Subject: AN ORDINANCE MANDATING THE MONTHLY UPDATING OF ALL NEGATIVE LISTS BEING MAINTAINED BY VARIOUS DEPARTMENTS OF THE CITY GOVERNMENT OF THE CITY OF BACOOR, CAVITE AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS HEREOF. (PCO 2025-048 dated 08 September 2025).

This committee report pertains to the committee hearing conducted on September 18, 2025 followed by a public hearing held on September 25, 2025 relative to the above-stated subject matter. The hearing was presided over by Hon. Miguel N. Bautista, Chairperson of the Committee on Ethics, Appointments and Government Reorganization and was held at the Sangguniang Panlungsod Session Hall situated on the 6th Floor of the BLDR Building, Bacoor Government Center, Barangay Bayanan, Bacoor City, Cavite.

FINDINGS:

After a thorough deliberation and consultation with Barangay Officials, Department Heads, and representatives from the business and private sectors, the Committee finds the following:

 The proposed ordinance seeks to institutionalize the monthly updating and consolidation of "negative lists" from all city departments. These lists will include

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individuals, businesses, or institutions with unsettled violations of city laws and ordinances.

- The heads of many departments of the City Government have not regularly updated the said negative lists resulting in the ineffective implementation and enforcement of various city laws, ordinances, and government regulations.
- The E-Governance Department was identified as the lead office responsible for consolidating these lists into a centralized database, ensuring accessibility to all concerned departments.
- The Committee emphasized that the negative list is distinct from a blacklist.
 - A blacklist implies permanent disqualification.
 - A negative list, however, is conditional and temporary; once fines are paid or violations settled, names may be removed.
- The ordinance is designed to cover a wide range of violations, including but not limited to:
 - Bacoor Traffic Management Department (BTMD) traffic and transport violations
 - Office of the Building Official (OBO) building code violations
 - City Environment and Natural Resources/Services Office (CENRO/CESD) environmental violations
 - Business Permits and Licensing Office (BPLO) business permit and regulatory violations
 - City Social Welfare and Development (CSWD) social services–related violations, if any
 - All Barangays non-compliance with local directives and ordinances
- Resource persons, including Barangay Officials, the Bacoor Chamber of Commerce, and Homeowners' Associations, expressed general support for the measure, acknowledging its potential to:
 - Promote stricter compliance with ordinances;
 - Prevent violators from bypassing accountability through government transactions;
 - Strengthen the enforcement capacity of barangays by adapting the system into their own clearance processes.
 - Creates a centralized and transparent record of violations, easily accessible for monitoring and enforcement.
- The Human Resources Development and Management Department (HRDMD) submits its consolidated recommendations, aligned with the 2025 Rules on Administrative Cases in the Civil Service (2025 RACCS) and the 2025 Omnibus Rules on Appointments and Other Human Resources Actions (2025 ORAOHRA).

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· The Original draft prescribed stand-alone penalties that may conflict with the uniform penalty structure under the 2025 RACCS Rule 10 (Schedule of Penalties). The revised Section 5 aligns penalties with CSC rules for light, less grave, and grave offenses as classified under Rule 10, Sections 124-126.

Original	Provision	of PCO	2025-048
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Section 5. Penalties. The following administrative penalties imposed against any person that shall violate this Ordinance pursuant to pertinent civil service regulations:

fine First Offense: Payment amounting to P5,000.00 with written reprimand issued by the Mayor.

Second Offense: Suspension without pay for thirty (30) working days.

Third Offense: Termination from employment.

Proposed Amendments OF PCO 2025-048

Revised Draft (CSC-Aligned)

Section 5. Penalties. Violations of this Ordinance shall administrative offenses and shall be referred to the appropriate disciplining authority in accordance with the 2025 Rules on Administrative Cases in the Civil Service (2025 RACCS), Rule 10.

a.) Light Offenses (Rule 10, sec 126)

First Offense: Reprimand (no monetary

Second Offense: Suspension of one [1] to thirty (30) days

Third Offense: Dismissal from service

b.)Less Grave Offenses (Rule 10, Sec 125) First Offense: Suspension of one (1) month and one (1) day to six (6) months Second Offense: Dismissal from service

c.) Grave Offenses (Rule 10, Sec 124) First Offense: Dismissal from service with accessory penalties of cancellation of eligibility, forfeiture of retirement benefits, perpetual disqualification from holding public office, and bar from taking civil service examinations

Section 6 (not included in original draft)

Implementation

Section 6. Implementation and Coordination.

The City Mayor, pursuant to Section 455 of Republic Act No. 7160 (Local Government Code of 1991), shall issue the Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) of this Ordinance within sixty (60) days from its effectivity. The Human

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Resources Development and Management Department (HRDMD) shall coordinate with all offices and departments, provide technical guidance, and assist in drafting the IRR to ensure harmonization with: a.)The Strategic Performance Management System (SPMS); b.)The Public Sector Rationalization and Institutional Management for Excellence in Human Resource Management (PRIME-HRM); c.)Existing E-Governance platforms and personnel information systems; and d.) All applicable CSC issuances, including the 2025 RACCS and 2025 ORAOHRA. The IRR shall clearly define the roles, responsibilities, timelines, and procedural requirements for compliance across all offices and departments of the City Government of Bacoor.

 The Committee observed that while the proposed ordinance does not explicitly. provide for the removal process from the negative list, this may be addressed in the drafting of its Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR).

RECOMMENDATION:

In view of the foregoing, and after careful evaluation, the Committee recommends the APPROVAL of the proposed ordinance entitled:

"AN ORDINANCE MANDATING THE MONTHLY UPDATING OF ALL NEGATIVE LISTS BEING MAINTAINED BY VARIOUS DEPARTMENTS OF THE CITY GOVERNMENT OF BACOOR, CAVITE, AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION THEREOF."

A committee hearing was held on September 18, 2025 at the Sangguniang Panlungsod Session Hall regarding the aforementioned subject matter with the following attendees. (See attached attendance sheet)

The hearing was presided over by Committee Chair Hon. Miguel Bautista. He also led the prayer, gave his opening remarks and acknowledged the presence of all the committee members and resource persons as well.

Councilor Palabrica emphasized that the proposed ordinance seeks to mandate all departments to maintain and update a list of individuals, businesses, or institutions found violating city laws and ordinances.

The E-Governance Department Department was identified as having a crucial role in consolidating and maintaining an accessible system of these lists for all

Atty. Khalid Atega, SP Secretary, clarified that the ordinance arose from the need for a uniform process in updating negative lists. Departments implementing ordinances must submit updated lists monthly to ensure accurate assessment of permits and applications.

It was further explained that the negative list is not the same as a blacklist. A negative list only reflects current violations but allows individuals or businesses to correct their infractions by paying fines or complying with legal requirements.

Councilor Galvez asked whether a person with a traffic violation would be affected in applying for a business permit.

> o Response: Yes, unless the violation is settled, the business permit may be held pending compliance.

Councilor Gawaran inquired if "negative list" is synonymous with "blacklist."

 Response: No, blacklisting is permanent, while a negative list is temporary and conditional upon compliance.

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The draft ordinance does not explicitly provide a process for removal from the negative list. The Committee suggested including such a provision in the Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR).

The ordinance will also help enforce graduated penalties (1st, 2nd, 3rd offense), which currently lack proper monitoring due to the absence of a centralized system.

The ordinance strengthens accountability across all departments by ensuring violations are properly recorded.

The E-Governance Department plays a vital role in establishing a city-wide database accessible to concerned offices.

The ordinance supports the efficient implementation of the Express Business Permit Ordinance, preventing violators from bypassing accountability.

There being no other matters to be discussed, the hearing was suspended at 11:03 am.

A public hearing was held on September 25, 2025 at the Sangguniang Panlungsod Session Hall regarding the aforementioned subject matter with the following attendees. (See attached attendance sheet)

The hearing was presided over by Committee Chair Hon. Miguel Bautista. He also led the prayer, gave his opening remarks and acknowledged the presence of all the committee members and resource persons as well.

The Chairperson explained that the measure seeks to institutionalize the monthly updating and consolidation of "negative lists" maintained by various city departments, with the E-Governance Department as the central database.

The Committee clarified that a negative list is temporary and names shall be removed upon settlement of penalties, unlike a blacklist, which implies permanent disqualification.

Departments identified to submit and update lists include:

- Bacoor Traffic Management Department (traffic violations)
- o Office of the Building Official (building code violations)
- City Environment and Services Office (environmental violations)
- o Business Permits and Licensing Department (business-related violations)
- Barangays (compliance with directives and local ordinances)

The following penalties were discussed:

- 1st offense: Reprimand (no monetary fine)
- o 2nd offense: 30-day suspension without pay
- o 3rd offense: termination from employment

Barangay Officials expressed support, noting that the system can also be adapted to strengthen barangay clearance processes.

Business sector representatives raised concerns on whether companies would be penalized for violations of their employees. The Committee clarified that:

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- o Individual violations (e.g., traffic tickets) remain personal.
- Corporate violations (e.g., lack of permits, environmental lapses) are charged to the company.

Resource persons agreed that the ordinance would help monitor repeat offenders and enforce graduated penalties.

Several participants acknowledged that violators often bypass accountability due to lack of centralized monitoring.

The ordinance is expected to improve compliance, enforcement, and coordination among departments and barangays.

The Human Resources Development and Management Department (HRDMD) submits its consolidated recommendations, aligned with the 2025 Rules on Administrative Cases in the Civil Service (2025 RACCS) and the 2025 Omnibus Rules on Appointments and Other Human Resources Actions (2025 ORAOHRA).

The Original draft prescribed stand-alone penalties that may conflict with the uniform penalty structure under the 2025 RACCS Rule 10 (Schedule of Penalties). Dear Hon. Bautista:

In response to your instruction to review and redraft Section 5 (Penalties) of the proposed ordinance, the Human Resources Development and Management Department (HRDMD) respectfully submits its consolidated recommendations, aligned with the 2025 Rules on Administrative Cases in the Civil Service (2025 RACCS) and the 2025 Omnibus Rules on Appointments and Other Human Resource Actions (2025 ORAOHRA).

I. RATIONALE FOR REVISIONS

- Alignment with CSC Penalty System The original draft prescribed stand-alone penalties that may conflict with the uniform penalty structure under the 2025 RACCS, Rule 10 (Schedule of Penalties). The revised Section 5 aligns penalties with CSC rules for light, less grave, and grave offenses as classified under Rule 10, Sections 124–126.
- Due Process Safeguards The revised draft incorporates procedural due process requirements under Rule 4 (Formal Charge and Preliminary Conference) and Rule 5 (Answer and Formal Investigation) of the 2025 RACCS, ensuring notice, opportunity to be heard, and right to appeal before penalties are imposed.
- Finality of Findings for Negative List Inclusion Only employees with final and executory administrative or judicial findings may be included in the Negative List, consistent with Rule 17 (Finality and Execution of Decisions) of the 2025 RACCS, protecting employees from reputational harm arising from unresolved cases.
- Department Head Accountability Liability is clarified consistent with Rule 10, Section 125(j) (Neglect of Duty) and Section 124(a) (Gross Neglect of Duty), applying only in cases of willful neglect or gross negligence that directly result in non-compliance, and not for matters beyond reasonable control or good faith errors.
- System Integration and Implementation A new Section 6 clarifies HRDMD's role in coordinating and providing technical guidance for the Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR), while the Mayor retains authority to issue it, consistent with Section 455 of Republic Act No. 7160 (Local Government Code of 1991).

Section 6. Implementation Coordination. The City Mayor, pursuant to Section 455 of Republic Act No. 7160 (Local Government Code of 1991), shall issue the Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) of this Ordinance within sixty (60) days from its effectivity. The Human Resources Development and Management Department (HRDMD) shall with all offices coordinate departments, provide technical guidance, and assist in drafting the IRR to ensure harmonization with: a) The Strategic Performance Management (SPMS); b) The Public Sector Rationalization and Institutional Management for Excellence in Human Resource Management (PRIME-HRM); c) Existing E-Governance platforms and personnel information systems; and d) All applicable CSC issuances, including the 2025 RACCS and 2025 ORAOHRA. The IRR shall clearly define the roles responsibilities, timelines, and procedural requirements for compliance across all offices and departments of the City Government of Bacoor.

III. LEGAL BASES AND SUPPORTING AUTHORITIES

The following laws, rules, and regulations support the proposed revisions:

 2025 Rules on Administrative Cases in the Civil Service (2025 RACCS) – Promulgated under CSC Resolution No. 2500314 dated April 15, 2025, the 2025 RACCS is the







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governing framework for all administrative disciplinary proceedings in the civil service. It supersedes the 2017 RACCS and integrates recent legislative changes including Republic Act No. 11032 (Ease of Doing Business and Efficient Government Service Delivery Act of 2018).

- o Rule 4 Formal Charge and Preliminary Conference
- o Rule 5 Answer and Formal Investigation
- Rule 10 Schedule of Penalties:
 - Section 124 Grave Offenses and Penalties
 - Section 125 Less Grave Offenses and Penalties
 - Section 126 Light Offenses and Penalties
- Rule 17 Finality and Execution of Decisions
- 2025 Omnibus Rules on Appointments and Other Human Resource Actions (2025 ORAOHRA) Promulgated under CSC Resolution No. 2500358 dated April 30, 2025, effective August 2, 2025. The 2025 ORAOHRA governs personnel actions including appointments, promotions, and maintenance of personnel records; ensures that negative findings are properly documented only upon finality.
- Republic Act No. 7160 (Local Government Code of 1991), Section 455 Grants the local
 chief executive the authority to promulgate implementing rules and regulations of local
 ordinances.
- Republic Act No. 6713 (Code of Conduct and Ethical Standards for Public Officials and Employees) – Establishes ethical standards and accountability mechanisms for public service.
- Republic Act No. 11032 (Ease of Doing Business and Efficient Government Service Delivery Act of 2018) – Mandates streamlined processes and accountability in government service delivery.
- Public Sector Rationalization and Institutional Management for Excellence in Human Resource Management (PRIME-HRM) – DBM-CSC Joint Circular No. 2004-1, establishing standards for HR management systems in government.
- ISO 9001:2015 Quality Management System Requires documented procedures, compliance monitoring, and continual improvement in service delivery, aligned with the City's commitment to quality governance.

IV. RECOMMENDATION

The HRDMD respectfully recommends the adoption of the revised Section 5 and the new Section 6 as the official text of the ordinance. These revisions ensure:

- Legal Compliance with the 2025 RACCS and all applicable CSC rules and regulations;
- Protection of Employee Rights through strict adherence to procedural due process;
- Integrity of Personnel Records by limiting Negative List inclusion to final and executory findings only;
- Proportionate Accountability for Department Heads, avoiding automatic liability for matters beyond their control;
- Consistency with Existing Systems including SPMS, PRIME-HRM, and E-Governance platforms; and
- Clear Implementation Guidance through a well-defined IRR process.









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V. CONCLUSION

Incorporating these adjustments will create a balanced, legally sound framework that upholds accountability, protects the constitutional and statutory rights of government personnel, and strengthens compliance with national civil service policies and local governance standards.

The HRDMD remains committed to providing technical assistance in drafting the IRR upon enactment of the ordinance and to ensuring seamless integration with existing human resource systems. The Department stands ready to provide clarification or further legal and technical support as may be required by the Honorable Sangguniang Panlungsod.

This recommendation reflects our shared commitment to public service excellence, fairness, and the development of a compassionate yet accountable civil service for the people of Bacoor.
