A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MAYOR, HON. STRIKE B. REVILLA, TO SIGN A MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT ON BEHALF OF THE CITY GOVERNMENT OF BACOR WITH THE PHILIPPINE CHRISTIAN UNIVERSITY REGARDING THE COMMUNITY SITUATION ANALYSIS IN BARANGAYS ALONG THE IMUS RIVER SYSTEM WITHIN BACOR CITY, CAVITE.

WHEREAS, on 8 April 2025, the Office of the City Mayor sent an endorsement letter requesting the Sangguniang Panlungsod to pass a resolution authorizing the City Mayor to sign a Memorandum of Agreement with the Philippine Christian University (PCU).

WHEREAS, the PCU, through its National Service Training Program (NSTP) Department, seeks to conduct an initial Community Situation Analysis (CSA) in barangays along the Imus River system within the Bacoor City as a capstone project for NSTP students.

WHEREAS, the City Government of Bacoor recognizes the importance of this initiative in formulating community-based policies and programs for environmental protection, sustainable development and social responsibility.

WHEREAS, the Office of the City Mayor submitted a draft Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) to the Sangguniang Panlungsod for its review and consideration. The proposed MOA is hereby deemed incorporated into and made a part of this Resolution as **Annex "A"**.

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

This Memorandum of Agreement ("MOA") is made and entered into this ____ day of _____, by and between:

PHILIPPINE CHRISTIAN UNIVERSITY, a higher education institution duly registered in the Republic of the Philippines, with its principal address at 1648 Taft Avenue corner Pedro Gil St., Malate, Manila, represented by its University President, **DR. JUNIFEN F. GALAAN**, hereinafter referred to as "PCU";

AND

The **CITY GOVERNMENT OF BACOR**, a political subdivision created under the laws of the Republic of the Philippines, with official address at Bacoor Government Center, Bacoor Boulevard, Bayanan, Bacoor City, Cavite, represented herein by its City Mayor, **HON. STRIKE B. REVILLA**, by virtue of the authority conferred through City Resolution No. _____, approved on _____, hereinafter referred to as "CGO BACOR".

Both parties are collectively referred to as the "Parties".

WITNESSETH THAT:

WHEREAS, Section 13, Article II of the 1987 Philippine Constitution provides that the State recognizes the vital role of the youth in nation-building and shall promote and protect their physical, moral, spiritual, intellectual, and social well-being. It shall inculcate in the youth patriotism and nationalism and encourage their involvement in public and civic affairs;

WHEREAS, PCU, through its National Service Training Program (NSTP) Department, seeks to conduct an initial Community Situation Analysis (CSA) in barangays along the Imus River system within Bacoor City as a capstone project for NSTP students;

WHEREAS, PCU envisions the Imus River system within Bacoor City as a social immersion locale, where students can actively participate in community engagement, environmental sustainability projects, and disaster risk reduction efforts;

WHEREAS, the CSA aligns with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (UN-SDGs), particularly in promoting clean water and sanitation, climate action, and sustainable cities and communities;

WHEREAS, CGO BACOR is authorized to partner with private institutions in uplifting the lives of the people through outreach and extension programs and services aligned to the needs of the community;

WHEREAS, the City Government recognizes the importance of this initiative in formulating community-based policies and programs for environmental protection, sustainable development, and social responsibility;

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the foregoing premises, the Parties agree as follows:

ARTICLE I – SCOPE OF PARTNERSHIP

This partnership aims to allow the PCU students to conduct a Community Situation Analysis (CSA) within the communities along the Imus River to assess the socio-environmental conditions therein and, in coordination with the CGO BACOR, gather insights from local residents to develop responsive joint community service sustainable programs beneficial to these communities. These programs are as follows:

1. Environmental Protection and Sustainability

- a. **Tree Planting and Urban Greening Projects:** Parties will collaborate for reforestation efforts and urban greening projects. PCU students can be involved in the planning, implementation, and monitoring phases. An assigned area may be provided to PCU for conservation projects, including plant nursery projects where students may participate therein.
- b. **Waste Management and Recycling Initiatives:** Develop community-based waste management systems, including recycling programs, which can serve as a model for other communities.

2. Livelihood and Skills Training through local TESDA

- a. **Vocational Training Programs:** Offer skills training in areas such as carpentry, sewing, or digital literacy, aimed at empowering residents of Bacoor to start their own businesses or improve employability.
- b. **Entrepreneurship Workshops:** PCU may assist in providing training on small business management, financial literacy, and marketing strategies, potentially in collaboration with local cooperatives or business associations within the City of Bacoor.

3. Disaster Preparedness and Emergency Response

- a. **Community-based Disaster Risk Reduction:** PCU may assist in developing a disaster preparedness program wherein its emergency responders' team, shall train local residents along the Imus River system on basic first aid, emergency response, and disaster risk management.
- b. **Simulation Drills:** Assist in the conduct of regular earthquake, fire, and typhoon drills in partnership with local schools and barangays.

4. Cultural Preservation and Promotion and Cultural Mapping

- a. **Heroes and Heritage Conservation Projects:** Partner with local heritage groups to document and preserve historical sites and cultural practices in the City of Bacoor. PCU students from

relevant fields such as history, architecture, and tourism may be mobilized for these initiatives.

- b. **Participate in Community Arts Programs:** Organize art workshops, cultural performances, and exhibits that celebrate local traditions, with PCU's arts and humanities departments taking the lead.

5. Youth and Sports Development

- a. **Sports Clinics and Competitions:** Set up sports clinics and tournaments for the youth in various barangays of the City of Bacoor to promote physical fitness and teamwork. PCU's Physical Education department may lead in coaching and organizing these events.
- b. **Youth Leadership Training:** Develop a leadership training program that focuses on civic engagement, ethics, and community service, targeting young leaders within the City of Bacoor.

ARTICLE II – OBLIGATIONS OF THE PARTIES

1. The CGO BACCOOR shall:

- a. **Facilitate coordination with the concerned barangays along the Imus River System to ensure the security and safety of PCU students during fieldwork and the implementation of community service sustainable programs.**
- b. **Provide necessary assistance to PCU students in conducting CSA and in carrying out community programs and activities jointly organized by CGO BACCOOR and PCU.**
- c. **Assign focal persons or coordinators from its relevant departments or offices (e.g., CESD, LYDO, LEDIPO, BORRMO) to liaise with PCU and ensure seamless coordination throughout program planning and execution.**
- d. **Allow PCU access to the Imus River system, designated as an environmental and social immersion zone, where it can regularly conduct monitoring, research, and community engagement activities.**
- e. **Encourage and ensure active participation of members of youth groups and other community sectors through the leadership of the barangays concerned, in the advocacy and development activities.**
- f. **Participate in the evaluation of the programs undertaken by the PCU and provide feedback on any challenges, concerns, or best practices observed during the program implementation.**

- g. Support the sustainability of initiatives by identifying and/or endorsing local organizations or communities that can adopt and continue the programs after the engagement of PCU students.

2. The PCU shall:

- a. Supervise the NSTP students in the conduct of Community Situation Analysis (CSA) and related immersion activities in designated barangays along the Imus River system within Bacoor City, with proper coordination with CGO BACCOOR.
- b. Coordinate with CGO BACCOOR in the formulation of joint community service sustainable programs.
- c. Ensure that its students are provided with proper orientation prior to their actual community fieldwork or immersion to prepare them adequately.
- d. Provide for all logistical needs of the PCU students during their community fieldwork.
- e. Develop and implement capacity-building activities in partnership with CGO BACCOOR for local youth and other community members to enhance skills in areas of environmental awareness, disaster preparedness, and livelihood development.
- f. PCU shall ensure that all activities comply with ethical and legal standards, respecting the rights of residents and the environment.
- g. Conduct regular monitoring and evaluation during the implementation of the program.
- h. Submit a terminal report detailing the findings and proposed recommendations for potential policy actions that may benefit both the CGO BACCOOR and PCU.

ARTICLE III – CONFIDENTIALITY

All data and findings gathered during the CSA shall be kept confidential by the PCU and shall not be made public without the express permission of the City Government.

ARTICLE IV – EFFECTIVITY AND DURATION

This Memorandum of Agreement shall take effect upon signing and shall remain valid for a period of three (3) years or until June 30, 2028, unless extended by mutual agreement, or terminated by any of the parties in accordance with the provision herein provided.

ARTICLE V - OTHER COVENANTS

1. No modification, alteration, or amendment of any of the provisions of the contract shall be binding on the parties hereto unless evidence by written amendment signed by the parties, approved by the proper authorities.
2. Each party represents and warrants on its own behalf that the individual signing this Agreement on its behalf is fully authorized to sign on behalf of and bind it and that it has the power and authority to enter into it.
3. In complying with and implementing the terms of this Agreement, the Parties shall exercise good faith and cooperation to fulfill their common objective.
4. The relationship of the Parties under and in relation to this Agreement shall be limited to the matters herein contained. Nothing herein provided shall be considered or interpreted as constituting the relationship of the Parties or any of them as a partnership in which any one or more of the Parties may be liable for the acts or omissions of any other Party or Parties, nor shall anything herein contained be considered or interpreted as constituting any Party as the general agent of any other Party.
5. In case any one or more of the provisions contained in this Agreement shall be held invalid, illegal, or unenforceable in any aspect, the validity, legality, and enforceability of the remaining provisions contained herein shall not in any way be affected or impaired thereby.
6. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the Republic of the Philippines.
7. This agreement may be terminated by either party for any reason, including but not limited to: (i) when the safety and rights of the community, the participants, or PCU students involved in programs are compromised, (ii) the cessation or suspension of PCU's immersion and extension programs; and, (iii) mutual consent of the parties. The party desiring to terminate this agreement shall provide notice to the other party at least thirteen (30) days prior to the intended date of termination.
