#### EXECUTIVE ORDER No. 124 - 2023 Series of 2023

AN ORDER ADOPTING THE IMPLEMENTING RULES AND REGULATIONS OF CITY ORDINANCE NO. 255-2023, SERIES OF 2023, AS AMENDED BY CITY ORDINANCE NO. 322-2023, SERIES OF 2023, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE "2023 EXPANDED SOLIDARITY ROUTE ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BACCOR"

WHEREAS, Section 18 of Republic Act No. 7160 (Local Government Code) provides that every local government unit shall exercise the powers expressly granted, those necessarily implied therefrom, as well as powers necessary, appropriate, or incidental for its efficient and effective governance, and those which are essential to the promotion of the general welfare...xxx.

WHEREAS, on January 12, 2023, the Sangguniang Panlungsod enacted and passed City Ordinance No. 255-2023, otherwise known as the "2023 Expanded Solidarity Route Ordinance of the City of Baccor".

WHEREAS, the City Government of Baccor recognizes the need to issue an Implementing Rules and Regulations pertinent to the above-mentioned Ordinance;

WHEREAS, the Office of the City Mayor of Baccor, in coordination with the Baccor Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office, issued the above-mentioned implementing Rules and Regulations that shall govern the "2023 Expanded Solidarity Route Ordinance of the City of Baccor":

NOW, THEREFORE, I, STRIKE B. REVILLA. City Mayor of Saccor. Cavite, by virtue of the powers vested in me by law, do hereby order for the adoption and implementation of the Implementing Rules and Regulations of City Ordinance No. 255-2023 herein attached.

# Section 1. Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR).

Attached herein is the Implementing Rules and Regulations of City Ordinance No. 255-2023, as amended by City Ordinance No. 322-2023, which shall form part of this Executive Order. This shall be known as the "Revised Implementing Rules and Regulations of the 2023 Expanded Solidarity Route Ordinance of the City of Baccor".

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All affected offices and departments are hereby ordered to adopt the said implementing rules and regulations and be guided accordingly.

Strict compliance and observance of this IRR by all city government officials and employees is hereby ordered.

#### Section 2. Repealing Clause.

All previously issued orders and directives inconsistent with any provision found herein shall be deemed repealed, revoked, or amended accordingly.

#### Section 3. Separability Clause.

in the event that any provision found herein shall be judicially or administratively declared illegal or infirm, the remaining provisions shall remain in full force and effect

#### Section 4. Effectivity Clause.

This Executive Order shall take effect immediately upon its signing and remain in full force and effect until repealed, revoked, or amended accordingly.

#### RULE 1 - GENERAL PROVISIONS

Section 1. Title. – These implementing Rules and Regulations ("IRR") shall be known and be cited as the "implementing Rules and Regulations of City Ordinance No. 255-2023 as amended by City Ordinance No. 322-2023, Series of 2023.

Section 2. Purpose. – The IRR is promulgated to prescribe a framework for the effective implementation and enforcement of City Ordinance No. 255-2023 as amended by City Ordinance No. 322-2023, Series of 2023.

Section 3. Construction. – The IRR shall be construed and applied in compliance with and in furtherance of the policies of City Ordinance No. 255-2023 as amended by City Ordinance No. 322-2023. Series of 2023.

# RULE 2 - DECLARATION OF POLICY

Section 4. Policy. - it shall be the Policy of the City of Baccor:

THE REPLEMENTING HULLS AND REQUILATIONS OF ONLY ORDINANCE NO. 224-2623, BERIES OF 2022

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- To decongest the main roads in the City of Bacoor by regulating the use of the streets and the flow of traffic;
- To provide alternative routes for qualified persons and vehicles, and
   To regulate access to the said alternative routes and thoroughfares.

# RULE 3 - THE SOLIDARITY ROUTE

Section 5. The Solidarity Route. - The Solidarity Route shall be comprised of the following thoroughfares located in the following subdivisions, particularly:

Section 6. General Guidelines on the Determination of the Solidarity Route.

— The following guidelines in the determination and creation of additional roads or routes under the Solidarity Route shall be followed:

- The list enumerated in Section 5 hereof is not exclusive. Other roads or routes may be added based on the guidelines outlined in this IRR. Similarly, existing roads and routes mentioned in this IRR or previous issuances may be changed, aftered, or removed.
- Other roads and streets within the various residential subdivisions within the City already forming part of the Solidarity Route before the approval hereof shall also be covered by City Ordinance 255-2023 as amended by City Ordinance No. 322-2023, Series of 2023.
- The Bacoor Traffic and Management Department (BTMD) shall determine the names of the roads and streets within the aforementioned subdivisions comprising the Solidarity Route and those that may be added subsequently.
- Any addition, changes, or removal of roads and routes under the Solidarity Route requires the following:
  - Written recommendation from the BTMD with the corresponding justification and route plan;
  - b. Approval of the Local Chief Executive; and

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- EMBOSSED. The Solidarity Route Sticker must contain a pressuresensitive label that stands out from the flat label surface of the sticker – raising the image design or text on the material;
- QR CODE. The Solidarity Route Sticker must contain a machinereadable code consisting of an array of black and white squares used for storing a Uniform Resource Locator (URL) or other information for reading by the camera on an electronic device;
- REGISTERED. The Solidarity Route Sticker must be registered with the
  official website of the City Government of Baccor or other websites as
  provided by the E-Gov Department with the approval of the City Mayor.
- 5. RFID. The Solidanty Route Sticker must contain a Radio Frequency Identification, which shall form a wireless communication that uses electronic tags placed on the vehicle through the sticker to relay identifying information to an electronic reader or any similar device by means of radio waves and the like.

#### As to purpose

 The Solidarity Route Sticker is an adhesive label containing security features previously enumerated representing the privilege to access the Solidarity Route in the City of Baccor after duty accomplishing the application process and payment of the necessary fees for the use of the same.

Section 10. Solidarity Route Sticker and SBR Card Design Features. – The E-Governance Department shall design the SRS and the SBR Card with the approval of the Office of the City Mayor. The SRS shall contain features that make it distinct, easy to spot even from a distance, and very hard to faisify. The SBR Card shall also be designed in such a way that its authenticity can be easily and quickly determined with the use of scanners or other electronic devices compatible with near field communication (NFC), quick response (QR) code, radio frequency identification (RFID) or other analogous technologies. The E-Gov Department shall insert security features in the design of the SBR Card to protect the holders of such cards from cyber-attacks, identity theft, and other criminal activities. It shall also ensure that the design of the software of the SBR Card, as well as the procedures for its use and validation, shall not compromise the data privacy rights of individuals pursuant to the provisions of Republic Act No. 10173 (the "Data Privacy Act") and its implementing guidelines.

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Section 11. Period of Validity of a Solidarity Route Sticker. — The Old Solidarity Route Sticker previously issued pursuant to City Ordinance No. 11-2019 shall be valid until 31 December 2023.

The New Solidarity Route Sticker issued pursuant to previously issued pursuant to City Ordinance No. 255-2023 shall be valid until 30 June 2025 unless sooner revoked through a legislative or executive issuance.

## RULE 5 - OBTAINING THE SRS

Section 12. General Guidelines on Acquiring the SRS. - The following guidelines shall be followed to obtain the SBR Card and the SRS.

- The issuance of the free SRS to participating members of the Homeowners Associations shall depend on whether they are qualified and shall only be available to a maximum of two (2) cars per Homeowner's Association member.
- In case an applicant is a member of more than one (1) Homeowner's Association, the applicant shall be entitled only to the free stickers or fees based on the documentary requirements he submitted during his first application.
- The Office of the City Mayor, the BTMD, and the E-Governance Department shall determine the process of review and evaluation of the authenticity of the SRS and SBR Card and the manner of inspecting the vehicles concerned.
- The list of requirements may be changed, increased, or reduced at any time upon approval by the Local Chief Executive and conformity of the Sangguniang Panialawigan.
- The City Government of Bacoor may, at any time, suspend the receipt of applications for SRS and SBR Card and/or the issuance thereof after proper notice to the public.

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Section 13. Vehicle Eligibility. – The following guidelines shall be followed in the issuance of SRS:

A. Vehicle Eligible for SRS:

 The SRS may only be issued to four-wheeled motor vehicles that are solely for personal use.

B. Not Eligible for SRS:

Four-wheeled vehicles for purposes other than personal use.

Two-wheeled vehicles regardless of use.

Vehicles with more than four wheels or heavy equipment.

 All Public Utility Vehicles/ Transportation Vehicles (i.e., city buses, jeepneys, motorcycles, tricycles, etc.).

 Specific vehicles, not for personal use (i.e., School service, multi-cab, L-300, and similar vehicles, taxi cab, etc.).

Nevertheless, they may access the roads and thoroughfares of Subdivisions provided they are allowed by the corresponding Association and follow the rules and regulations.

Section 14. Application for Solidarity Route Sticker. – The following are the requirements for the application of the SRS:

## A. Applicants who are residents and members of Participating HOAs:

A valid and original Driver's License;

Any government-issued ID stating that the applicant is a resident of Baccor;

3. A photocopy of the valid and original Driver's License;

 Original Official Receipt ("OR") and Certificate of Registration ("CR") of the vehicle where the SRS will be stuck, attached, or fastened, Provided, that the address appearing in the OR and CR is the same as the address in the driver's license or any government-issued ID stating the applicant's Bacoor residence.

Photocopies of the OR and CR of the vehicle where the SRS will be adhered, attached, or fastened.

 In case the vehicle is not yet registered to the person applying for the SRS, the applicant must submit additional proof of transfer of ownership or rights/interest in the vehicles, such as, but not limited to the following:

a. Deed of Absolute Sale

b. Deed of Donation and Acceptance

c. Deed of Assignment, etc.

7. A valid and original SBR Card:

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Original copy of Barangay Clearance; 8.

- Original copy of the Homeowners' Association (HOA) endorsement/ 9 certificate, Provided, however, that Baccor residents residing within a participating Homeowners' Association shall not be required to submit a Homeowners' Association Certification, should they choose not to. Such a requirement is only applied to those who wish to avail the privilege of obtaining a free SRS. Those who intend to avail of the SRS but cannot submit a Homeowners' Association Certificate shall be required to pay THREE HUNDRED PESOS (PhP300.00). An approved format of the said Homeowners' Association Certificate/ion from the City Government of Baccoor should be followed, whether given personally by the Homeowners' Association or obtained through the system of the E-Governance Department;
- If the person cannot appear in person and submit his application, his agent or the person processing the application on his behalf shall submit a Special Power of Attorney (SPA) and
- 11. Original or photocopy of the OR issued by the City Treasurer's Office as evidence of payment of the required fees.

b. Deed of Donation and Acceptance

c. Deed of Assignment, etc.

If the person cannot appear in person and submit his application, his agent or the person processing the application on his behalf shall submit a Special Power of Attorney (SPA) and

Original or photocopy of the OR issued by the City Treasurer's Office as evidence of payment of the required fees.

Section 15. Process for Application for Solidarity Route Sticker. – The abovelisted requirements shall be submitted to the E-Governance Department. The E-Governance Department shall post a diagram within its office premises for the complete process for application for the SRS, including the number of days of its processing


Section 16. Application for SBR Card. – The following are the requirements for the application of the SBR Card:

 Original copy or photocopy of any proof of residence within the City of Bacoor, such as Barangay Clearance/Certificate of Residency, billing statements, in cases where an applicant does not yet have an ID addressed to the City of Bacoor, valid employment IDs, driver's license, etc.; and

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Original or photocopy of the OR issued by the City Treasurer's Office as evidence of payment of the required fees.

Section 17. Process for Application for the SBR Card. – The above-listed requirements shall be submitted to the E-Governance Department. The E-Gov Department shall post a diagram within its office premises for the complete process for application for the SBR Card, including the number of days it takes to process it.

Section 18, Fees. – The applicant shall pay the following fees for a Solidarity Route Sticker to the Office of the City Treasurer or through an online payment portal. The Office of the City Treasurer shall issue an official receipt, therefore:

Section 19. Where to Stick/Attach/Affix the SRS and RFID- The RFID should be placed on the inside of the vehicle's windshield, in the upper middle portion, below or behind the rearview mirror of the windshield, *Provided*, however, that no obstruction of any kind shall be placed that will prevent the RFID to be read. The SRS sticker shall only

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be glued, affixed, or attached to the vehicle subject of the application and may not be glued, affixed, or attached to another vehicle. For easier identification and monitoring, the SRS shall be stuck/attached/affixed based on the following order of preference:

The lower right corner of the windshield (facing the vehicle).

If the preceding number is not applicable, at the upper right corner of the windshield of the vehicles (facing the vehicle):

 If the two preceding numbers are not applicable, they shall be stuck/affixed/attached anywhere on the driver-side windshield without obstructing the driver's view.

Section 20. Re-application. – In case of theft, loss, destruction, or other similar means that would render the SRS unreadable or unusable, the owner may re-apply for the issuance of a new SRS, in such case, the owner shall not be required to resubmit the documentary requirements. However, the owner shall submit an Affidavit of Loss. The owner shall pay the following fees, regardless of the reason for the re-application:

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Section 21. Violations On SRS. – Vehicles with the following violations shall be denied entry to the Solidarity Route roads and streets, in addition to other penalties stated in this IRR and as may be promulgated by the City Government of Baccor:

- 1. Vehicles with no SRS.
- 2. Vehicles with SRS but stuck/affixed/attached in the wrong place;
- 3. Vehicles with expired SRS
- 4. Vehicles with counterfeit SRS:
- Vehicles with valid and active SRS but such SRS is issued to a different car; and
- Vehicles with damaged SRS wherein the hologram, RFID, and other important features are destroyed.

## RULE 6 - PROPER USAGE OF THE SOLIDARITY ROUTE

Section 22. Who may use the Solidarity Route. – Only four-wheeled vehicles that are solely for personal use with valid and original SRS shall be allowed access to the Solidarity Route.


Section 23. Limitations on Access of Solidarity Route. – The use of the SRS is limited to the said roads and streets as provided in the City Ordinances, this IRR, and future issuances. A vehicle with an SRS shall not access any road or street not within the covered subdivision unless the homeowners' association of the said community allows such access.

## Section 24. Exemptions


- A. The following may be allowed access to the Solidarity Route even without a Solidarity Route Sticker:
  - Properly marked government-owned vehicles used only in official government business: Provided that the persons driving the motor vehicle have sufficient documentary evidence to prove that they are actually on official government business, such as but not limited to the following: mission orders, travel orders, and certifications;

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- Emergency vehicles such as ambulances, fire trucks, and emergency response vehicles, among others.
- Other vehicles, as may be determined by the Office of the City Mayor through the recommendation by the BTMD and the affected HOA.
- B. The rules on Solidarity Route Sticker shall not apply to the following vehicles:
  - Public utility vehicles (PUVs) are legally allowed to transport persons or cargo within the residential subdivision. The relevant transport and franchise laws, City Ordinances, and HOA rules shall be controlling and applicable to these PUVs. The PUVs, however, must be: (a) operating only within the territory of the participating subdivisions as enumerated and described in Section 4 of this Ordinance; (b) must have a valid franchise; and (c) must be duly registered with the City Government of Bacoor.
  - Vehicles used by residents of the residential subdivisions covered by the Ordinance are subject to the rules and regulations of the HOA concerned, and
  - Other vehicles may be determined by the Office of the City Mayor through the recommendation of the BTMD and the affected HOA.

Section 25. Additional Charges. – Participating Homeowners' Associations may charge an entrance fee to the driver of any vehicle that does not bear a valid and properly mounted Solidarity Route Sticker. Provided that the participating Homeowners' Association shall comply with this IRR.


#### A. Guidelines for the additional fee:

- The fee may only be collected from vehicles that do not bear a valid and properly-mounted Solidarity Route Sticker and are not residents of the said HOA collecting the fees.
- The HOA can only collect after issuing a valid Board Resolution providing for the fees to access the Solidarity Route traversing their subdivision.
- The Board Resolution must be submitted to and approved by the City
- The Board Resolution must be posted at the entrance and exit gates of the participating subdivisions.

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 The fees shall not be more than Ten Pesos (PHP 10.00) for two-wheeled vehicles and four-wheeled light vehicles and Twenty Pesos (PHP 20.00) for trucks regardless of displacement.

#### B. Treatment of Income

 Any income realized by the Homeowners' Association in this regard shall be exempted from any fee that the City Government may impose, provided that all the guidelines set forth above are followed.

Section 26. Prohibition Against Additional Charges. – The Homeowners Association shall not charge any amount against, nor deny entry to, any motorist whose driven vehicle bears a valid and properly mounted Solidarity Route Sticker unless otherwise allowed by prevailing laws, ordinances, rules, and regulations.

#### RULE 7 - MANAGEMENT OF ROADS IN THE SOLIDARITY ROUTE

Section 27. Maintenance of Roads in the Solidarity Route. - The following guidelines shall be followed in the maintenance of roads covered by the Solidarity Route:

- The City Government shall maintain/repair/secure the roads/routes mentioned above and implement various traffic mitigation measures.
- The installation and maintenance of all street lights along the said roads/routes shall be the responsibility of the City Government.
- The City Government, if needed, shall construct and maintain security
  gates and/or street barriers, lamp posts, speed bumps, and signages
  within any subdivision covered by the Solidarity Route project at no
  additional cost to the HOA to regulate and secure access to it.
- The various HOAs covered by this Ordinance shall be responsible for preserving the above-enumerated constructions.
- The BTMD shall be allowed to clear and abate any illegal road obstruction and illegally parked motor vehicles found in the routes mentioned in this Ordinance without prejudice to prevailing laws, ordinances, and rules and regulations.

THE IMPLEMENTING PILLES AND REGULATIONS OF GITY ORDINANCE NO. 255-2023 AS AMENDED BY DITY ORDINANCE NO. 223-2023, REPAIRS OF 2223

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Section 28. Improvements on the Solidarity Route by the City Government.—
The City Government of Baccor shall be allowed to introduce improvements in the roads covered by the Solidarity Route. Provided however, in cases of roads within private subdivisions or property, the terms and conditions of the Memorandum of Agreement signed by their respective HOA with the City Government of Baccor shall be followed. In the absence of such, the HOA shall be allowed to discuss the same with the Local Chief Executive in conformity with the Sangguniang Panlungsod.

Section 29. Installation of Scanners and CCTV Cameras. – The BTMD, City Engineering Office, and E-Governance Department are authorized to install scanners and other devices to validate the authenticity of the SRS. The offices are also authorized to install closed circuit television (CCTV) cameras at the entrance/exit gates and other places within the residential subdivisions covered by this Ordinance. The installation of the said devices, scanners, and cameras shall only be allowed after written authority from the President of the HOA concerned and from the Local Chief Executive.

Section 30. Designation of Expanded Solidarity Route Segments. — The existing roads and routes covered by the Solidarity Routes Ordinances, this IRR, and future issuances may have an official solidarity route designation separate and distinct from their respective official names. The said designations shall be used by the BTMD and other city government departments to monitor, maintain, and secure the roads/streets comprising the Solidarity Route. The City Mayor shall make the designation through an Executive Order motu proprio or upon the recommendation of the BTMD and the participating HOA through a Board Resolution for that specific purpose.


# RULE 8 - TRAFFIC REGULATION IN THE SOLIDARITY ROUTE

Section 31. Applicability of Traffic Laws. — The traffic laws of the Philippines and the provisions of the Traffic Code of Bacoor shall apply and shall be strictly enforced on all roads covered by the Solidarity Route. Accordingly, employees of the BTMD shall be atlowed to enter residential subdivisions to ensure the effective implementation of all Ordinances about the Solidarity Route, this IRR, and any future issuances from the City Government of Bacoor. All traffic laws shall be strictly enforced.

THE REPLEMENTING PLULES AND REQULATIONS OF CITY ORDINANCE NO. 256-2623 AS AMENDED BY CITY ORDINANCE NO. 323-3623, SERVER OF 2612

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Section 32. Speed Limit. – A thirty kilometer per hour (30 KPH) maximum speed limit shall be strictly implemented within the routes mentioned above.

Section 33. Ban Against Smoke Belching and Noise Pollution. Smokebelching motor vehicles or motor vehicles that produce extremely loud noise in violation of City Ordinance No. 5-2014 (the "2014 Anti-Motor Vehicle Noise Pollution Ordinance of the City of Baccor") driven by non-residents of a particular subdivision may be denied access to the Solidarity Route by the deputies residing within the said community.

Section 34. Access Hours. – Access to the Solidarity Route shall only be from 5:00 A.M. to 10:00 P.M. every day, including public holidays. The Local Chief Executive is empowered to modify the access hours under this Ordinance upon the recommendation of the BTMD.

Section 35. Additional Traffic Laws. – The City Government of Baccor may promulgate additional traffic rules applicable only within roads covered by the Solidarity Route. In such cases, such traffic rules shall be strictly enforced.

Section 36. IRR vs. Ordinances. – In case of conflict between traffic laws, rules, and provisions among the existing Solidarity Route Ordinances, Traffic Ordinances, and this IRR, provisions of the IRR shall prevail for being more recent and more specific.

## RULE 9 - TRAFFIC AND SECURITY MANAGEMENT IN THE SOLIDARITY ROUTE

Section 37. Applicability of Traffic Laws. — The traffic laws of the Philippines and the provisions of the Traffic Code of Baccor shall apply and shall be strictly enforced on all roads covered by the Solidarity Route. Accordingly, employees of the BTMD shall be allowed to enter residential subdivisions to ensure the effective implementation of all Ordinances about the Solidarity Route, this IRR, and any future issuances from the City Government of Baccor.

THE REPLEMENTING RULES AND RESIDENTING OF CITY ORDINANCE NO. 122-2622, SERIES OF 2023

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Section 38. Assignment of City/Police Personnel. - The City Government shall assign such number of police personnel and/or BTMD personnel that might be required to secure the entrance/exit gates and roads mentioned above at no additional cost to the HOA.

Section 39. Role of Deputies in the Implementation of the Solidarity Route. -Under City Ordinance No. 261-2023, deputation or deputization is the act of authorizing specified persons to implement City Ordinances on traffic within their area of jurisdiction. Only the City Mayor is empowered to issue orders to deputize the specified individuals under City Ordinance No. 261-2023

- A. The deputized persons or "deputies" may include:
  - Duly elected officers of homeowners associations covered by the 1. Solidarity Route:

2. Members of neighborhood associations;

- Persons of good moral character operating and/or residing in the City of 3. Baccor, Cavite, and
- Security guards employed by the different Homeowners Associations 4 are covered by the Solidarity Route.
- B. The authority of deputized persons or deputies is incorporated in the Deputation Order, which contains the following:
  - The power to identify the provisions of the Expanded Solidarity Route 4. Ordinance to be implemented

2. The period of effectivity of the deputation;

The conditions of deputation; 3.

The grounds for revoking the powers delegated to the HOAs, and

- The deputation security guards employed by the said HOAs are actually 5. working in the residential subdivisions where the said associations operate.
- C. Deputies must follow the following guidelines or rules:
  - Deputized enforcers are not "persons in authority" nor "agents of a person in authority' for purposes of Title Three, Chapter Four of the Revised Penal Code as amended, Exception: when the deputized enforcer comes to the aid of authorities or their agents.

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 If the person to be deputized resides in an area not belonging to any HOA or NA, the person must be favorably endorsed through a letter by the Punong Barangay having jurisdiction over their residence.

Section 40. Duties and Responsibilities of Deputies. – In the implementation of the 2023 Expanded Solidarity Route Ordinance, the deputies shall perform the following duties and responsibilities:

- 1. Ensure the observance of the following:
  - Access to the Solidarity Route shall be limited to those motor vehicles that have a genuine and valid Solidarity Route Sticker.
  - b. Only four-wheeled vehicles for personal use with valid and original SRS that are properly mounted on the windshield of their owned motor vehicle can access the Solidarity Route.
  - The Solidarity Route Sticker shall be mounted on the upper right corner of the windshield of the vehicles (facing the vehicle).
- 2. Observe the following rules and procedures:
  - Inform the offender of the act committed in violation of the 2023 Expanded Solidarity Route Ordinance.
  - b. Issue a filled-out OVR to the offender indicating the following:
    - The full name, age, and residential address of the motorist/passenger of the vehicle:
    - ii. The act of violation committed:
    - iii. the date, time, and place of commission;
    - The number of times the said offender motorist/passenger of the vehicle committed a violation against the 2023 Expanded Solidarity Route Ordinance.
    - Whether the offender motorist/passenger of the vehicle availed of the No Contest provision;
    - vi. The fine to be paid by the offender motorist/passenger of the vehicle and
    - vii. Pictures of the offender motorist/passenger of the vehicle showing the front and side view of the person and the vehicle subject of the violation.

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- c. Inform the offender motorist/passenger of the vehicle of their right to avail of the No Contest Provision, pursuant to Section 5 of CO No. 228-2022;
- d. Submit copies of the issued OVR to the concerned unit/department, Management Information System Office, and the City Treasurer's Office.
- Be in proper attire, carry his/her identification (ID) card and Deputation Order at all times,
- f. Give a fair warning not to commit the act being observed as a violation of the 2023 Expanded Solidarity Route Ordinance. The Deputy must immediately communicate that continuing with the act will be deemed a violation of the ordinance. If the person complies and desists from performing the act that will violate the ordinance, then no Ordinance Violation Receipt (OVR) shall be issued.
- g. If, despite warning, the person continues to perform the act constituting a violation of the ordinance, an OVR shall be issued against the offender motorist/passenger of the vehicle.
  - It is important to obtain the following details from the offender motorist/passenger of the vehicle, including their full name, age, if claiming to be minor, the full name of the parents must also be obtained, and their complete address:
  - These details must be ascertained on the spot by asking for an identification card that will reflect and support the information obtained.
  - iii. If the offender motorist/passenger of the vehicle has no identification card, a video of the violator's narration of details shall be recorded by the Deputy for reference. The video must be taken in a public place, and the Deputy must clearly notify the violator (which must also be captured in the video) that they consent to the posting of the video recording on the social media platform in case of a faise statement of full name and/or complete address.
  - iv. If both identification card and video recording cannot be obtained during apprehension, the Deputy must exert earnest efforts to call the assistance of the HOA/NA Officers (if applicable), Barangay officers, Alert 161, or any officers of the City Hall that could immediately attend to the situation such as Philippine National Police (PNP) and/or other authorities nearby, if available.
- h. Participate in court processes, such as providing testimony under oath, when warranted, for the expeditious and proper prosecution of any charge against the alleged offender; and

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i. Perform such other actions necessary and incidental to his/her duties and responsibilities, subject to the limitations under the Deputation Order and applicable national and local laws, rules, and regulations.

 If, for these safety reasons, the Deputy failed to issue the OVR to the offender motorist/passenger of the vehicle, the Deputy must narrate the incident to the nearby barangay half or police station for the blotter of events (incident report).

## Section 41, Limitations on the Exercise of Authority by the Deputies:


- The Deputation Order shall be valid for not more than the period indicated therein unless revoked or renewed accordingly. The Deputy shall only be allowed to exercise power to apprehend violators of the 2023 Expanded Solidarity Route Ordinance of the City of Baccor and to issue OVRs within the period of deputization pertaining to said Ordinance.
- Deputies may only exercise powers in compliance with conditions specified in the Deputation Order. The deputy shall not be allowed to exercise his powers for violations of the 2023 Expanded Solidarity Route Ordinance of the City of Bacoor not covered by his Deputization Order.
- Deputies shall not exercise power to arrest offenders, conduct investigations, or prosecute the offenders in court. However, if criminal acts are being committed, the Deputy may exercise their right to a citizen's arrest under the Constitution.
- Deputies shall perform only the following acts in observance of the 2023 Expanded Solidarity Route Ordinance of the City of Baccor:
  - Confiscate falsified Solidarity Route stickers, which must be duly reported and surrendered to the MIS within the next 24 hours from confiscation:
  - b. Remove fake Solidarity Route Stickers from vehicles;
  - Deny entry to those motor vehicles that have no Solidarity Route stickers, HOA stickers, not belonging to those exempted, vehicles with improperly mounted or counterfeit stickers.
  - Collect data or information on violators of City Ordinance No. 255-2023 as amended by City Ordinance No. 322-2023;
  - Facilitate entry to those who are not equipped with Solidarity Route stickers but are currently facing health emergencies; and

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 Allow officials and employees of the city government traveling to or from their places of work or while in the process of performing their official functions to enter the residential subdivision where the said deputies are assigned.

#### **RULE 10 - PENALTIES**

# Section 42. Penalties. - The following penalties shall be applied:

- An administrative fine of Five Thousand Pesos (PHP 5,000.00) payable to the Office of the City Treasurer or with a thirty (30) day imprisonment or with both fine and imprisonment upon conviction by the court of proper jurisdiction to with:
  - Misrepresentation or submission of false information in acquiring a Solidarity Route Sticker;
  - b. Unauthorized sale of a Solidarity Route Sticker:
  - c. Use of a fake Solidarity Route Sticker;
  - d. Unauthorized use of Solidarity Route Sticker.
  - e. Using a Solidarity Route Sticker to access roads and streets not provided under this Ordinance and its Implementing Rules and Regulations unless allowed by the participating HOA.
  - Unauthorized use of the Solidarity Route Sticker without the payment of the proper fees due to the HOA;
  - g. Misuse of data or information collected under the Ordinance and its IRR:
  - h. Commission of any act analogous to the acts, which may include any of the following:
    - Removal of Solidarity Route Sticker whether or not the Solidarity Route Sticker belongs to the person removing the same, or
    - Sticking a removed Solidarity Route Sticker to another vehicle whether or not the vehicle is owned by the original owner of the removed Solidarity Route Sticker.
- An administrative fine of Three Thousand Pesos (PHP 3,000.00) is payable to the Office of the City Treasurer for all other violations of the Solidarity Route Ordinances, and this IRR is not mentioned in Paragraph 1 of this Section.

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#### RULE 11 - MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS.

Section 43. HOA/Developer/Owner's Consent. — The participating or affected HOA, developer, or private person or entity who owns the road lots covered and affected by this Ordinance shall signify their consent through a Board Resolution and shall enter into a Memorandum of Agreement or tripartite Memorandum of Agreement with the City Government of Baccor in connection with the implementation of this Ordinance in their respective communities/properties. An HOA already forming part of the Solidarity Route shall be required to issue the necessary Board Resolution and enter into a new Memorandum of Agreement with the City Government.

Section 44. Repeat, - All orders, implementing rules, and regulations related to the Solidarity Route are expressly repealed or modified.

Section 45. Separability. – In case any provision of this IRR is declared void by a court of law, the remaining provisions of this IRR not affected by the said judicial declarations shall remain valid and enforceable.

Section 46, Effectivity. - This IRR shall take effect immediately upon its approval.
