Subject: **RESOLUTION APPROVING AND GRANTING PROVISIONAL ACCREDITATION OF THREE (3) CIVIL SOCIETY ORGANIZATIONS (CSOs) NAMELY: (1) BACOR RESPONSIBLE ORGANIZATION, INC. REPRESENTED BY MS. CLEOF MORAL; (2) VISACOL-LUZON, INC. REPRESENTED BY MS. GEMMA VINZON; AND (3) CITY OF BACOR MINISTRIES ASSOCIATION REPRESENTED BY PASTOR MANUEL BALDON. (PCR 164-2025 dated September 22, 2025).**

During the Hybrid Session of the 6th Sangguniang Panlungsod, chaired over by presiding officer Hon. Rowena Bautista-Mendiola held on September 22, 2025, the above subject was referred to the Committee on Non-Government Organizations.

FINDINGS:

A crisis or emergency is a dangerous situation that needs to be addressed right away. It can be caused by natural disasters, accidents, or human actions and requires immediate action to prevent harm or further damage.

Concerning this particular matter, Hon. Strike B. Revilla aims to issue an executive order establishing the Bacoor City Peace and Order Council. The following organizations were considered to join the aforementioned council:

1. **Bacoor Responsible Organization, Inc.**, represented by Ms. Cleofe Moral
2. **Visacol-Luzon Inc.**, represented by Ms. Gemma Vinzon
3. **City of Bacoor Ministries Association**, represented by Ptr. Samuel C. Baldon

The City of Bacoor Ministries and the Bacoor Responsible Organization, Inc. will receive a provisional accreditation due to their lack of requirements necessary for the application of their accreditation. On the other hand, Visacol-Luzon Inc., now Visacol National Livelihood Community Inc., had its accreditation approved on September 8, 2025, during the tenth regular session.





RECOMMENDATION:

After careful consideration, the Committee recommends that the Bacoor Responsible Organization, Inc., and the City of Bacoor Ministries Association be **granted provisional accreditation.**





The Hybrid Session of the 6th Sangguniang Panlungsod was chaired over by presiding officer, Vice Mayor Rowena Bautista - Mendiola held on September 22, 2025. The session was formally opened at 10:00 am by the presiding officer and a quorum was declared.

A letter addressed to Hon. Rowena Bautista - Mendiola was received by the Sangguniang Panlungsod on September 18, 2025 from City Administrator, Atty. Aimee Torre Franca - Neri pertaining to the list of CSO for provisional accreditation.

Hon. Strike B. Revilla intends to issue an executive order creating the Peace and Order Council. Among other CSOs and NGOs, the following organizations were eyed to be part of the aforementioned council:

1. **Bacoor Responsible Organization, Inc.**, represented by Ms. Cleofe Moral
2. **Visacol-Luzon Inc.**, represented by Ms. Gemma Vinzon
3. **City of Bacoor Ministries Association**, represented by Ptr. Samuel C. Baldon

The Visacol-Luzon, now Visacol National Livelihood Community Inc., with SEC CRN 2025080215857-07, already renewed their accreditation. The committee hearing was held on the 4th day of September 2025. Their application for accreditation was approved on September 8, 2025, during the 10th regular session.

The provisional accreditation will last for no more than 60 days. The Bacoor Responsible Organization Inc. and the City of Bacoor Ministries must adhere to the guidelines on the application of accreditation by submitting the necessary documentation within this time frame. Failure to comply will result in the provisional accreditation being revoked after the specified period.

The Chairperson shall preside in the meetings of the Council. The Vice Chairperson shall act as Chairperson in the absence of the latter.

Section 2. Functions of the City Development Council. — The CDC shall exercise the following functions:

1. Formulate long-term, medium-term, and annual socio-economic development plans and policies, including the Executive-Legislative Agenda (ELA) for 2022-2026;
2. Formulate the medium-term and annual public investment programs (Annual Development Plan and Annual Investment Plan);
3. Appraise and prioritize socio-economic development programs and projects;
4. Formulate Local Development and Investment Program (LDIP) to promote the inflow and direction of private investment capital;
5. Spearhead the amendment of the Comprehensive Land Use Plan (CLUP);
6. Coordinate, monitor, and evaluate the implementation of development programs and projects; and
7. Perform such other functions as may be provided by law or component authority.
