necessary arrangements for appropriate alternative family care or institutional placement, due regard being paid to the desirability of continuity in children upbringing in their own cultural milieu. Extended families, relatives and community institutions shall be given support to help meet the special needs of orphaned, displaced, and abandoned children. Efforts must be made to ensure that no child is treated as an outcast of society.

A.3. Role of Women. - Women play a critical role in the well-being of children. Efforts for the enhancement of women's status and their roles in development must begin with girl children. The enhancement of the status of women and their equal access to education, training, credit, reproductive health, and other extension services constitute a valuable contribution to a nation's social and economic development. To achieve that and to prepare women in their various roles, equal opportunity shall be provided for the children of female gender, for them to benefit from the health, nutrition, education and other basic services for their full growth.

A.4.Role of Fathers. - Fathers play a vital role in their children's lives. Policies and legislations shall be enacted and programs shall be designed for the inclusion of their critical role. Fathers shall be equally responsible in the rearing and nurturing of the children in the home and be their role model. Equal opportunity shall be provided to the children of male gender for them to benefit from the health, nutrition, and other basic services for their full growth.

Section 27. Roles and functions of the City Council for the Protection of Children CCCPC) and the Barangay Council for the Protection of Children CBCPC). The City Council for the Protection of Children shall have the following duties and functions:

- Formulate plans, programs and policies for children that are genderfair, culturally relevant and responsive to the needs of diverse groups of children up to eighteen (18) years old;
- Serve as the primary agency to coordinate with and assist the City Government in the adoption of Juvenile Intervention Programs;
- c. Prepare an Annual Work and Financial Plan for children and recommend appropriation to the Sangguniang Panlungsod equivalent to 1% of the Internal Revenue Allocation (IRA) of the City;
- d. Coordinate with other agencies and institutions in the planning, monitoring and evaluation of plans for children and Juvenile Intervention and Diversion Programs in the community;
- e. Provide technical assistance and recommend financial support to Barangay Councils for the protection of children;
- f. Promote the education of every child within the City;
- g. Advocate for the establishment and maintenance of playgrounds, day care centers and other facilities

- a. Formulate plans, programs and policies for children that are gender-fair, culturally relevant and responsive to the needs of diverse groups of children.
 - b. Serve as the primary agency to coordinate with and assist the City Government in the adoption of Comprehensive Local Juvenile Intervention Program (CLJIP);

g. Advocate for the establishment and maintenance of playgrounds, <u>child development</u> <u>centers</u> and other facilities necessary for child and youth developments within the City; necessary for child and youth developments within the City;

- h. Advocate and recommend local legislation promoting child survival, protection, participation and development especially on the quality of television and media print and coverage, which are detrimental to children:
- Conduct capability-building programs to enhance knowledge and skills in handling concerns relating to children;
- j. Document barangay best practices relating to children and juvenile intervention and prevention;
- k. Protect and assist children in need of special protection and manage cases filed against child abuser, in coordination with the proper agencies/institutions;
- I. Monitor situation reports on children and prepare quarterly updates, including the implementation of various children development programs, and recommend to the Sangguniang Panlungsod for consideration and application; and
- m. Perform such other functions as may be authorized by other related laws or ordinances, especially on matters of child and parent education, health and entertainment. The Barangay Council for the

- Perform functions related to its mandate as provided by national laws and policies such as,

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SEVERAL PROVISIONS OF CITY ORDINANCE NO. 2-2016 OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE "CHILD DEVELOPMENT AND PROTECTION CODE OF THE CITY OF BACOOR" AND FURTHER STRENGTHENING THE POLICIES OF THE CITY GOVERNMENT IN RELATION TO THE DEVELOPMENT AND PROTECTION OF CHILDREN.

WHEREAS, on 1 February 2016, the Sangguniang Panlungsod enacted City Ordinance No. 6-2016 (also known as the "Child Development and Protection Code of the City of Bacoor").

WHEREAS, on 18 August 2025, the Bacoor City Council for the Protection of Children formally requested the Sangguniang Panlungsod to amend several provisions of City Ordinance No. 6-2016 in view of laws related to children's rights and protection issues that have been approved by Congress recently that has an impact on the said local legislation.

NOW THEREFORE, upon motion of Honorable Catherine Sarino-Evaristo, be it ORDAINED by the 6th Sangguniang Panlungsod of the City of Bacoor, Cavite that:

"Development Rights" refer to the rights of a child to education, to develop her or his personality, talents, and mental and physical abilities to the fullest extent. These also include participation in cultural activities, access to appropriate and relevant information and opportunities for rest, play and leisure. The following are the development rights of every child residing in the City of Bacoor:

Section 13. Developmental Rights of the Child. "Developmental Rights" refer to the rights of a child to education, to develop her or his personality, talents, and mental and physical abilities to the fullest extent. These also include participation in cultural activities, access to appropriate and relevant information and opportunities for rest, play and leisure. The following are the developmental rights of every child residing in the City of Bacoor:

Section 14. Protection Rights of the Child

ARTICLE IV

ROLES AND FUNCTIONS OF VARIOUS SECTORS Section 17. The Family. - The family is the central unit responsible for the primary socialization of children that is important in the prevention of children's rights violation. The City Government shall fund and implement such projects, plans, and programs that will preserve the integrity of the family, including the extended family. Such projects, plans, and programs shall be included in the city government's annual and supplemental budgets.

The family has the primary responsibility of nurturing and protecting children from infancy to adolescence.

Introduction of children to the culture, values and norms of their society shall begin in the family. The parents shall have the right to the company of their children and, in relation to all other persons or institutions dealing with

children's development, the primary right and obligation to provide for their upbringing.

A. Primary Rights of Parents. -

Parents have the right to discipline their children as may be necessary for the formation of their good character, provided it does not fall under the prohibited acts mentioned in this Code. Parents may require from their children obedience to just and reasonable rules, suggestions and admonitions.

A.1. General duties of Parents. -Parents shall have the following

general duties toward their children:

- To give them affection, companionship, and understanding;
- 2. To extend to them the benefits of moral guidance, selfdiscipline, and religious instruction;
- To supervise their activities, including their recreation;
- 4. To inculcate in them the value of industry, thrift and self-reliance;
- 5. To stimulate their interest in civic affairs, teach them the duties of citizenship, and develop their commitment to their country;
- 6. To advise them properly on any matter affecting their development and well-being;
- 7. To always set a good example;
- 8. To provide them with adequate support, as defined in Article 194 of the Family Code;
- 9. To administer their property, if any, according to their best interest, subject to the provisions of Article 225 to 227 of the Family Code; and
- 10. Such other duties that would redound to the strengthening of the family and the physical, emotional, mental, and moral well-being of the child.
- A.2 Separation of Children from their Families. - Every effort shall be made to prevent the separation of children from their families. Whenever children are

separated from their families owing to force majeure or in their own best interest, the City Social Welfare and Development Office and the other departments and units of the city government shall make the necessary arrangements for appropriate alternative family care or institutional placement, due regard being paid to the desirability of continuity in children upbringing in their own cultural milieu. Extended families, relatives and community institutions shall be given support to help meet the special needs of orphaned, displaced, and abandoned children. Efforts must be made to ensure that no child is treated as an outcast of society.

A.3. Role of Women. - Women play a critical role in the wellbeing of children. Efforts for the enhancement of women's status and their roles in development must begin with girl children. The enhancement of the status of women and their equal access to education, training, credit, reproductive health, and other extension services constitute a valuable contribution to a nation's social and economic development. To achieve that and to prepare women in their various roles, equal opportunity shall be provided for the children of female gender, for them to benefit from the health, nutrition, education and other basic services for their full growth.

A.4.Role of Fathers. - Fathers
play a vital role in their
children's lives. Policies and
legislations shall be enacted and
programs shall be designed for
the inclusion of their critical
role. Fathers shall be equally

responsible in the rearing and nurturing of the children in the home and be their role model. Equal opportunity shall be provided to the children of male gender for them to benefit from the health, nutrition, and other basic services for their full growth. Section 27. - Implement the various policy directives set forth by the CCPC, the City Mayor, or by the Sangguniang Panlungsod;
- p. Provide effective and sufficient provisions on the basic social needs of children and of the youth residing within the barangay which shall include projects and programs for children and youth welfare; and
- q. Implement the various applicable provisions of this Code, other ordinances, and national laws pertaining to child development and protection within the territorial jurisdiction of the barangay.

Section 39. Setting Up of Population-Based Day Care Centers. Pursuant to the provisions of Republic Act 10410 (the Early Years Act of 2013), day care centers shall be set up in every barangay in the City of Bacoor. The curriculum and programs to be implemented in the said centers shall comply with the provisions of RA 10410 and its implementing guidelines. The number of such centers shall depend on the population level of the children and how depressed the barangay is as determined by the CSWDO. Funding for the construction of the said centers shall be taken from the available funds of the barangay concerned or that of the city government. The City Engineer is hereby mandated to design and construct the said centers based on the recommendations of the City Health Office, the CSWDO, and the City Mayor.

Section 39. Setting Up of Population-Based Child Development Centers. Pursuant to the provisions of Republic Act 10410 (the Early Years Act of 2013), child development centers shall be set up in every barangay in the City of Bacoor. The curriculum and programs to be implemented in the said centers shall comply with the provisions of RA 10410 and its implementing guidelines. The number of such centers shall depend on the population level of the children and how depressed the barangay is as determined by the CSWDO. Funding for the construction of the said centers shall be taken from the available funds of the barangay concerned or that of the city government. The City Engineer is hereby mandated to design and construct the said centers based on the recommendations of the City Health Office, the CSWDO, and the City Mayor.

Section 40. Importance of Day Care Service. - Day care service addresses the needs in the crucial stages of a child's growth. By the age of Five (5), a child's brain has already grown to 90 percent of its adult weight and much of the way he/she envisions and interacts with the world has been shaped. Thus, the child's formative years and the care that he/she gets during this period would significantly affect his/her learning capacity, personal and social interaction well into adulthood.

While parents have the primary responsibility to provide for their children's physical, emotional, psychological, mental and social needs, day care services aims to supplemental the inability of some parents to provide their children with the proper care and home environment.

Section 40. Importance of Child Development Service. - Child Development service addresses the needs in the crucial stages of a child's growth. Thus, the child's formative years and the care that he/she gets during this period would significantly affect his/her learning capacity, personal and social interaction.

While parents have the primary responsibility to provide for their children's physical, emotional, psychological, mental and social needs, child development services aim to supplement the inability of some parents to provide their children with the proper care and home environment.

Section 41. Setting Up of Day Care Centers by Community Based Organizations. - Community-based organizations can help mobilize resources to complement the efforts of the City in establishing day care centers in their communities. In this way, more children needing attention can be reached.

Section 45. Mandatory Celebration of November as National Children's Month - The month of November of every year is hereby mandated to be observed and celebrated as National Children's Month pursuant to Republic Act No. 10661 which was signed into law on 25 May 2015. The CSWDO, in coordination with the DepEd and other stakeholders, shall prepare programs in celebration of National Children's Month and shall conduct child-focused activities for the month promoting the right and responsibilities of Filipino children as well as the obligations of the people and institutions responsible in ensuring the wellbeing of Filipino children.

Section 45. Mandatory Celebration of November as National Children's Month.- The month of November of every year is hereby mandated to be observed and celebrated as National Children's Month pursuant to Republic Act No. 10661 which was signed into law on 25 May 2015. The CSWDO, in coordination with the CCPC and other stakeholders, shall prepare programs in celebration of National Children's Month and shall conduct child-focused activities for the month promoting the right and responsibilities of Filipino children as well as the obligations of the people and institutions responsible in ensuring the well-being of Filipino children.

Section 50. Prohibited Acts

The City Legal Officer, in coordination with the members of the City Council for the Protection of Children, shall submit the Implementing Rules and Regulations of City Ordinance No. 6-2016 as hereby amended for the approval of the City Mayor not later than sixty (60) days from the effectivity date hereof.

Section 6. Repeal Clause. All ordinances, resolutions, executive orders, and other local issuances that are inconsistent with the provisions of City Ordinance No. 6-2016 as amended are hereby repealed and/or modified accordingly.

Section 7. Separability of Provisions. If any provision of this Ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstance, is held invalid by a competent court of law, the remainder of the Ordinance and the application of such

provision to other persons or circumstances shall not be affected thereby.

Section 8. Effectivity. This Ordinance shall take effect after ten (10) days from the date a copy hereof is posted in a bulletin board at the entrance of the Bacoor City Hall and in at least two (2) other conspicuous places in the City of Bacoor not later than five (5) days after the approval hereof.
