EXECUTIVE ORDER No. 65A- 2024 Series of 2024

AN ORDER ADOPTING THE IMPLEMENTING RULES AND REGULATIONS OF CITY ORDINANCE NO. 4A-2016, OR THE BACOOR KONTRA DENGUE (BAKOD) ORDINANCE"

WHEREAS, Section 16 of Republic Act No. 7160 provides that every local government unit shall exercise the powers expressly granted, those necessarily implied therefrom, as well as powers necessary, appropriate, or incidental for its efficient and effective governance, and those which are essential to the promotion of the general welfare...xxx;

WHEREAS, the Sangguniang Panlungsod enacted and passed City Ordinance No. 4A-2016, entitled "An Ordinance Establishing A Comprehensive Effort Against The Spread And Proliferation Of Dengue Fever In The City Of Baccor To Be Known As The Baccor Kontra Dengue Campaign, Appropriating An Initial Budgetary Outlay Of Five Million Pesos (Php 5,000,000.00) For The Said Campaign To Be Taken From The Local Disaster Risk Reduction Management Fund And Other Available Funds Of The City, And Providing Penalties For Violations Hereof," with the end in mind of mobilizing all sectors of society to effectively, aggressively, and consistently eradicate dengue fever within the city and its immediate environs;

WHEREAS, the City Government of Bacoor recognizes the need to issue an Implementing Rules and Regulations pertinent to the above-mentioned Ordinance;

WHEREAS, the Office of the City Mayor of Bacoor, in coordination with the concerned city government offices, issued the above-mentioned Implementing Rules and Regulations that shall govern the said Ordinance.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, STRIKE B. REVILLA, City Mayor of Baccor, Cavite, by virtue of the powers vested in me by law, do hereby order for the adoption and implementation of the Implementing Rules and Regulations of City Ordinance No. 4A-2016 herein attached.

Section 1. Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR). Attached herein is the Implementing Rules and Regulations of City Ordinance No. 4A-2016, which shall form part of this Executive Order. This shall be known as the "Implementing Rules and Regulations of the Bacoor Kontra Dengue (BAKOD) Ordinance".

All affected offices and departments are hereby ordered to adopt the said implementing rules and regulations and be guided accordingly. Strict compliance and observance of this IRR by all city government officials and employees is hereby ordered.

Section 2. Repealing Clause. All previously issued orders and directives inconsistent with any provision found herein shall be deemed repealed, revoked, or amended accordingly.





THE IMPLEMENTING RULES AND REGULATIONS OF CITY ORDINANCE NO. CO 4A-2016, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE "BACOOR KONTRA DENGUE (BAKOD) ORDINANCE."

Rule I GENERAL PROVISIONS

SECTION 1. TITLE. - These Implementing Rules and Regulations shall be known and cited as the "Implementing Rules and Regulations of the Bacoor Kontra Dengue (BAKOD) Ordinance."

SECTION 2. PURPOSE. - These Implementing Rules and Regulations are promulgated to prescribe a framework for effectively implementing and enforcing City Ordinance No. CO 4A-2016, Series of 2016.

SECTION 3. CONSTRUCTION. – These Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) shall be liberally construed to carry out the policies embodied herein. In their interpretation and application, the provisions of this IRR shall be held to be the minimum requirements for the protection of the public and shall be construed to achieve the purposes for which this IRR was adopted.

Rule II DECLARATION OF POLICY

SECTION 4. DECLARATION OF POLICY. – It is the policy of the City of Bacoor to mobilize all sectors of society to effectively, aggressively, and consistently eradicate dengue fever within the city and its immediate environs.

Rule III DEFINITION OF TERMS

SECTION 5. DEFINITION OF TERMS. – The following terms shall be defined as follows:

- Dengue is a viral infection caused by the dengue virus, transmitted to humans through the bite of infected mosquitoes.
- Bacoor Kontra Dengue (BAKOD) Campaign is a comprehensive, aggressive, and continuing campaign to be participated in by every sector within the City of Bacoor against the proliferation of dengue fever.

 Bacoor Anti-Dengue Council (BADC) is a body comprised of representatives of various sectors of society dedicated to the eradication of dengue fever within the City of Bacoor.

Rule IV COVERAGE

SECTION 6. COVERAGE. – This IRR shall cover the creation, constitution, and implementation of the anti-dengue program of the City of Baccor with respect to the prevention and eradication of dengue fever within the City through the BAKOD Campaign.

Rule V THE BACOOR ANTI-DENGUE COUNCIL (BADC)

SECTION 7. CREATION OF THE BACOOR ANTI-DENGUE COUNCIL. – A body comprised of representatives of various sectors of a society dedicated to eradicating dengue fever within the City of Bacoor, known as the Bacoor Anti-Dengue Council (BADC), is hereby created.

SECTION 8. POWERS AND FUNCTIONS OF THE BADC. - The BADC shall have the following functions and powers:

- Formulate programs, projects, and activities to eradicate dengue and raise public awareness on how to effectively and consistently eradicate the Aedes aegypti mosquito;
- Coordinate the efforts of various departments, units, and barangays of the city government in relation to the implementation of various stages of the BAKOD Campaign;
- Prosecute any city or barangay official or employee who fails or refuses to actively take part in the BAKOD Campaign based on the principle that governmental apathy and inaction against the threat of dengue fever cost lives and millions of pesos of public funds;
- Encourage the support and participation of the private sector in the implementation of the various stages of the BAKOD Campaign;
- Receive and account for any donation received by the city government from private donors or from foreign government entities;

- Report to the Sangguniang Panlungsod about the status of the BAKOD Campaign on a quarterly basis;
- 7. Assist the City Mayor in implementing the BAKOD Campaign; and
- Other powers and functions germane to the foregoing or necessary to give full force and effect to those above mentioned.

SECTION 9. COMPOSITION OF THE BADC. – The BADC shall be composed of the following:

Chairperson

Mayor

Co-Chairperson

Medical Director of a privately owned hospital within the City

Vice Chair Members City Health Officer

Head of City Environment Service Department (CESD)

All Punong Barangays City Legal Officer City Planning Officer City Engineer City Administrator

SECTION 10. MANDATORY DAILY CLEAN-UP DRIVE. - Due to the correlation of sanitation and environmental issues to the spread of dengue, the City Health Office and the City Environment Service Department (CESD) shall be at the forefront of daily clean-up drives that would simultaneously start every 7:00 in the morning every day every home, establishment, and building in every barangay, which requires the concerted effort of the entire community.

The said clean-up drives shall be mandatory in nature and will involve the following activities in the following order:

- Step 1: Public announcement to be done via loudspeakers operated by barangay officials and homeowners associations reminding the public to clean up their homes, including the breeding places of mosquitoes such as water containers, puddles, potholes, drainage canals, gardens, and clogged roof drains.
- Step 2: Barangay officials and officers of homeowners' associations shall go around their respective jurisdictions and remind people how to clean their surroundings properly.
- Step 3: A monitoring team shall visit every barangay and neighborhood in the city on several occasions based on a schedule to be prepared and updated by the City Planning Office and do the following:
 - Check if the clean-up drive is being done properly and on time.

- Identify and apprehend persons and juridical entities who refuse to comply with any provision of the Ordinance and this IRR or of other ordinances related to sanitation maintenance and environmental protection.
- Inspect and enter privately owned real properties, including private schools and commercial establishments, to determine and pinpoint mosquito breeding grounds.
- Apply, install, collect, or replace insecticides, larvicides, ovitraps, and longlasting insecticidal nets in all homes, establishments, buildings, institutions such as schools and churches, and vacant lots.
- Forcibly collect and dispose of trash that may become, or has already become, mosquito breeding places
- Issue Ordinance Violation Receipts against anyone who will violate this Ordinance and other ordinances related to sanitation maintenance and environmental protection, including barangay officials and city government employees;
- Collect relevant data and ovitraps related to the breeding and prevalence of mosquitoes and the occurrence of dengue fever in the inspection sites, if any, and
- Report the results of inspections to the BADC on a weekly basis.

Ten (1) monitoring teams comprised of the following persons are hereby created:

Two Sanitary Inspectors

One Environmental Inspector

One EcoAide (with trash cart)

One Police officer or barangay tanod

Step 4: The Office of the City Health Service shall study and interpret the data collected by the monitoring teams and submit the same to the BADC and to the City Planning Office.

Step 5: The City Planning and Development Office shall compile the various data collected, create a map that will clearly show the various areas within the city with high concentrations of mosquitoes and dengue fever cases, and submit its work to the BADC.

Step 6: The BADC shall analyze the reports of the monitoring teams, the Office of the City Health Service, and the City Planning Office and do any of the following:

- Order intensified clean-up drives in all sites identified to have high concentrations of mosquitos and dengue cases (hereafter referred to as "dengue hot zones");
- Order selected city government employees and emergency response teams to visit the dengue hot zones and assist in the clean-up drives;
- Coordinate with the national government for technical and material assistance in relation to the BAKOD Campaign;
- Order the Office of the City Legal Service to prosecute all persons who have been issued with Ordinance Violation Receipts;
- Authorize the purchase of ovitraps, larvicides, insecticides, long-lasting insecticidal nets, biohazard suits, and other equipment and vehicles needed to ensure the success of the BAKOD Campaign;
- Direct the City Engineer to repair or renovate any public place or public building that has become a mosquito breeding ground within a specific work schedule and
- Other acts necessary to enforce the foregoing and ensure the success of the BAKOD Campaign.

Rule VI PENAL PROVISIONS

SECTION 11. PENALTIES. – Persons who shall refuse to cooperate with the BAKOD Campaign, refuse to allow monitoring team members to enter their property, prevent the implementation of this ordinance, or violate any provision hereof, including city government and barangay officials who refuse or fail to comply with the provisions hereof, shall be meted with the following penalties:

First Offense:

P2,500.00 fine plus fifty (50) hours of community service consisting of assisting the monitoring teams based on a schedule to be determined by the court. In case the offender is a city government or barangay employee or official, he shall also be meted with a ten-day suspension without pay.

Second Offense:

Fine of P5,000.00 plus one hundred (100) hours of volunteer work consisting of assisting the monitoring teams based on a schedule to be determined by the court. In case the offender is a city government or barangay employee or official, he shall also be meted with a twenty-day suspension without pay.

Third Offense:

Fine of P5,000.00 and imprisonment for ten (10) days. In case the offender is a city government or barangay employee or official, he shall also be terminated from employment. Provided that a 50% discount shall be given in favor of the offender if he/she voluntarily pays the fine mentioned above prior to the filing of the appropriate complaint against him by the Office of the City Legal Service in the proper court of law. Provided further that in case the offender is a minor, the offender's parents or guardians shall pay the above-mentioned fines. Moreover that, the administrative penalties to be imposed against city government or barangay employees or officials who shall violate the Ordinance and this IRR shall not be reduced under any circumstance.

Rule VII INITIAL BUDGET OUTLAY

SECTION 12. INITIAL BUDGET OUTLAY. – An initial budget outlay for the BAKOD Campaign amounting to Five Million Pesos (PhP 5,000,000.00) to be taken from either the Local Disaster Risk Reduction Management Fund or any other available funds of the city government is hereby appropriated.

SECTION 13. PURPOSE / USES OF THE INITIAL BUDGET OUTLAY. - The initial budget outlay shall be used to finance the purchase of equipment needed for the successful implementation of the BAKOD Campaign, such as, but not limited to, (a) larvicides, (b) ovitraps, (c) insecticides, (d) long-lasting insecticidal nets, (e) personal protection gear, or (f) laboratory equipment.

The said budget may also be used to pay for the allowances of the members of the monitoring inspection teams, to pay for the training and seminar of members of the BADC and of the monitoring teams regarding effective techniques in the eradication of dengue, or for the printing of public awareness materials on how to eradicate dengue.

Rule VIII MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

SECTION 14. AUTOMATIC REVIEW. - The Sangguniang Panlungsod shall automatically review the Ordinance once every three (3) years after its approval or whenever the need for such review arises.

SECTION 15. REPEAL. - All orders, implementing rules, and regulations inconsistent with the IRR are expressly repealed or modified.

SECTION 16. SEPARABILITY. – In case any provision of this IRR is declared void by a court of law, the remaining provisions of this IRR, not affected by the said judicial declarations, shall remain valid and enforceable.

SECTION 17. EFFECTIVITY. - This IRR shall take effect immediately upon its approval.
