CITY ORDINANCE NO. 477-2025 Series of 2025

AN ORDINANCE CREATING THE BACOOR HUMAN RIGHTS ACTION CENTER, IDENTIFYING ITS VARIOUS DUTIES AND POWERS, AND PROVIDING ADMINISTRATIVE PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS HEREOF.

WHEREAS, Section 1 of Article XIII of the 1987 Constitution provides that Congress shall give highest priority to the enactment of measures that protect and enhance the right of all the people to human dignity, reduce social, economic, and political inequalities, and remove cultural inequities by equitably diffusing wealth and political power for the common good.

WHEREAS, Section 11, paragraph (1), sub-paragraph (vii) of Republic Act No. 10160 (the "Charter of the City of Bacoor, Cavite") gave the Sangguniang Panlungsod the power to determine the powers and duties of officials and employees of the City Government.

WHEREAS, Section 12, paragraph (b), sub-paragraph (1) of RA10160 require the Sangguniang Panlungsod to create various standing committees among which is a Committee on Human Rights.

WHEREAS, Section 36, paragraph (a), sub-paragraph (11) of RA 10160 mandated the City Legal Officer to be in the frontline of protecting human rights and prosecuting any violation thereof, particularly those which occur during and in the aftermath of man-made and natural disasters or calamities.

WHEREAS, on 30 June 2025, the 6th Sangguniang Panlungsod passed City Resolution No. 2025-734 which approved the composition and reorganization of its various standing committees. Among the standing committees of the 6th Sangguniang Panlungsod is the Committee on Human Rights.


WHEREAS, the Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG) and the Commission on Human Rights (CHR) issued Joint

Memorandum Circular No. 1, series of 2014 entitled "Mainstreaming Human Rights through the Rule of Law and Access to Justice at the Levels of Provinces, Cities, Municipalities, and Barangays" which required all local governments to create a Human Rights Action Center.

WHEREAS, there is a need to create a Human Rights Action Center in the City of Bacoor, Cavite and endow the said body with various powers to ensure that the right of all people to human dignity is safeguarded.

NOW THEREFORE, be it enacted by the 6th Sangguniang Panlungsod of the City of Bacoor, Cavite that:

Section 1. Title. This Ordinance shall be known and referenced as the "Human Rights Action Center Ordinance of the City of Bacoor".

Creation of the Human Rights Action Center. Section 2. The Bacoor Human Rights Action Center (BHRAC) is hereby created. It should act primarily as a referral and coordination mechanism and not as a quasi-legislative body.

Composition of the Bacoor Human Rights Section. 3. Action Center. The BHRAC shall be headed by the Chairperson of the Committee on Human Rights of the Sangguniang Panlungsod of the City of Bacoor. The head of BHRAC shall be assisted by the City Legal Officer of the City of Bacoor. The various personnel of the Office of the City Legal Services (OCLS) shall report to the Head of the BHRAC whenever there are reports of violations of human rights in the City of Bacoor.

Location of the BHRAC. The BHRAC shall be Section 4. located at the office of the Head of the BHRAC situated on the 4th Floor of the Bacoor Legislative and Disaster Resilience Building within the Bacoor Government Center. The Secretariat of the BHRAC shall located at the office of the OCLS.

Powers and Duties of the BHRAC. The BHRAC Section 5. shall have the following powers and duties:


- Formulate its own internal rules of procedure subject to the joint approval of the Sangguniang Panlungsod and the City Mayor by way of a City Resolution. Provided that: the internal rules of procedure of the BHRAC shall also be considered as the Implementing Rules and Regulations of this Ordinance.
- Conduct an impartial investigation of all instances of human rights violations occurring in the City of Bacoor.

5.3. Require all elected and appointed officials of the City of Bacoor including employees of various national agencies assigned in the City to attend hearings called by the BHRAC in the exercise of its power to investigate alleged violations of human rights.

- Summon any person and require the production and/or submission of all types of evidence in relation of alleged violations of human rights.
- 5.5. Prosecution cost should not be borne by the Local Government or the Bacoor Human Rights Action Center (BHRAC); and
- 5.6. Perform other powers and duties as may be mandated by law or city ordinance or as may be ordered by the City Mayor.
- Section 6. Administrative Penalty. Any appointed official or employee of the City Government or of the various national agencies assigned at the City of Bacoor who unjustifiably failed to obey any lawful order of the BHRAC shall be administratively penalized pursuant to pertinent civil service regulations.
- Section 7. Honoraria. The Head of the BHRAC, the City Legal Officer, and lawyers assigned at the OCLS shall receive an honorarium of P1,000.00 whenever they actually attend a hearing of the BHRAC. The grant of the said honoraria shall depend on the availability of funds as certified by the City Treasurer and shall be released pursuant to pertinent government audit and accounting regulations. Provided that: the BHRAC shall not hold a hearing more than twice per month. Provided further that: not more than two lawyers from the OCLS shall attend the said hearings.
- Section 8. Repeal. All ordinances, city resolutions, executive orders, and other local issuances that are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed and/or modified.
- Separability. If any provision of this Ordinance or Section 9. the application thereof to any person or circumstance, is held invalid by a competent court of law, the remainder of the Ordinance and the application of such provision to other persons or circumstances shall not be affected thereby.
- Effectivity. This Ordinance shall take effect after Section 10. ten (10) days from the date a copy hereof is posted in a bulletin board at the entrance of the City Hall of Bacoor and in at least two (2) other conspicuous places in the City of Bacoor not later than five (5) days after approval hereof. A copy of this Ordinance shall be published once in a local newspaper of general circulation within the City.
