CITY ORDINANCE NO. 356-2024
Series of 2024

AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING THE MANDATORY SUBMISSION OF MEDICAL DATA (MORBIDITY, MORTALITY, VACCINATION, FAMILY PLANNING, PRE AND POSTNATAL CARE) BY ALL HEALTH ESTABLISHMENTS, HOSPITALS, AND CLINICS AND IMPOSING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS HEREOF.

WHEREAS, the formulation of an effective and robust public health program depends largely on the reliability and availability of various health data.

WHEREAS, the tragic lessons left behind the COVID-19 pandemic taught public health practitioners that an ounce of prevention is still better than a pound of cure.

WHEREAS, there is a necessity to obtain data from private medical establishments such as but not limited to hospitals, medical clinics and birthing homes.

WHEREAS, the said data will be used for the reporting of the city government to the Department of Health.

WHEREAS, the said data will be used by the city government in planning and implementation of health programs beneficial to its constituents.

NOW THEREFORE, be it ordained by the 5th Sangguniang Panlungsod of the City of Bacoor, Cavite THAT:

Section 1. Title. This Ordinance shall be known as the "Mandatory Reporting of Health Data Ordinance of the City of Bacoor".

Section 2. Mandatory Reporting of Health Data. All medical establishments such as but not limited to hospitals, medical clinics and birthing homes operating in the City of Bacoor, Cavite are hereby mandated to submit medical data related to morbidity, mortality, vaccination, family planning, pre/post-natal care and other medical data that may be mandated by the government to the City Health Office in the manner to be prescribed in the implementing rules and regulations of this Ordinance.

Section 3. Protection of Data Privacy Rights. The CHO and the E-Governance Department shall implement measures designed specifically to protect the data privacy rights of individuals pursuant to the provisions of Republic Act No. 10173 (the "Data Privacy Act of 2012").

SECTION 4. Prohibited Acts. The following acts and omissions are hereby prohibited:

4.1. Failure of a medical establishment such as but not limited to hospitals, laboratories, clinics, and birthing facilities to report various medical data to the CHO related to morbidity, mortality, vaccination, family planning, pre/post-natal care and other medical data that may be mandated by the government within the period and in compliance with the manner prescribed in the implementing rules and regulations of this Ordinance;

4.2. Acts or omissions similar or analogous to the foregoing.

Section 5. Penalties. The director, owner, or manager of any hospital, clinic, laboratory, birthing facility or medical establishment covered by this Ordinance who violate any provision hereof shall be required to pay a fine amounting to P5,000.00 for every patient whose data his/her medical establishment failed to report to the CHO upon conviction by a competent court of law.

Aside from the said penalty, the medical establishment that failed to report the aforementioned medical data properly shall be closed by the City Government for a period of thirty (30) to ninety (90) days upon determination of the court.

Section 6. Implementing Rules and Regulation. The OCLS, in coordination with the CHO, and the Office of the

City Administrator, shall submit the proposed implementing rules and regulations of this ordinance for the approval of the City Mayor not more than sixty (60) days after the date of effectivity hereof.

Section 7. Automatic Review. The Sangguniang Panlungsod shall automatically review this Ordinance every two years from the date of effectivity hereof or whenever necessary.

Section 8. Repeal. All ordinances, resolutions, orders, and regulations of the City Government inconsistent with the provisions hereof are hereby repealed and/or modified accordingly.

Section 9. Separability. Any provision hereof not affected by a judicial order declaring any part of this Ordinance void or unconstitutional shall remain valid.

Section 10. Effectivity. This Ordinance shall become effective immediately after it has been published in a newspaper of general circulation in the Province of Cavite.
