AN ORDINANCE FURTHER AMENDING CITY ORDINANCE NO. 2013-031 ENTITLED, "AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING BUSINESS ESTABLISHMENTS AND RESIDENTIAL SUBDIVISIONS OPERATING IN THE CITY OF BACOR, CAVITE TO INSTALL CLOSED CIRCUIT TV CAMERAS," AND PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF.

WHEREAS, Article II, Section 24, of the 1987 Constitution provides that the State recognizes the vital role of communication and information in nation-building. At the same time, Article II, Section 11 thereof emphasizes that the State values the dignity of every human person and guarantees full respect for human rights;

WHEREAS, Section 16 of the Local Government Code of 1991 or Republic Act No. 7160, also known as the General Welfare Clause, provides in part that every local government unit shall exercise powers necessary for its efficient and effective governance and those which are essential to the promotion of general welfare;

WHEREAS, Section 2 of Republic Act No. 10173, also known as the Data Privacy Act of 2012, provides that it is the policy of the State to protect the fundamental human right of privacy of communication while ensuring the free flow of information to promote innovation and growth and that the State has an inherent obligation to ensure that personal information in information and communications systems in the government and in the private sector are secured and protected;



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WHEREAS, Section 20 of the Implementing Rules and Regulations of the Data Privacy Act of 2012 provides that further processing of personal data collected from a party other than the data subject shall be allowed under certain conditions;

WHEREAS, law enforcement agencies, as well as the emergency response agencies, in the country have already proven that closed circuit television (CCTV) cameras are among the most effective tools in crime deterrence, prevention, detection, and assisting in investigations which can be used in addition to the testimonies of witnesses;

WHEREAS, the Department of Interior and Local Government, in its Memorandum Circular No. 2022-060, mandates the installation of closed-circuit television (CCTV) cameras for certain business establishments in accordance with the Welfare Clause of the Local Government Code to support the maintenance of peace and order and public safety;

WHEREAS, the integration of CCTV footage into local disaster response protocols can significantly enhance the ability to respond to emergencies and mitigate risks;

WHEREAS, the city government of Bacoor recognizes the importance of enhancing public safety and security through effective monitoring and rapid response capabilities;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the 5th Sangguniang Panlungsod of the City of Bacoor, THAT:

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE. This ordinance shall be known as the "**Amended CCTV Ordinance of the City of Bacoor**".

SECTION 2. SCOPE AND APPLICATION - The following entities are required to install a fully functional CCTV system at the following locations:

A. All Barangays within the City of Bacoor are mandated to install CCTV cameras on strategic locations within the said barangay especially in places where criminal acts usually take place.

B. The following Business Establishments operating within the City of Bacoor are mandated to install CCTV cameras at the entrances, exits, and other places within the said establishments such as the area near the cashier:



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- i. Financial establishments such as banks, pawnshops, money lenders, money remittance services, money changers, and others with similar transactions.
- ii. Business establishments that are part of a national chain or have several branches in other parts of the country such as restaurants/fast-food chains, convenience stores, grocery stores, drug stores, etc.
- iii. Shopping malls, shopping centers, supermarkets, wet markets or palengke, and other similar establishments.
- iv. Hospitals, laboratories, clinics, and other medical facilities.
- v. Theaters, movie houses, perya, arcades, internet cafes, and other places of entertainment that draw in a considerable number of customers.
- vi. Public transportation terminals, parking lots, ports, and other similar establishments cater to a large number of vehicles.
- vii. Car dealerships, gasoline/fuel stations, vehicle maintenance/service stations.
- viii. Other business establishments that the Sanggunian deems proper considering the nature of business and potential risks in their respective areas.

C. All Educational or Training Institutions, both private and public within the City of Bacoor are mandated to install CCTV cameras inside all classrooms, canteens, entrance and exit gates, parking areas and other areas frequented by students and faculty members except inside restrooms.

D. The homeowners associations and/or the developer of all Residential Subdivisions within the City of Bacoor are mandated to install CCTV cameras at the entrance/exit gates of their residential subdivision and on all open spaces used by residents for rest and recreation activities.

The CCTV shall be maintained in proper working order at all times, shall be in continuous operation, and shall meet the minimum technical specifications set by the implementing rules and regulations of this ordinance.

SECTION 3. DEFINITION OF TERMS. As used in this ordinance, the following terms shall mean as follows:



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- a. **Closed-Circuit Television (CCTV) System** refers to a video surveillance system that consists of cameras, recording devices, monitors, and related equipment used to capture, store, and display footage for security and monitoring purposes.
- b. **Barangay** refers to the basic unit of governance and leadership, responsible for the delivery of public services, planning and budgeting, and maintaining community-based information systems, and is recognized as the smallest administrative division in local governance.
- c. **Business Establishments** refers to all commercial and industrial establishments operating within the City of Bacoor, as enumerated in Section 2 of this ordinance.
- d. **Schools** refer to all public and private educational institutions, including daycare centers, primary and secondary schools, colleges, universities, and technical-vocational training centers operating within the City of Bacoor.
- e. **Residential Subdivisions** refer to housing developments, whether open or gated communities, and similar residential complexes that accommodate multiple households within a specified area, and whose management is entrusted to either the developer or a homeowners' association if management of the HOA matters has been turned over to the latter.
- f. **CCTV Coverage Area** refers to the specific locations where CCTV cameras must be installed, which may include entrances, exits, parking areas, hallways, common areas, and other critical security zones as prescribed by this ordinance.
- g. **CCTV Recording Retention Period** refers to the minimum period for which recorded CCTV footage must be stored and retained before being deleted or overwritten, as required by this ordinance.
- h. **Data Privacy and Security** refers to the policies and measures that must be observed to protect CCTV recordings from unauthorized access, disclosure, or misuse, in compliance with the Data Privacy Act of 2012 (R.A. 10173) and its implementing rules and



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regulations and other relevant issuances of the National Privacy Commission.

- i. **Data Sharing Agreement (DSA)** refers to a formal, written contract that establishes the terms, conditions, and responsibilities governing the collection, processing, storage, and sharing of recorded CCTV footage between and among parties, such as government agencies, law enforcement authorities, barangays, business establishments, schools, and residential subdivisions.
- j. **Data subject** refers to an individual whose personal, sensitive personal, or privileged information is processed.
- k. **Emergency situation** refers to any unexpected or unforeseen event that poses an immediate threat to life, health, property, or public safety, requiring urgent action or intervention. This includes, but is not limited to, natural disasters, fire incidents, medical emergencies, security threats, criminal activities, accidents, and other situations that necessitate rapid response from emergency services or law enforcement authorities.
- l. **Responsible Entity** refers to the punong barangay, owner, operator, manager, or administrator of a business establishment, school, or residential subdivision responsible for the installation, maintenance, and operation of the CCTV system.
- m. **Public space** refers to streets and alleys, public parks, schools, buildings, malls, bars, restaurants, transportation terminals, public markets, spaces used as evacuation centers, government offices, public utility vehicles as well as private vehicles covered by app-based transport network services and other recreational spaces such as, but not limited to, cinema halls, theaters, and spas.
- n. **Semi-public space** refers to any indoor or outdoor space that, even if privately owned, is open or accessible to the public during its operating hours.

SECTION 4. REGULATION. No business establishment, school, or residential subdivision covered by this Ordinance operating within the City of Bacoor shall be allowed to operate without first installing, maintaining, and ensuring the full operational functionality of a CCTV security system within



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its premises as herein specified. Likewise, the Punong Barangays within the City of Bacoor are directed to install, maintain, and ensure the full operational functionality of a CCTV security system within their respective barangay premises as specified in this ordinance. The above-mentioned public entities are required to securely store CCTV recordings for a minimum period as prescribed herein and must grant the City Government of Bacoor real-time access at all times. For private entities, it shall be mandatory to grant the City Government access to CCTV recordings in the event of a crime, emergency situation, disaster, or any incident requiring official investigation for immediate monitoring.

SECTION 5. INSTALLATION GUIDE - The following installation guidelines are recommended to be followed:

- Cameras must be installed at a secure location with a maximum area of coverage of entrances/exits and areas of transaction or risk while ensuring that there will be no blind spots.
- Video recorders must be mounted at secure/concealed locations to protect them from deliberate tampering.
- The cameras should not be installed in an area that is not well-lit at night and must be in an area with consistent lighting to pick up identifying details, such as facial features.
- The installer of the cameras should consider the angle of the cameras to avoid lens flare and backlighting.
- The installer of the camera should determine the following objectives and recording distance when installing CCTV Cameras:
 - General Surveillance = 10 feet or greater
 - Facial Recognition = 5 to 7 feet
 - Plate Recognition (for Parking Lots) = 3 to 4 feet
- When possible, a backup system should be installed alongside the CCTV system to ensure that data is kept secure in the event of physical harm to the storage devices such as fires, earthquakes, any form of deliberate tampering and other similar situations.
- When possible, dummy CCTV cameras should also be placed in a conspicuous area to deter possible criminal acts and protect the cameras.
- Signages indicating that the establishment/area is being monitored by a CCTV System must also be installed in areas that are visible and obvious to the public and must use clear, plain, and concise language.



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- i. At least one staff or employee of the barangay, business establishment, residential subdivision or school should be trained to operate the CCTV System.
- j. The Responsible Entity shall designate a focal person on the CCTV system for purposes of coordination.

SECTION 6. MINIMUM COVERAGE - All the establishments mentioned under Section 2 hereof shall be required to install CCTVs to afford full coverage of the following:

- a. For business establishments:
 - (i) All entrances/exits;
 - (ii) The interior of the establishment or the center of business activity in the establishment (including the tellers, cashiers, cash registrars, sales counters, or areas leading to the vault/safe) according to the nature of business/operations of the establishment. (if located inside a mall or building)
 - (iii) From the entrances/exits, a clear view of the area to and from the street(s) abutting the establishment, including frontage thereof taking into particular consideration the clarity of shots in relation to the angles thereof (if not located inside a mall or building);
 - (iv) Parking lots and drive-through lanes (when applicable).
- b. Immediate vicinity of the barangay hall premises, its common grounds, and other government facilities within the barangay;
- c. All entrance/exit gates of the school premises and all its common grounds;
- d. All entrance/exit gates of residential subdivisions, including the common area/open space/parks & playground, and streets within the subdivisions.

SECTION 7. PUBLIC NOTIFICATION. The responsible entity shall ensure that a clear notice is visibly displayed within the premises to inform the public, clients, students, employees, and residents of the presence of a CCTV system in the area. The notice shall be placed in strategic locations and shall indicate the purpose of surveillance in compliance with applicable data privacy laws and regulations.



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SECTION 8. ACCESS TO RECORDINGS - If a crime has been committed, or the operator, employee, or owner of the establishment, the school administrator, the HOA or subdivision administrator has reason to believe that a crime has been committed and has been recorded by the CCTV, or an emergency situation occurred, the operator, employee, or owner of the establishment shall immediately contact the nearest police station and shall voluntarily provide access to the pertinent recordings to the police and other investigators. The law enforcement agencies are enjoined to acknowledge the receipt of the said CCTV recordings.

The operator, employee, or owner of the business establishment shall also make available the camera recordings to the law enforcement authorities engaged in criminal investigation upon written request of the authorized or designated officer thereof with the particular time and day covered by the request therein specified. The captured video footage or images may be used at any time to satisfy the written order or subpoena of any court or body with competent jurisdiction.

SECTION 9. PRIVACY - All the establishments required to install CCTVs under Section 2 hereof shall comply with the following guidelines on privacy:

- Establishments covered shall strictly comply with the National Privacy Commission's guidelines on the use of CCTV Systems, as detailed in NPC Advisory No. 2020-04, and its subsequent amendments;
- Video footage obtained through the CCTV Systems shall be retained for a maximum period of thirty (30) days in order to allow investigating authorities to properly retrieve and prepare backups of the data relevant to any incidents that occur. Upon exceeding the prescribed period, video footage shall be permanently deleted from the system and all existing forms of backup.
- The viewing of recorded or captured video footage or images shall be made with due respect to the privacy of individuals.
- The request for CCTV footage shall be made following, and with strict adherence to, existing standard operating procedures in the conduct of an investigation and law enforcement operation as stated in the applicable rules and regulations of law



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enforcement agencies and other pertinent public authorities.

SECTION 10. DATA SHARING AGREEMENT. The Punong Barangay, the business owner, the Department of Education City Schools Division Office, the private school administration, and the HOA or developer may enter into an agreement with the City Government of Bacoor for the exchange or sharing of data captured by the CCTV installed in their respective barangays, businesses, schools or subdivisions, except for purposes of investigation in relation to a crime that has occurred in the area, in that case, the preceding section shall apply.

Pursuant to a data-sharing agreement, the E-Governance Department shall assist in the integration of the system between the barangays, business establishments, schools, residential subdivisions, and the city government, when authorized by the concerned parties.

SECTION 11. SAFEKEEPING OF CCTV RECORDINGS. The E-Governance Department shall be responsible for the proper safekeeping, management, and protection of all CCTV recordings submitted by business establishments, schools, and residential subdivision developers or HOAs in compliance with this Ordinance. It shall establish secure storage systems and implement data protection measures to prevent unauthorized access, tampering, or misuse of recordings. The retention period, access protocols, and procedures for the retrieval and disposal of CCTV footage shall be in accordance with applicable data privacy laws, security standards, and city regulations.

SECTION 12. PROHIBITED ACTS. The following acts are prohibited under this Ordinance:

- Failure to install and maintain a CCTV system as prescribed herein.
- Obstructing law enforcement and government authorities by altering, tampering, or destroying CCTV recordings.
- Failure to provide access to the CCTV recordings upon demand of the law enforcement agencies, or the BPSU or CICU of the City Government of Bacoor, for a crime investigation or emergency or disaster situations.

SECTION 13. PENALTIES.

- For failure to install and maintain a CCTV system as prescribed herein, the offending responsible entity

shall pay a fine of Five Thousand Pesos (Php 5,000.00) to be paid by the owner/manager of the business establishment, by the principal or owner of the school, by the President of the developer or the HOA of the residential subdivision concerned, or by the Punong Barangay where the offense was committed.

- b. For obstructing law enforcement and government authorities by altering, tampering, or destroying CCTV recordings, the responsible entity or the person who committed the said alteration, tampering, or destruction of recordings shall pay a fine of Five Thousand Pesos and shall be imprisoned for thirty (30) to ninety (90) days as may be determined by a court of law.
- c. For failure to provide access to the CCTV recordings upon demand of the law enforcement agencies, or the BPSU or CICU of the City Government of Bacoor, for a crime investigation or emergency or disaster situations, the offending responsible entity shall pay a fine amounting to Php5,000.00 for every day he/she/it failed to submit a copy or provide access to the CCTV recordings requested.
- d. Provided, finally, that any person who violates this Ordinance shall be charged by the City Government with "Obstruction of Justice" as defined and penalized under Presidential Decree No. 1829 and for any other crime defined and penalized under the Revised Penal Code and other laws.

SECTION 14. CITIZEN'S PARTICIPATION; REVENUE SHARING. Any individual who reports a violation of this Ordinance that leads to the apprehension and collection of a fine shall be entitled to a 40% share in the penalties collected as a result of the enforcement of this Ordinance. The guidelines and mechanisms for citizen participation and revenue sharing shall be governed by City Ordinance No. 261-2023, also known as the Citizen's Participation in Community Development (CPCD) Ordinance of Bacoor.

SECTION 15. BUDGET. The expenses required for the implementation of this ordinance may be sourced from the City Peace and Order and Public Safety (POPS) fund, as duly appropriated by the Sangguniang Panlungsod, or from a supplemental budget as may be approved.

SECTION 16. REVIEW. The Sangguniang Panlungsod shall conduct a periodic review of this ordinance every three (3) years or as soon as may be deemed necessary to ensure the continued responsiveness of its regulatory provisions and achieve the objectives of the ordinance.

SECTION 17. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE - If for any reason, any section of this Ordinance shall be held unconstitutional or invalid, other sections which are not affected thereby shall continue to be in full force and effect.

SECTION 18. REPEALING CLAUSE - All ordinances, rules, and regulations or parts thereof in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed, provided that the rights that are vested upon the effectivity of this Ordinance shall not be impaired.

SECTION 19. EFFECTIVITY CLAUSE - This ordinance shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in a newspaper of general circulation and after it has been posted in at least three conspicuous places within the City of Bacoor.

A CITY ORDINANCE AMENDING MUNICIPAL ORDINANCE NO. 18, SERIES OF 2009 ENTITLED, "AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING BUSINESS ESTABLISHMENTS AND RESIDENTIAL SUBDIVISIONS OPERATING IN BACOR, CAVITE TO INSTALL CLOSED CIRCUIT TV CAMERAS".

WHEREAS, on 22 October 2009, the Sangguniang Bayan enacted Municipal Ordinance No. 18, Series of 2009 entitled, "An Ordinance Requiring Business Establishments and Residential Subdivisions Operating In Bacoor, Cavite to Install Closed Circuit TV Cameras".

WHEREAS, there is a need to amend pertinent provisions of various municipal ordinances such as Municipal Ordinance No. 18-S-2009 pursuant to the ratification of Republic Act No. 10160 on June 23, 2012 converting Bacoor into a component city of Cavite;

NOW, THEREFORE, during regular session assembled, upon motion of Councilor Bayani M. De Leon duly seconded by Councilor Leandro A. De Leon **BE IT ORDAINED AS IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED** by the Sangguniang Panlungsod to amend various sections of this Ordinance to read as follows, to wit:

Section 1. The following provisions of Municipal Ordinance No. 18-S-2009 are hereby amended and shall henceforth read as follows:

"Sec. 1. **Title.**-- This ordinance shall be known as the **"CCTV Ordinance of the City of Bacoar"**.

Sec. 2. **Regulation.**-- No business establishment or residential subdivision covered by this Ordinance operating within the City of Bacoar shall be allowed to operate without first installing, maintaining, and operating a CCTV security system within its premises.

Sec. 3. **Scope.**-- All banks, money changers, lending institutions, pawnshops, gas stations, internet shops, private schools, factories, privately owned wet and dry markets, shopping malls, privately owned paid parking lots, the entrance/exit gates of residential subdivisions constructed after the effectivity of this Ordinance, and hospitals and privately-owned clinics/laboratories operating within the City of Bacoar, Cavite, are covered by this Ordinance.

Sec. 5. **Guidelines.**-- The Business Permit Licensing Office (BPLO) of the city shall send duly-authorized city employees to inspect the premises of all business establishments and residential subdivisions covered by this Ordinance by order of the City Mayor. A specially designed sticker shall be posted by the inspection team on establishments and residential subdivisions that have complied herewith. An establishment or subdivision found to be in violation hereof shall be inspected again thirty (30) days after the date of the first inspection to determine if it has already complied herewith. An establishment or subdivision that fails to comply herewith during the second inspection shall be deemed to have already violated this Ordinance. An establishment or subdivision that already complied with this Ordinance shall be inspected twice every year without any prior notice to ensure that the CCTV system is operational and is well-maintained.

Sec. 6. **Penalties.**-- Establishments or subdivisions that have violated this Ordinance shall be penalized in the following manner:

First offense: Fine of One Thousand Five Hundred Pesos (Php 1,500.00) to be paid by the owner/manager of the establishment or by the President of the developer of the residential subdivision concerned.

Second offense: Fine of Two Thousand Pesos (Php 2,000.00) to be paid by the owner/manager of the establishment or by the President of the developer of the residential subdivision.

Third offense: Fine of Three Thousand Pesos (Php 3,000.00) to be paid by the owner or manager of the establishment or by the President of the developer of the subdivision and closure of the said business establishment or revocation of the development permit of the residential subdivision concerned until such time that the responsible officers of the said establishment or subdivision complies herewith.

Sec.7. Mandate to save surveillance tapes; Voluntary surrender of surveillance tapes.—The owners and managers of all business establishments and the President of the developer of the subdivision/s that have complied with this Ordinance are mandated to safe keep all surveillance tapes taken within their premises for at least thirty (30) days. Thereafter the owners and/or managers of the said establishments and President of the developer of the subdivision/s may already discard or tape over the said surveillance tapes. **Provided,** that if a crime takes place within the said establishment, residential subdivision or within its immediate vicinity, the owner/s or manager/s of the said establishment and the President of the developer of the subdivisions shall voluntarily surrender the surveillance tape/s covering the period when the said crime was committed to the nearest police authorities who are hereby enjoined to issue an acknowledgement receipt for the said tapes. **Provided, further,** that once the residential subdivision has already been turned over to the homeowners thereof, the persons who shall be deemed liable for violation of this Ordinance shall be the officers of the homeowners' associations of the residential subdivisions concerned. **Provided, finally,** that any person who violates this Ordinance shall be charged by the Office of the City Mayor with "Obstruction of Justice" as defined and penalized under Presidential Decree No. 1829".

Section 2. Repeal. – All existing ordinances that are in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed and/or revised.

Section 3. Separability.—Should any provision of this Ordinance be declared void by a proper court of law, all the
