**WHEREAS**, on 23 January 2026, the Office of the City Mayor formally endorsed to the Sangguniang Panlungsod the letter request of Ms. Eloisa Castro of South Green Enterprises for the review of City Ordinance No. 469-2025, Series of 2025 dated 13 October 2025 entitled: "AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE COLLECTION AND PAYMENT OF SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT FEES IN THE CITY OF BACOOR, CAVITE" or otherwise known "**SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT FEES ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BACOOR.**"

**WHEREAS**, on 23 March 2026, the aforementioned matter was referred to the Committee on Finance and Budget Appropriations as lead committee and to the Committee on Rules, Privileges, Laws and Ordinances designated as sub-committees.

**Section 1. Amendment of Section 9 of City Ordinance No. 469-2025.** Section 9 of City Ordinance No. 469-2025 is hereby amended and shall read as follows:

**"SECTION 9. WASTE GENERATOR CATEGORIES AND SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT FEES.** A solid waste management fee to be collected by the City Finance Department annually is hereby levied at the following prescribed rates for the following waste generator categories:

X X X

Section 9.38. – Work from Home / Home -Based Business with a solid waste management fee of **PhP1,500.00** ."

**Section 2. Repeal.** All ordinances, resolutions, executive orders, and regulations inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

**Section 3. Effectivity.** This Ordinance shall take effect fifteen days after it has posted on at least three conspicuous places within the City of Bacoor, Cavite and after it has been published in a newspaper of general circulation within the Province of Cavite.

**AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE COLLECTION AND PAYMENT OF SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT FEES IN THE CITY OF BACOOR, CAVITE.**

**WHEREAS**, Article II, Section 16 of the 1987 Constitution provides that "the State shall protect and advance the right of the people to a balanced and healthful ecology in accord with the rhythm and harmony of nature".

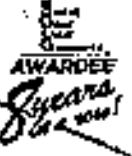
**WHEREAS**, Section 5, Article X of the 1987 Philippine Constitution also empowers each local government unit "to create its own sources of revenues and to levy taxes, fees, and charges subject to such guidelines and limitations as Congress may provide, consistent with the basic policy of local autonomy".

**WHEREAS**, Section 129, Chapter I, Title I, Book II of the Republic Act (R.A.) No. 7160 (otherwise known as the "Local Government Code of 1991") provides that each local government unit shall exercise its power to create its own sources of revenue and to levy taxes, fees, and charges consistent with the basic policy of local autonomy, and that such taxes, fees, and charges shall accrue exclusively to the local government units.

**WHEREAS**, Section 16 of the Local Government Code of 1991 further states that every local government unit shall exercise the powers expressly granted, those necessarily implied therefrom, as well as powers necessary, appropriate, or incidental for its efficient and effective governance, and those that are essential to the promotion of the general welfare.

**WHEREAS**, the aforementioned section likewise mandates that local government units shall promote health and safety, enhance the right of the people to a balanced ecology, encourage and support the development of appropriate and self-reliant, scientific and technological capabilities, maintain peace and order, and preserve the comfort and convenience of their inhabitants.

**WHEREAS**, Section 458, paragraph (1)(vi) of the Local Government Code of 1991 authorizes the Sangguniang Panlungsod

to approve resolutions and appropriate funds for the general welfare of the city and its inhabitants, for an efficient and effective city government to protect the environment and impose appropriate penalties for acts that endanger the environment.

WHEREAS, the Sangguniang Panlungsod is empowered to enact ordinances levying taxes, fees, and charges, prescribing the rates thereof for general and specific purposes, and granting tax exemptions, incentives, or reliefs through Section 458, paragraph (2)(f) of R.A. 7160.

WHEREAS, Section 2, paragraph (c) of Republic Act No. 9003 [the "Ecological Solid Waste Management Act of 2000"] provides that the State shall "set guidelines and targets for solid waste avoidance and volume reduction through source reduction and waste minimization measures, including composting, recycling, re-use, recovery, green charcoal process, and others, before collection, treatment and disposal in appropriate and environmentally-sound solid waste management facilities in accordance with ecologically sustainable development principles".

WHEREAS, Section 2 (d) of R.A. No. 9003 further mandates that it is the policy of the State to ensure the proper segregation, collection, transport, storage, treatment, and disposal of solid waste through the formulation and adoption of the best environmental practice in ecological waste management.

WHEREAS, Section 47 of R.A. No. 9003 provides that local government units shall impose fees in amounts sufficient to pay the costs of preparing, adopting, and implementing a Solid Waste Management plan and that the said fees shall be based on the following minimum factors:

- (a) types of solid waste;
- (b) amount/volume of waste; and
- (c) distance of the transfer station to the waste management facility.

WHEREAS, Section 47 of R.A. No. 9003 further provides that the said solid waste management fees shall be used to pay the actual costs incurred by the LGU in collecting solid waste and that in determining the amounts of the said fees, an LGU shall include only those costs directly related to the adoption and implementation of the plan and the setting and collection of the local fees.

WHEREAS, Section 2, paragraph (f) of R.A. No. 9003 declares the policy of the State to encourage greater participation from the private sectors in the implementation of solid waste management.

WHEREAS, the amount of solid waste produced by the City of Bacoor since 2017 are as follows:

**WHEREAS**, the increase in the amount of solid waste generated by the City of Bacoor annually shows that a large segment of the public is not segregating, recycling, reusing, or reducing the solid waste they generate and that the City Government needs to do more to make the public realize the vital role it plays in solid waste management.

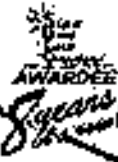
**WHEREAS**, the continued increase in the amount of solid waste generated annually by the City of Bacoor is unsustainable as it will entail the appropriation by the City Government of more public funds for solid waste management at the expense of other equally important programs such as the promotion of public health and the improvement of public education to name a few.

**WHEREAS**, the City Environment Services Department (CESD) reported to the Sangguniang Panlungsod that the volume of solid waste mentioned in Table 1 above is only a portion of the total amount of solid waste generated by the City every year as it only pertains to trash that were actually collected by the private hauler contracted by the City Government and does not include trash collected by haulers hired independently by homeowners living in gated communities, commercial malls, hospitals, healthcare clinics, and other private businesses.

**WHEREAS**, financing the various programs included in the Solid Waste Management Plan requires the creation of new sources of revenue that will lead to the reduction of the solid waste produced by Bacoreños and by businesses and institutions operating within the City of Bacoor.

**WHEREAS**, among the components of the Solid Waste Management Plan of the City of Bacoor are the design, development, construction and operation of a "super materials recovery facility" and a "bio-digester plant" which will operate alongside a waste-to-energy plant to be owned by the City Government which will greatly reduce the dependence of the City on sanitary landfills in the disposal of the solid waste it generates.





produce a new source of revenue for the City and will help reduce the cost of electricity in various parts of the City.

**WHEREAS**, the implementation of clear standards on the amount of solid waste management fees to be collected from various households, businesses, institutions and other garbage generators is needed not only to finance programs that will effectively reduce the amount of solid waste generated by the City but to also encourage active community participation in the ongoing efforts of the City Government to effectively manage the solid waste produced in the City of Bacoor.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, be it **ORDAINED** by the 6<sup>th</sup> Sangguniang Panlungsod of the City of Bacoor, Province of Cavite that:

**SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.** - This Ordinance shall be referred to and cited as the "Solid Waste Management Fees Ordinance of the City of Bacoor."

**SECTION 2. DECLARATION OF POLICY.** It is hereby declared the policy of the City of Bacoor to promote responsible waste management practices that will lead to significant reduction in the volume of solid waste generated by its residents, businesses, and institutions, ensure environmental sustainability, and generate adequate funds to sustain the city's Solid Waste Management Plan through the fair and equitable collection of solid waste management fees.

**SECTION 3. OBJECTIVES.** This Ordinance aims to:

1. Establish a framework that promotes environmentally responsible waste collection, disposal, and recycling to protect public health and protect the environment.
2. Set clear policies to ensure that waste management fees are fairly assessed based on the volume, type, or nature of waste generated, preventing overcharging or undercharging residents, businesses, and institutions.
3. Generate sufficient revenue to support the operational costs of waste collection, processing, and disposal facilities, ensuring continuous and efficient service delivery.
4. Provide guidelines for the collection, billing, and enforcement of solid waste management fees to streamline operations and minimize disputes.
5. Promote transparency in the collection and utilization of solid waste management fees, ensuring funds are properly allocated and utilized in accordance with the approved policies; and
6. Improve the overall health and environmental quality of the City of Bacoor through the establishment of more effective solid waste management policies.

**SECTION 4. SCOPE AND COVERAGE.** This Ordinance shall apply to all residential, commercial, industrial, and institutional establishments within the territorial jurisdiction of the City of Bacoor.

**SECTION 5. RULES OF CONSTRUCTION.** — In construing the provisions of this Ordinance, the following rules of construction shall be observed unless inconsistent with the manifest intent of the provision, or when applied, they would lead to absurd or highly improbable results.

- 1. General Rule.** — All words and phrases shall be construed and understood according to the common and approved usage of the language, but technical words and phrases and such others that may have acquired a peculiar, appropriate meaning in this Ordinance shall be construed and understood according to such technical, peculiar, or appropriate meaning.
- 2. Gender and number.** — Every word in this Ordinance importing the masculine gender shall extend to both females and males. Every word importing the singular number shall extend and apply to several persons or things, and every word importing the plural number shall also extend and apply to one person or thing.
- 3. Computation of time.** — The time within an act is to be done as provided in this code or in any rule or regulation issued pursuant to the provisions thereof when expressed in days shall be computed by excluding the first day and including the last day, except if the last day falls on a Sunday or a holiday, in which case the same shall be excluded from the computation, and the next business day shall be considered the last day.
- 4. References.** — All references to Chapters, Articles, and Sections are to the Chapters, Articles, and Sections in this Ordinance, unless otherwise specified.
- 5. Undefined Words and Phrases.** — When a word or a phrase is not defined in this Ordinance, its common meaning, the plain language of the Ordinance, and the context of how it was used shall be used in interpreting the said word or phrase.

**SECTION 6. DEFINITION OF TERMS.** — As used in this Ordinance, the following terms and phrases shall be understood and defined as follows:

- 1. Biomedical Waste** — are any waste containing infectious materials, or potentially infectious materials generated during the diagnosis, treatment, immunization, or research of humans or animals such as needles and scalpels, human/animal tissues, organs, body parts, chemical waste, and pharmaceutical waste.

2. **Bio-Digester Plant** – is a facility that will contain a series of airtight tanks that uses microorganisms to break down organic waste, like animal manure or food scraps, in an oxygen-free (anaerobic) environment to produce two valuable byproducts: biogas and bio-slurry. The biogas, rich in methane, can be used as a fuel for cooking, lighting, or generating electricity, while the nutrient-rich bio-slurry serves as a potent fertilizer for agriculture. The said facility shall be designed, developed, constructed and operated by the City Government by itself or in partnership with the private sector.
3. **Bulky Waste** – are large, oversized household items that are too big or heavy to fit in regular trash bins or bags for standard garbage collection such as sofas and mattresses, large appliances such as refrigerators and washing machines, old carpets, and the like.
4. **City Haulers** – are privately owned trucking companies engaged by the City Government of Bacoor to collect, haul, transport, and dispose of solid waste within the City of Bacoor.
5. **Collection** – is the removal of solid waste from its source or from a communal storage point.
6. **Disposal** – is the depositing, dumping, spilling, leaking, or placing of solid waste into or on any land.
7. **Electronic Waste (or E-Waste)** – are discarded electrical or electronic devices, such as computers, mobile phones, laptops, printers, and tablets that have reached the end of their useful life. It will also include used batteries, chargers, and small appliances (such as vacuum cleaners, blenders, electric fans, tv sets, radios, and the like).
8. **Food Stalls or Kiosks** – are small, often temporary structures designed to prepare and sell food to the public, typically offering a limited menu of snacks or quick-service items situated inside public/private markets, langge (hawkers' market), malls, groceries or supermarkets or on public places such as sidewalks and parks.
9. **Food Waste** – solid waste generated in the process of preparing food.
10. **Generation** – is the act or process of producing solid waste.
11. **Grease Trap Waste** – is the accumulation of fats, oils, and grease (FOG), along with food particles, that collects in

a grease trap or interceptor from restaurant and kitchen wastewater.

12. **Hawker (or Sidewalk/Ambulant Vendor)** – are persons engaged in the sale of food items or other items of commerce who have no fixed areas of business.
13. **Hawkers' Market (or Tiangge)** – are places designated by the City Government where hawkers can temporarily sell their wares during town fiestas or holidays.
14. **Hazardous Waste** – are substances that are without any safe commercial, industrial, agricultural, or economic usage that are shipped, transported or brought from the country of origin for dumping or disposal into or in transit through any part of the territory of the Philippines and includes **by-products** (a secondary product created incidentally during the manufacturing process of a different, main product), **side-products** (unwanted substances produced in addition to the desired product during a chemical reaction), **process residues** (are by-products and waste materials generated during the primary production or manufacturing process that are not the intended end product), contaminated plant or equipment, or other substances from manufacturing operations, and as consumer discards of manufactured products.
15. **Material Recovery Facility (MRF)** – is a solid waste transfer station or sorting station, drop-off center, composting facility, and recycling facility.
16. **Motor Oil, Grease and Other Lubricants (MOGOL)** – is a special waste category consisting of fossil fuel-based products used to lubricate motor vehicle engines and other motor vehicle parts.
17. **Non-Food Waste** – solid waste generated in the preparation, serving, storage, delivery, or disposal of food products such as bottles, cans, plates, utensils, packaging materials, and the like.
18. **Private Hauler** – is any private entity commercially engaged in collecting, hauling, transporting, and disposing of solid waste and/or recyclable materials from various sources.
19. **Residential** – are buildings devoted wholly or partly as dwelling places found within gated subdivisions, outside gated subdivisions, in condominiums, boarding houses, apartments, and other structures of similar nature.
20. **Segregation** – is a solid waste management practice of separating different materials found in solid waste to promote recycling and re-use of resources and reduce the volume of waste for collection and disposal.

21. **Segregation at source**- is a solid waste management practice of separating different materials found in solid waste at the point of origin to promote recycling and reuse of resources and reduce the volume of waste for collection and disposal.

22. **Solid waste**- are all discarded household, commercial, non-hazardous institutional, and industrial waste, street sweepings, construction debris, agricultural waste, and other non-hazardous/non-toxic solid waste.

23. **Solid waste management** - is the discipline associated with the control of generation, storage, collection, transfer and transport, processing, and disposal of solid waste in a manner that is in accord with the best principles of public health, economics, engineering, conservation, aesthetics, and other environmental considerations, and that is also responsive to public attitudes.

24. **Solid Waste Management Fee** - is a charge imposed to cover the costs associated with the collection, transport, treatment, and disposal of the City of Bacoor's solid waste.

25. **Super Materials Recovery Facility (MRF)** - is a large-scale MRF to be designed, developed, constructed, and operated by the City Government by itself or in partnership with the private sector.

26. **Used Cooking Oil (UCO)** - is edible oil and fat that has been used for cooking or frying and is no longer suitable for human consumption that can come from residential areas or from restaurants, food stalls, and the like.

27. **Waste To Energy Plant** - a facility where solid waste is incinerated, and the kinetic energy produced through the incineration process is converted into electricity or heat.

**SECTION 7. FEE STRUCTURE, COLLECTION AND PURPOSES.** The City Government of Bacoor shall implement and collect a tiered fee system based on the type of structure that generates solid waste, its location within the City, the volume of solid waste it produces, and its floor area measured in square meters. Owners of households as well as of commercial, industrial, and institutional establishments covered by this Ordinance shall pay a fixed **Solid Waste Management Fee** the proceeds of which will be used to finance the cost of implementing all city ordinances and national laws related to solid waste management as well as the various components of the Solid Waste Management Plan.

Below is a table that summarizes the purposes behind the proposed collection of solid waste management fees.

**SECTION 8. IMPLEMENTATION AND ENFORCEMENT.** This Ordinance shall primarily be implemented and enforced by the City Environment and Service Department (CESD), the City Finance Department, the City Assessors Department, and the Business Permits and Licensing Department. **SECTION 11. MANDATORY COLLECTION OF BULKY WASTE AND E-WASTE.** The CESD is hereby mandated to formulate and implement a system that will allow the scheduled collection of bulky waste and e-waste for free.

**SECTION 12. SUPPLEMENTARY APPLICATION TO THE "REVISED ENVIRONMENT CODE OF THE CITY OF BACOOR" AND OTHER CITY ORDINANCES.** The various provisions of this Ordinance shall be supplementarily applied in the implementation of City Ordinance No. 438-2025 (the "Revised Environment Code of the City of Bacoor"), City Ordinance No. 447-2025 (the "Used Cooking Oil and Grease Trap Waste Collection and Disposal Regulation Ordinance of the City of Bacoor"), and other city ordinances related to waste management.

**SECTION 13. PROHIBITED ACTS.** The following acts or omissions are hereby prohibited:

**13.1. NON-SEGREGATION AT SOURCE.** The non-segregation at source of all solid waste generated by all households and by all commercial, industrial, and institutional establishments covered by this Ordinance is hereby prohibited. The head of all households and the management/administration of all commercial, industrial, and institutional establishments covered by this Ordinance are hereby required to segregate solid waste at source.

**13.2. COLLECTION OF UNSEGREGATED SOLID WASTE.** All employees of the CESD and of all barangays in the City of Bacoor as well as all employees of city haulers contracted by the City Government to collect solid waste are hereby prohibited from collecting any unsegregated trash from any household and from any commercial, industrial, and institutional establishment covered by this Ordinance. The collection of any unsegregated trash by the said employees and the failure of the Head of the CESD or of the Punong Barangay of any barangay to implement this provision shall be considered a violation of this Ordinance and of City Ordinance No. 2014-005.

**13.3. FAILURE TO ESTABLISH MRF AND HAZARDOUS WASTE MANAGEMENT AREA IN ALL COMMUNITIES AND BARANGAYS.** The non-establishment of at least one (1) Materials Recovery Facility and a Hazardous Waste Management Area by the officers of all homeowners' associations and by the officials of all barangays in the City of Bacoor within their respective areas of jurisdiction not later than ninety (90) days following the date of approval of the Implementing Rules and Regulations of this Ordinance is hereby prohibited. The failure of the said persons to establish the said MRF and Hazardous Waste Management Area within the period above-mentioned shall be considered a violation of this Ordinance. The said MRF shall serve as the designated area for the storage of clean recyclables collected from each household. On the other hand, the Hazardous Waste Management Area shall be designated for the safe storage, handling, and disposal of hazardous wastes, such as chemicals, batteries, and other toxic materials, including medical waste.

**13.4. ESTABLISHMENT OF USED COOKING OIL COLLECTION AREAS.** The non-establishment of at least one (1) used cooking oil collection area in every subdivision, neighborhood and barangay within the City of Bacoor, Cavite pursuant to City Ordinance No. 447-2025 (the "Used Cooking Oil and Grease Trap Waste Collection and Disposal Regulation Ordinance of the City of Bacoor") by the officers of all homeowners' associations and by all barangay officials in the City of Bacoor is hereby prohibited. The failure of the said persons to comply with the above-mentioned mandate shall be considered a violation of this Ordinance and of City Ordinance No. 447-2025.

**13.5. FAILURE TO SECURE ECC OR CNC.** The failure by the management or administration of all commercial, industrial, and institutional establishments within the City of Bacoor to secure an Environmental Compliance Certificate (ECC) or a Certificate of Non-Coverage (CNC) from the Department of Environment and Natural Resources-Environmental Management Bureau (DENR-EMB) under the Philippine Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) System prior to the construction of the said structures is hereby prohibited. Failure to comply with this provision shall be deemed a violation of this Ordinance and of other applicable laws.

**13.6. FAILURE TO DISPLAY AND TO INSTITUTIONALIZE COLOR-CODED BINS.** The failure of the management and/or administration of all commercial, industrial, and institutional establishments including offices, clinics, and schools operating in the City of Bacoor to display and institutionalize the use of color-coded bins within the premises of the said establishments, offices, clinics, and schools in order to promote proper segregation of the source is hereby prohibited. The failure of the management or administration of the said establishments, offices, clinics, or schools shall be considered a violation of this Ordinance.

**13.7. MANDATORY STORAGE AREA FOR BIODEGRADABLE AND NON-BIODEGRADABLE WASTE.** All commercial, institutional, and industrial facilities within the City of Bacoor are hereby mandated to designate dedicated storage areas for biodegradable, non-biodegradable, residual and special waste within the premises of the said establishments. The failure of the management or administration of the said establishments, offices, clinics, or schools shall be considered a violation of this Ordinance.

**13.8. NON-ADHERENCE TO COLLECTION SCHEDULES.** The disposal of solid waste at any time other than the collection schedules or outside the collection areas mandated by the CESD is hereby prohibited. The head of all households as well as the management or administration of all commercial, industrial, and institutional establishments within the City of Bacoor are hereby mandated to adhere to the collection schedules to be released by the CESD with regard the disposal of different types of waste. The failure of the head of the said households or of the management or administration of the said establishments, offices, clinics, or schools shall be considered a violation of this Ordinance.

**13.9. FAILURE TO COLLECT SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT FEES.** The unjustified or deliberate failure of any employee of the City Government to collect the solid waste management fees

**13.10. LITERING, THROWING, AND DUMPING OF ALL TYPES OF WASTE ON PUBLIC PLACES.** The City Government shall adopt a "zero tolerance policy" with regard to littering, throwing, and dumping of all types of waste on public places.

**SECTION 14. PENALTIES.** Any natural person who commits any of the prohibited acts mentioned above shall pay a fine of P5,000.00.

The business permit of any commercial, institutional or industrial establishment that commits any violation of this Ordinance shall be suspended for not less than thirty (30) days and shall remain suspended until it complies with this Ordinance.

The solid waste generated by any residence or by any commercial, industrial, or institutional establishment that violates any provision of this Ordinance shall not be collected until its owner/s, manager/s or administrator/s complies with this Ordinance.

Provided that: no criminal charges shall be filed against minors and persons who are mentally incapacitated. Provided further that: adults who violates this ordinance who agreed to pay the fine mentioned above shall no longer be criminally prosecuted.

**SECTION 15. DEPOSITING OF ALL FINES IN BACOR ENVIRONMENT CODE.** All fines, interests, and surcharges collected in the process of enforcing this Ordinance shall be deposited in the Bacoor Environment Fund pursuant to Article X, Chapter I, Section 1 of City Ordinance No. 438-2025 (the "Revised Environment Code of the City of Bacoor").

**SECTION 16. SURCHARGES AND INTERESTS ON UNPAID FEES.** There is hereby imposed a surcharge of one percent (1%) of the amount of fees not paid on time and an interest of one percent (1%) per month of the unpaid fee, including surcharges, until such amount is fully paid, but in no case shall the total interest on the unpaid fee exceed twelve percent (12%) per annum.

**SECTION 17. MONITORING AND REPORTING.** The CESD shall be responsible for the proper monitoring of the implementation of this Ordinance, prescribed herein. It shall prescribe the proper rules and regulations to effectively monitor and report the implementation of this Ordinance.

**SECTION 18. REPORT OF FEES AND PENALTIES COLLECTED.** The City Treasurer's Officer shall closely monitor the payment fees and penalties imposed by this Ordinance and provide quarterly and annual reports to the City Solid Waste Management Board.

**SECTION 19. BUDGET APPROPRIATION.** The City shall appropriate in its annual budget or any supplemental budget that may be approved thereafter, the amount necessary to implement

**SECTION 21. REPEALING CLAUSE.** - All ordinances, rules, and regulations or parts thereof in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed and/or modified accordingly, provided that the rights that are vested upon the effectivity of this Ordinance shall not be impaired.

**SECTION 22. EFFECTIVITY CLAUSE.** - This Ordinance shall take effect upon its approval and after publication in a newspaper of general circulation.
