**SUBJECT: AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND MODIFYING CERTAIN SECTIONS OF CITY ORDINANCE NO. 47-2019 (OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE "ROAD CLEARING ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BACOOR"). (PCO-2024-206 September 9, 2024)**

This report pertains to the proposed amendments to certain provisions of City Ordinance No. 47-2019 (the "Road Clearing Ordinance of the City of Bacoor") as requested by the Honorable City Mayor, Strike B. Revilla, in a letter dated 20 August 2024 sent to the Sangguniang Panlungsod.

The said matter was referred to the Committee on Public Transportation and Traffic Management and to the Committee on Rules and Privileges, Laws and Ordinances on September 9, 2024.

The joint committee conducted on September 24, 2024 and October 2, 2024. The said hearings were attended by various members of the general public including officials of various barangays, the Bacoor Traffic Management Department, the City Engineering Office and other stakeholders. Attached to this report as **Annexes "A", "A-1", "A-2" and "A-3"**, respectively, are the minutes and attendance sheets of the said hearings.

**FINDINGS:**

On September 16, 2024, the City Engineering Office submitted a list of primary roads (national and provincial roads) and secondary roads (city and barangay roads) which should be included in the amended version of CO 47-2019 for the consideration of the Joint Committee. A copy of the said list is attached hereto as **Annex "B"**. The Joint Committee received a copy of the proposed ordinance from the Office of the City Mayor. A copy of the draft of the proposed ordinance is attached hereto as **Annex "C"**.

The Joint Committee notes that 18 primary roads and 123 secondary roads were recommended by the City Engineer for inclusion in the proposed ordinance. Considering that the said roads are located in various barangays in the City, the Joint Committee gave the barangays concerned sufficient time to comment on the same and to submit their recommendations to the Joint Committee. On October 2, 2024, the representatives of the various barangays of the City informed their Joint Committee about the list of roads as well as the various amendments needed to be done to the provisions of the proposed ordinance.

During the course of the said hearings, the Joint Committee informed the attendees that the commitment of the City of Bacoor is to ensure that the national, provincial and city roads, including all Solidarity Routes across the City of Bacoor, are free





from any obstacle or encroachment that may impede the free flow of vehicular traffic, commuters and goods pursuant to Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG) Memorandum Circular No. 2024-053 on the nationwide implementation of the Barangay road clearing operation under the Bagong Pilipinas Program relative to DILG Memorandum Circular No. 2022-085, providing guidelines in the implementation of road clearing operations in the new normal.

**RECOMMENDATION:**

After thorough study, review, and deliberation on the submitted draft ordinance, and to have a balance vehicular volume vis-à-vis the available road capacity to provide acceptable conditions to travelers within the City of Bacoor, also taking into account the inclusion of new solidarity routes, identification of city roads and recent DILG issuances on road clearing, the committee hereby recommends the **APPROVAL** of the following amendments on City Ordinance No. 47-2019, to wit:

All other roads that may be subsequently declared as national roads, provincial roads, city roads, or solidarity routes after the effectivity of this Ordinance shall automatically be covered by the prohibition on parking.

The Joint Committee recommends that the following provisions be inserted in the proposed ordinance: (a) directing the BTMD to install appropriate NO PARKING signs on all roads covered by the said ordinance that are clear and visible to all drivers and pedestrians, (b) the City Information and Community Relations Department shall assist in







the dissemination of information on the proposed ordinance to the public, and (c) the various barangays shall aid in installing NO PARKING signs and in the dissemination public information in their respective localities.

After very careful and precise review and deliberation by the Committee, it is recommended to **APPROVE** the proposed ordinance pending the revisions recommended by the Joint Committee.

This report resolves an ordinance amending and modifying certain sections of City Ordinance No. 47-2019 (otherwise known as "Road Clearing Ordinance of the City of Bacoor") The said amendment was referred to Committee on Public Transportation as lead committee and Committee on Rules as sub-committee by the Sangguniang Panlungsod Presiding Officer, Hon. Rowena Baulista-Mendiola, on September 9, 2024.

The committee hearing was held on September 24, 2024 at 10:00 am. It was presided over by the Committee Chairman, Hon. Roberto L. Advincula, in attendance were Committee Vice Chairman Hon. Adrielito Gawaran, Committee Members Hon. Reynaldo Fabian and Hon. Michael Solis with Sub Committee on Rules and Privileges, Laws, and Ordinances Committee Chairman Hon. Reynaldo Palabrica, Committee Vice-Chairman by Hon. Levy Tela with Committee Member Hon. Alex Gutierrez. In attendance were Hon. Palm Buncio, Hon. Randy Francisco, Mr. Adel Udarbe from Bacoor Traffic Management Department, Atty. Nathaniel De Leon from City Legal Services Office, Mr. Christian Gawaran from the Business Permit Licensing Office, Ms. Sunnybelle Basconcillo FOSCHAI President and Barangay representatives from various Barangays of District 1 and District 2.

Ms. Basconcillo FOSCHAI President, appreciated the proposed ordinance since operations had been conducted at Camella Springville on different occasions during the last four (4) months. She reiterates that these operations affected the businesses along Camella which is declared as Solidarity Route. She recommended to have a window hour in order to continue businesses operation. Especially when traffic on major routes in heavy, Camella was occupying many business owners with business permits, as we all know.

Mr. Udarbe from BTMD, informed everyone that Camella is categorized as residential. Those categorized as commercial established are required to provide parking spaces to their clients and most request traffic impact assessment to determine the impact on street businesses. According to Mr. Udarbe, this will only help Camella's commercial district, and we should also take the subdivision's homeowners into account.





Mr. Gawaran of the Office of Business Permits and Licenses said that they were starting to reclassify all of the residential buildings that were constructed to set off a commercial space in conjunction with the Zoning and Assessor's office,

In accordance with DILG Memorandum Circular No. 2024-053, which is also known as the Nationwide implementation of the Barangay Road clearing operations, assessment, validation, and recognition under the Bagong Pilipinas Program, Mr. Udarbe stated that the BTMD, with the assistance of BPLO and CICU, serve notice of violation to those establishments that violates the utilization of roads for parking, service area, etc., in order to satisfy the demands of their customers at some point in 2025. Ms. Basconcillo, has no objection and requested that this ordinance be properly announced and explained to all concerned.

Hon. Solis suggested that since the road is wide and have no impact on traffic flow, it might be reasonable to allow them to park on both sides. It makes sense for an official to enforce the law, but the business owners give contribution to the City's revenue, the Council should give some thought on this. Mr. Udarbe reported before the Committee that if the Council permits this consideration, they will submit sound discretion.

Hon. Francisco agreed to take into account for the window hour, and the BTMD might look at the time. To be fair, he requested to include other routes with wide road and with a lot of commercial venues to have window hours, rather than focusing solely on Camella.

Hon. Buncio said that if it's feasible, a possible construction of a parking lot or other area for customers, similar to what other cities are doing, to reduce traffic and road congestion.

Mr. Montoya, who lives along Habay, expressed his worry about the electric bikes with sidecar and minibuses in front of SM Bacoor, which is being used as terminal, creates traffic on the route.

As Vice-Chairman, Hon. Gawaran guarantees that they will address all of the difficulties and concerns regarding this ordinance to serve the public accordingly.

In order to accept more suggestions, deliberate and review the above-mentioned subject, the barangay chairman from District 1 and 2 will be invited on the next scheduled hearing.

Hon. Gawaran, raised for the adjournment of the committee hearing at 11:30 a.m.



This report resolves an ordinance amending and modifying certain sections of City Ordinance No. 47-2019 (otherwise known as "Road Clearing Ordinance of the City of Bacoor") (The said amendment was referred to the Committee by the Sangguniang Panlungsod Presiding Officer, Hon. Rowena Bautista-Mendiola, on September 9, 2024.)

The committee hearing was held on the date stated above. It was presided over by the Committee Chairman, Hon. Roberto L. Advincula together with Committee Vice Chairman Hon. Adrielito Gawaran Committee Member Hon. Michael Solis together with Joint Committee on Rules and Privileges, Laws, and Ordinance Committee Chairman Hon. Reynaldo Palabrica, Committee Vice-Chairman by Hon. Levy Tela with committee member Hon. Alex Gutierrez. In attendance were Hon. Rogelio Nolasco, Hon. Simplicio Dominguez, Hon. Rafael Paterno ABC President with Members, Ms. Leslie Diane Morales, Mr. Adel Udarbe and Mr. Rommel Bunag from Bacoor Traffic Management Department, Atty. Nathaniel De Leon from City Legal Services Office, Mr. Christian Gawaran from the Business Permit Licensing Office, Engr. Kyle Germaine M. Anciro from City Engineering Office and Barangay Chairpersons from District 1 and District 2 provide with attendance sheet list.

According to Mr. Udarbe, the City Ordinance No. 47 Series of 2019 will be revised by this ordinance. Here, more roadways that were not covered by the prior ordinance will be included. The mission here is to add the roads such example River Drive, Bacoor - Imus Diversion etc., as he encourages the Chairpersons if they have any questions about this ordinance lets discuss thus this would be finalized today to allow our honorable councilors to create effective legislation appropriately.

The performance of our duty and responsibility resulted in a misunderstanding with the people as well. Mr. Udarbe assured us that we could cooperate and that they were not adversaries. We simply want to carry out our duties and look forward to being of assistance to you in any manner we can. since this is required by DILG and backed by an ordinance. Our BTMD Chief is also present, and you can ask questions from our City Legal staff if you need any explanations.

Hon. Francisco told the Chairpersons that it depends on whether they choose to have this Ordinance implemented in their jurisdiction. Could you help our Honorable City Councilors to complete this. Everyone is welcome today to choose which routes should be covered by this regulation. In order to prevent parking at Brgy. Poblacion he created a few roadways. If at all possible, this ordinance should include the following streets such as:

1. Plaza De Padre Mariano Gomez Roads, Tabing Dagat
2. Pagtakhan St., Tabing Dagat,
3. Tincoco St., Camposanto
4. E. Gomez St., (Camposanto & Daang Bukid)
5. F. Gaudier St., (Daang Bukid & Tabing Dagat)
6. A. Aragon St., (Camposanto & Daang Bukid)
7. J. Ocampo St., Tabing Dagat
8. H. Rubio St., Tabing Dagat
9. L. Castro St., Tabing Dagat
10. Fisherman's Village, Tabing Dagat
  - First Street
  - Second Street
  - Third Street
  - Fourth Street

Kap. May Torrijos from Brgy. P.F. Espiritu also suggests in this ordinance to extend the replacement from Floraville Subdivision to Family Village 3rd St., covering the stretch from the main road to Family Dulo. Furthermore, if possible, please consider allowing one-sided parking on the right side of the road of the Barangay Hall of P.F. Espiritu in Floraville Subdivision at all times.

Brgy. Chairman of Molino 3, Hon. Jun Advincula cleared the National or Main Road and Secondary Roads from this ordinance's purview. As Kap. Agcopra Jr. of Brgy. Aniban 1 asked the Bacoor Traffic Management's or the City Government's long-term plan for the Zapote-Molino Road to Zapote/Aniban to Molino/Dasmaringas Boundary, as there are a lot of public jeepneys parked here. The city governments have continuously backed by Barangay Aniban 1 over the years. All we need is a tangible management strategy for this issue.

Mr. Udarbe said that rigorous enforcement of this legislation will be the long-term solution to reduce traffic. Many of our constituents who own cars do not have access to designated parking spaces. Additionally, it is suggested that if they have an open or available space, they can construct a parking lot and charge fees. Alternatively, it might be the old arrangement that allowed them to park with time allocation because we had no other routes to go. However, in order to achieve a solution that benefits all parties, this is obviously done with the Hon. municipal councils' approval. We are unable to accommodate someone who wants a car but does not have a parking space.

In addition to the terminals on Zapote Road, we spoke with the legal department yesterday about the LRT station that would be a part of their plan to construct a massive





multi-portal terminal. It will be situated somewhere along Molino Boulevard so that the attendant can serve all of the passengers. Let's be more patient, and this will be resolved eventually. Since some of the roads lack sidewalks, let's regulate them in a safe location for the long run. Once more if the councils will approve of this ordinance.

According to Kap. Agcopra Jr., he brought up the issue with this main road; do we currently have a solution? Furthermore, our city mayor mentioned years ago that a barangay may construct a temporary terminal to house public utility jeepneys; however, because our area is congested and primarily residential, there isn't enough room for them to be properly set up.

For a brief rest, Ms. Morales responded. She met with Col. Paul Carracedo and Mayor Strike B. Revilla yesterday, and she began working to clear the area as directed by the city mayor. We will meet with the transportation group to determine a location for their temporary terminal while we wait for the LRT Project for the aforementioned Multi Portal Terminal, which will be able to accommodate all types of public transportation vehicles. We are currently working to resolve this issue.

Hon. Jun Advincula, the chairman of Molino 3, expressed his concern that the Camella Springville, one of the Solidarity Routes, would be impacted by this ordinance, which would convert roughly 500-600 residential homes to commercial space. He asked if we could discuss this matter with the BPLO because they are misinformed when they are caught parking illegally or without permission, whereby these business owners assert that it is their right and why apprehended while the City Government granted them a business permit so it is the right of their customer to park in front of their establishment. His proposition, if possible, not to issue permit to those establishments with provisions of parking space.

For the River Drive Road, he added, if it is feasible, to categorize the vehicles that are permitted to pass by so that they are aware and avoid being apprehended.

Ms. Morales accepted the suggestion made by Hon. Advincula is in possession of business permits. Additionally, we offered advice to individuals doing emission tests along Aguinaldo Highway who do not have client parking spaces. Let's bring up this issue with the BPLD.

Anyway, According to Hon. Jun Advincula, since these business owners or establishments also contribute to the city's revenue, we should take them into considerations.

According to Hon. Palabrica, everything is legitimate, and these businesses have helped the city's finances. We should take into account the financial aspects of commercial establishments, barangays, and the city government's business permit fees. Please let us know your thoughts on traffic management in this specific location. The councils will review them to ensure that it is equitable and balanced for all parties. If these businesses are impacted, they would suffer significant losses, may have to close, and many people will lose their jobs. For both private and public individuals, this is the financial

drawback. Consequently, irregation is appropriate and we ought to establish policies that promote win-win situation.

In response, Mr. Udarbe stated that this matter was brought up during our most recent public hearing. This business was previously designated as residential; the Zoning and Assessments Department will reclassify it. As we investigate Ms. Sunnybelle's proposal from FOSCHA regarding the window hour. We are attempting to investigate this recommendation. This road was too wide for traffic; hence it was impassable.

Hon. Jun Advincula, if this ordinance is put into effect, parking should not be restricted to one person, and rigorous adherence is required to ensure equity for all. Only commercial establishments with parking should be granted business permits upon renewal, if at all possible. They will not be able to obtain a permit if there is no parking. However, it is strongly advised for the Councils to investigate this suggestion further for a political standpoint.

Hon. Palabrica stated that the council will consider the recommendations and suggestions made for the specified thoroughfares in determining the appropriate time frame for those areas. strongly advise the BTMD to approve the proposal for the specified period of time and allow them to park without restriction.


Hon. Gowaran agreed to the said timeframe to be given at the Camella Springville for the continuity of their business.

Hon. Jun Advincula wanted to be fair to other roads and did not agree to be given this kind of consideration or exception. He went on to say that we are attending to the political aspects of the mayor and all of us who were elected by the people.

Hon. Palabrica said the Councils will take note the manifestation of Hon. Jun Advincula. It is good that we are able to hear your suggestions and concerns. This is very important for the councils in helping in drafting of this ordinance. Everyone has a copy of the said ordinance and if they have opposition re with the additional list of road and streets that should be no parking so we should further study.

After the foregoing discussion the hearing was adjourned at exactly 03:20pm.
