Subject: **REVIEW OF EXISTING SOLID WASTE MANAGEMEN FEES SCHEDULES AND IMPLEMENTATION MECHANISMS TO ENSURE CHARGES ARE REASONABLE, EQUITABLE AND SUPPORTIVE OF BUSINESS GROWTH WHIKE MAINTAINING ENVIRONMENTAL OBJECTIVES.** - **PCO 2026-106** dated May 4, 2026

Referred to the Joint Committee on the 41st Regular Session of the 6th Sangguniang Panlungsod the above-subject matter for appropriate action and recommendation.

In giving due course, the subject matter requires legislative action to amend **CITY ORDINANCE NO. 469-2025** entitled "THE SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT FEES ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BACOOR".

INFORMATION:

The above-subject matter emanates from the endorsement of the Bacoor Chamber of Commerce and Industry, Inc. pertaining to Resolution No. 6 adopted by the said Chamber during its Bacoor Business Summit held on April 22, 2026, and presented as follows, we copy:

RESOLUTION NO. 6
On Revisiting the Solid Waste Ordinance and Free Structure

WHEREAS, many business owners have expressed concern that current solid waste management fees impose **excessive financial burden**, particularly on small and medium enterprises;

WHEREAS, environmental compliance should remain fair, transparent, and sustainable;

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NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, to respectfully request a review of the existing solid waste ordinance, fee schedules, and implementation mechanism to ensure charges are reasonable, equitable, and supportive of business growth while maintaining environmental objectives.

During the Bacoor Business Summit, held at Strike Gymnasium

SUMMARY OF ISSUES AND THE RECOMMENDATIONS:

The business owners thru the Bacoor Chamber of Commerce and Industry expressed their concern in the current solid waste fees which are too burdensome, especially for small and medium entrepreneurs (SMEs) with emphasis on the fee schedules, implementation mechanism, ensure charges are reasonable, equitable, and supportive of business growth while maintaining environmental objective. Thus, proposed to consider the following recommendations:

- Adopt installment payment schemes (monthly, quarterly, semi-annual) to reduce financial burden on businesses.
- Tiered fees based on waste volume structure after conducting a waste generation study.
- Inflation adjustments.
- Incentives for businesses practicing waste reduction.
- Environmental compliance should remain fair, transparent, and sustainable.

FINDINGS/ACTION TAKEN:

The Joint Committee during its hearing held on May 22, 2026, requires the following:

1. The Joint Committee advised the Bacoor Chamber of Commerce to submit the formal petition/request citing the specific provision of the Solid Waste Management Ordinance they sought to be reviewed and amended, and to coordinate the same with the City Environment Service Department (CESD) for appropriate action and endorsement prior to any legislative action by the Sangguniang Panlungsod.

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2. The Joint Committee instructed the City Environment Service Department (CESD) to study and prioritize the concerns of the Bacoor Chamber of Commerce in relation to its request for review of the Solid Waste Management Ordinance.

RECOMMENDATION:

In view of the foregoing, the Honorable Members of the Joint Committee hereby recommend **TO TEMPORARY ARCHIVE** the proposed measure pertaining to the amendment of **City Ordinance No. 469-2025** entitled **"THE SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT FEES ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BACOR"** without prejudice to the re-opening of the same, due to the following reasons:

1. Lack of a formal petition, as the basis of action, from the Bacoor Chamber of Commerce and Industry, Inc., citing therein the specific provisions the Chamber sought for review and amendment, which is further subject to a thorough study and recommendation by the City Environment Service Department (CESD), prior to any legislative action.
2. The amendment based on the concerns of the Bacoor Chamber of Commerce and Industry, Inc. will take longer time as the same is subject to review, study, consideration and endorsement by the Executive Department.

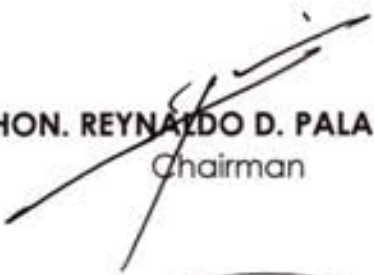
