Subject: *An ordinance governing the contract of affiliation of students from medical, nursing, midwifery, and other allied health courses for clinical and community immersion in the city health facilities and providing for the standardization of affiliation fees.*

(Date referred: March 23, 2026)

The above-mentioned proposed ordinance underwent its first reading on March 23, 2026 during the 35th Regular Session of the 6th Sangguniang Panlungsod. The said proposed ordinance was referred by the Presiding Officer, City Vice Mayor Hon. Rowena Bautista Mendiola to the Committee on Health and Sanitation.

The Committee on Health and Sanitation sent out invitations to the resource persons and conducted a committee hearing on March 26, 2026 at the Session Hall of the Sangguniang Panlungsod.

After due consultation and deliberation hereby report back to this August Body the findings, information gathered, and recommendation on the above-subject matter. Attached hereto are the attendance sheet and photos taken during the said hearing.

FINDINGS:

This proposed ordinance was written and submitted due to the need to institutionalize guidelines governing the acceptance, deployment, supervision,

and responsibilities of affiliated students to ensure patient safety, quality of care, and accountability.

The City Health Office of the City of Bacoor serves as a training ground for students enrolled in medical, nursing, midwifery, and other allied health courses, providing them with essential clinical and community immersion experiences.

Various higher education institutions request affiliation with the City Health facilities for the purpose of deploying their students for clinical duties, public health exposure, and community-based learning.

The absence of uniform policy on affiliation agreements and fees may lead to inconsistencies, administrative burden, and inequitable arrangement among partner institutions. The imposition and standardization of reasonable affiliation fees are necessary to support operational costs, including supervision, administrative processing, use of facilities, and provision of supplies.

This proposed ordinance shall apply to all public and private educational institutions requesting clinical and/or community immersion placements in city-managed health facilities, including but not limited to Health Centers, Barangay Health Stations, and Community based programs and outreach activities. It also covers students from programs such as medicine, nursing, midwifery, medical technology, public health, and other allied health sciences.

RECOMMENDATION:

After a thorough review of all the circumstances and statements from the resource persons, and the provisions of the proposed ordinance, the Committee respectfully recommends that the Sangguniang Panlungsod **approve** the above subject matter on 2nd reading during its next regular session.
